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OPINIONS AND CONCLUSIONS:

3 THE SUMMARY, AREA OF IMPACT(S) AND CAUSE WERE BASED ON PHYSICAL EVIDENCE, VEHICLE DAMAGE AND STATEMENTS.

SUMMARY:

This collision occurred as all of the involved parties were traveling on the westbound US-101, east of Sepulveda Boulevard. Party #1 (Loney) (P1) was driving Vehicle #1 (Maserati) (V1), in the #2 lane, at approximately 65 mph to the right rear of Vehicle #2 (Toyota) (V2). Party #2 (P2) was driving V2, in the #1 lane, at approximately 60 mph, to the left rear of) (P3) was driving V3, in the #2 lane, at Vehicle #3 (Mini) (V3). Party #3 (approximately 60 mph, to the rear of Vehicle #4 (Mercedes) (V4). Party #4 (was driving V4, in the #2 lane, at approximately 60 mph.

For an unknown reason P1 made an unsafe turning movement into the #1 lane. This unsafe turning movement caused the left side of V1 to collide into the right side of V2. V1 continued traveling forward out of control in the #1 lane and collided into the right side of V3. V1 still out of control collided into the left side of V3 and then the left side of V4. V1 then veered to the left and collided into the center divider wall. Following the collision all of the involved parties pulled into the #1 lane, stopped and awaited CHP arrival.

AREAS OF IMPACT:

- A.O.I. # 1 (V1 vs. V2) was located approximately .5 miles east of the east edge of Sepulveda Blvd., and approximately 8 feet north of the south roadway edge of westbound US-101.
- A.O.I. # 2 (V1 vs. V3) was located approximately .5 miles minus 100 feet east of the east edge of Sepulveda Blvd., and approximately 14 feet north of the south roadway edge of westbound US-101.
- A.O.I. #3 (V1 vs. V4) was located approximately .5 miles minus 120 feet east of the east edge of Sepulveda Blvd., and approximately 14 feet north of the south roadway edge of westbound US-101.
- A.O.I. # 4 (V1 vs. center divider wall) was located approximately .5 miles plus 150 feet east of the east edge of Sepulveda Blvd., and at the center divider wall of westbound US-101.

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INTOXICATION NARRATIVE:

As I exited my patrol vehicle, # approached me and advised me that Party #1 (Loney)(P1) was experiencing a medical problem or possibly under the influence of drugs. I contacted P1 as he was being treated by LAFD and asked him to explain the details of the traffic collision. I immediately observed P1 to be restless, unsteady, aggressive, and irritable. As P1 answered questions his speech was rapid and loud. I also observed that P1's face appeared to be flush, he exhibited eyelid tremors and his shirt was soiled and moist from perspiration, from his armpits down to his waist line. When I asked P1 questions pertaining to the traffic collision, P1 appeared to be disorientated, giving unusual statements. As I conversed with P1 and asked him a series of pre-FST questions he was slow to respond to my questions and would answer off the topic.

While asking the pre-FST questions, LAFD paramedics noted P1's responses to my questions and then interrupted and asked P1 what was today's date and day of the week. P1 stated, "7/15 and Saturday". Based on P1's response, LAFD paramedics determined that P1 may have experienced a possible head injury and would have to transport him to the hospital. LAFD paramedics requested that I place P1 in handcuffs due to his aggressive behavior. I placed P1 in handcuffs, advising him that he is not under arrest and that he was going to the hospital. I then followed LAFD to Sherman Oaks Hospital to continue my investigation.

Upon arrival to Sherman Oaks Hospital, I removed P1's handcuffs and the Sherman Oak's Hospital medical staff placed P1 on a bed in the short stay room. As I attempted to conduct a PAS test P1 was uncooperative and bit down on the mouthpiece and forcefully pulled it out. P1 then sat up in the hospital bed, spit the PAS device mouthpiece towards me and in a threatening manner attempted to stand up and confront me. Walked into the hospital room and assisted me in placing P1 back in handcuffs. While restraining P1, he sat up, pulled forward, attempting to get out of the handcuffs. Sergeant Ford and I continued to restrain P1 until the hospital staff placed P1 in arm and leg restraints. The hospital staff then gave P1 an injection to get him to calm down. Due to P1 possible being under the influence of drugs, I advised him that he was under arrest and a blood sample was obtained. P1 was then released from his arrest due to the hospital, due to his need for immediate medical treatment. At approximately 2130 hours P1 was released to the care of Sherman Oaks Hospital.

CAUSE:

Party #1 (P1) caused this collision by driving Vehicle #1 (Maserati) (V1) in violation of 22107 V.C. which states, in part, that no person shall turn a vehicle from a direct course or move right or left upon a roadway until such movement can be made with reasonable safety and then only after the giving of an appropriate signal in the manner provided in this chapter in the event any other vehicle may be affected by the movement.
