



Dear Viewpoint Community,

Yesterday, we were made aware of troubling allegations involving a faculty member in our Primary and Lower School divisions at Viewpoint regarding inappropriate behavior that occurred on campus. We are deeply concerned by these reports and are treating this matter very seriously. As far as we know today, the allegations of inappropriate behavior do not involve physical contact.

Immediately upon learning of the allegations, our Administrators and Campus Safety and Security team launched an investigation and notified the Los Angeles County Sheriff Department's Lost Hills Station. The employee was subsequently taken into custody, and his employment has been terminated. We are working closely and cooperating with law enforcement as they investigate the matter. In addition, with support from an outside investigator, we will conduct a thorough investigation so that we can fully understand what occurred and take meaningful steps to prevent this from happening again. That investigation is ongoing.

We want to reassure you that there's nothing more important to us than the safety and wellbeing of our students.

We have reached out to impacted students and families and will continue to do so as we are able and learn more. We encourage any student or community member with concerns or additional information to please come forward. Any outreach will be handled with compassion, sensitivity, and discretion for those impacted. Please call or email Mark or Don at the school.

We understand this situation is deeply upsetting. We will be making resources, including counseling, available for anyone in our community who may need support. We are doing everything we can to ensure a safe and respectful learning environment for our students and the broader Viewpoint community.

Because this is a highly sensitive and confidential matter and an active law enforcement investigation, we are limited in what further information we can share right now. We will keep the community updated to the best of our abilities. Thank you for your patience and understanding as we navigate this deeply upsetting situation together in the coming days.
