Narrative:

On 02/06/12 at approximately 12:04 A.M., I Officer Parker was patrolling on fifth street passing 708 South Fifth Street, First Baptist Church, when I noticed a black passenger car parked in the parking lot with no lights on and occupied at least one time. I made a block and pulled up behind the vehicle bearing license plate TX: [REDACTED] I notified Denton County Communications that I was out with a suspicious vehicle at above location. I met and spoke with the driver who stated he and his g/f had an argument and he was in Tioga trying to get home. I immediately detected an odor of alcohol coming from the subjects person, I then noticed an open bottle of wine in the passenger side of the vehicle. I asked the subject his name and he stated Randy Travis. Mr. Travis's speech was slurred and I was beginning to have a hard time understanding what he was saying. I advised Denton County Communications to send Officer Bishop as a cover unit to my location. I asked Mr. Travis if he had any form of identification and attempted to find it, but was unable to locate it. Mr. Travis was unaware of his location and kept asking me to take him home. Officer Bishop arrived on scene and we had Mr. Travis step out of the vehicle and as he did he stumbled as he tried to walk. I advised Mr. Travis he was being taken into custody for public intoxication. I placed handcuffs on him (D,L) and placed him into the back seat of my patrol unit. Officer Bishop poured out the remaining wine in the wine bottle and inventoried the vehicle which was towed by EJ's towing. I transported Mr. Travis to Denton County Jail where he was booked in for public intoxication.
