1 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: THE CONTENTS OF THIS
2 INTERVIEW WILL NEVER BE RELEASED BY US, EVEN AFTER
3 TOXICOLOGY COMES OUT.

4 MR. CHERNOFF: AND YOU GUYS ARE THE ONLY
5 ONES WHO BASICALLY HAVE CUSTODY OF THIS INTERVIEW.

6 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YEAH, WE'RE GOING TO
7 HAVE CUSTODY OF THE NOTES. THE PERTINENT FACTS, I'M
8 GOING TO FORWARD -- I'M GOING TO MEET WITH THE CORONER
9 INVESTIGATOR, ELISSA FLEAK, AND DR. LAKSHMANAN, WHO IS
10 THE CORONER FOR L.A. COUNTY. HE'S THE ONE WHO
11 ACTUALLY DID THE AUTOPSY. SO I'LL BE DISCUSSING WITH
12 THEM WHAT WAS TALKED ABOUT. HOPEFULLY, THAT'LL MAKE
13 HIM -- HELP HIM DETERMINE THE CAUSE OF DEATH.

23 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: GRASSY?

24 DR. MURRAY: UH-HUH.

25 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: SPRINGS PLACE.

1 DETECTIVE SMITH: COUNSEL, LET ME SEE IF I
2 CAN GET THIS MUSIC TURNED OFF.

3 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

4 DR. MURRAY: LAS VEGAS, NEVADA 89135.

5 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: 89135. YOU HAVE A HOME
6 PHONE?

7 DR. MURRAY: YES. (702).

24 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: AND A BUSINESS PHONE?

25 DR. MURRAY: (702) 866-6802.

2 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: DO YOU HAVE A CELL
3 PHONE?

4 DR. MURRAY: YEAH. (702) 862-0973.

5 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. ABOUT HOW TALL
6 ARE YOU, SIR?

7 DR. MURRAY: SIX-FOUR, SIX-FIVE, ROUGHLY.

8 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: AND HOW MUCH DO YOU
9 WEIGH?

10 DR. MURRAY: I'M ABOUT TWO HUNDRED AND --
11 220.

12 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: 220? AND BIRTH DATE?

13 DR. MURRAY: FEBRUARY 19TH, 1953.

14 DETECTIVE SMITH: I'M SORRY. FEBRUARY?

15 DR. MURRAY: 19TH, 1953.

16 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: AND HOW OLD DOES THAT
17 MAKE YOU?

18 DR. MURRAY: 56 OBVIOUSLY.

19 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: AND DO YOU HAVE A --
20 OBVIOUSLY, YOU DON'T HAVE A CALIFORNIA DRIVER'S
21 LICENSE. DO YOU HAVE A NEVADA DRIVER'S LICENSE OR A
22 TEXAS?

23 DR. MURRAY: NO, I HAVE A CALIFORNIA DRIVER
24 LICENSE.

25 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OH, YOU DO?

1 DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

2 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: DO YOU KNOW THE NUMBER
3 OFF THE TOP OF YOUR HEAD?

4 DR. MURRAY: I'LL GIVE IT TO YOU. I GAVE IT
5 TO YOUR OTHER COLLEAGUES ON THE DAY OF THE --

6 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YEAH.

7 DR. MURRAY: (UNINTELLIGIBLE.) THE NUMBER
8 IS "A" AS IN APPLE, 5965981.

9 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: A5965981.

10 DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

11 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: SORRY. THE MUSIC IS
12 OFF NOW?

13 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: NO, IT'S STILL ON.

14 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: IT'S STILL ON. OKAY.
15 SORRY ABOUT THAT.

16 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: AND PENA, CHERNOFF.
17 OKAY.

18 DETECTIVE SMITH: CAN WE GET SOME BUSINESS
19 CARDS?

20 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: I GOT THEM. I GOT
21 THEM.

22 DETECTIVE SMITH: OH, YOU GOT SOME ALREADY?

23 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YES.

24 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

25 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: LET ME PASS THEM OVER

1 TO YOU. SO ONCE AGAIN, THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR
2 MEETING WITH US. I HOPE YOU UNDERSTAND THAT NONE OF
3 THE CIRCUS THAT'S BEEN GOING ON HAS BEEN ON OUR --
4 COMING FROM US, NONE OF THE COMMENTS AND STUFF.
5 WE UNDERSTAND THAT YOU SPOKE WITH SOME DETECTIVES AT
6 THE HOSPITAL.

7 DR. MURRAY: YES.

8 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: UNFORTUNATELY, THEY
9 WEREN'T HANDLING THE CASE. THEY JUST WERE THE
10 DIVISION THAT WAS RIGHT THERE IN THE AREA. SO THEY --
11 WE WERE COMING FROM DOWNTOWN. THEY WERE FROM RIGHT
12 THERE. THEY SHOWED UP. THEY WERE HELPING US OUT.
13 AND SO THEY DIDN'T DO A FORMAL INTERVIEW. THEY
14 BASICALLY TOOK NOTES AFTER WE COULDN'T -- AFTER YOU
15 HAD LEFT.

16 DR. MURRAY: YES.

17 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: SO THAT'S WHY WE WANTED
18 TO --

19 DR. MURRAY: OH, THEY TOOK NOTES AFTER I
20 LEFT?

21 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YEAH. I MEAN THEY TOOK
22 VERY FEW NOTES, BUT THEY KNEW THAT THEY WEREN'T
23 HANDLING IT. SO THEY THOUGHT THAT WE WERE GOING TO
24 TALK.

25 DR. MURRAY: OH, OKAY. I SEE.

1 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: SO HOW LONG HAVE YOU
2 BEEN A DOCTOR FOR MR. JACKSON?

3 DR. MURRAY: AT FIRST I WAS ATTENDING TO HIM
4 IN 2006.

5 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: AND IT WAS CONTINUOUS,
6 2006 ON?

7 DR. MURRAY: NO. WELL, NO.

8 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OR ON AND OFF?

9 DR. MURRAY: OFF AND ON, INTERMITTENT.

10 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. DO YOU KNOW IF
11 HE WAS UNDER THE CARE OF ANY OTHER DOCTORS?

12 DR. MURRAY: HE NEVER DISCLOSED THAT TO ME,
13 BUT BECAUSE HE MOVED AROUND SO MUCH, I WOULD ASSUME
14 THAT HE WAS.

15 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. SO YOU'RE NOT
16 SURE IF YOU WERE THE ONLY DOCTOR.

17 DR. MURRAY: NO.

18 DETECTIVE SMITH: I'M SORRY, DOCTOR. WHAT
19 KIND OF DOCTOR ARE YOU?

20 DR. MURRAY: I AM A CARDIO -- INTERVENTIONAL
21 CARDIOLOGIST IS MY SUBSPECIALTY. I AM A CARDIOLOGIST
22 AS A SPECIALIST. I HAVE A SPECIALTY ALSO IN INTERNAL
23 MEDICINE. ALL THREE.

24 DETECTIVE SMITH: DID THE JACKSONS,
25 SPECIFICALLY MICHAEL, SEEK YOU OUT FOR THAT REASON,

1 BECAUSE YOU'RE A CARDIOLOGIST OR --

2 DR. MURRAY: NO. I FIRST MET HIM IN 2006,
3 WHEN A PATIENT FRIEND, WHO WAS A SECURITY GUARD WITH
4 HIM, ASKED THAT I SEE HIM AS A REQUEST, BECAUSE HE WAS
5 NOT FEELING WELL AND HE WANTED TO SEE A DOCTOR.

6 (INTERRUPTION.)

7 MR. CHERNOFF: YES. THANK YOU.

8 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: THANK YOU VERY MUCH.

9 DETECTIVE SMITH: AND WHEN YOU FIRST STARTED
10 ATTENDING, SEEING MICHAEL JACKSON IN 2006, WHAT WAS
11 THAT FOR?

12 DR. MURRAY: THERE WAS A FAMILY FLU ILLNESS
13 BETWEEN HIMSELF AND HIS CHILDREN. THEY WERE COUGHING
14 AND HAD RUNNY NOSE, AND THEY FELT DEHYDRATED, AND THEY
15 WERE NOT REALLY GETTING ENOUGH REST AT THAT TIME.

16 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. AND I'M SORRY. YOU
17 WERE REFERRED BY A PATIENT OF YOURS?

18 DR. MURRAY: A PATIENT'S SON, WHO ALSO IS A
19 PATIENT OF MY PRACTICE.

20 DETECTIVE SMITH: AND HE WAS HIS SECURITY
21 GUARD?

22 DR. MURRAY: HE IS A SECURITY GUARD, AND HE
23 MADE THE RECOMMENDATION.

24 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. THIS LAST
25 SECTION OF TIME THAT YOU'VE BEEN CARING FOR HIM, HOW

1 LONG CONTINUOUSLY HAS IT BEEN?

2 DR. MURRAY: A LITTLE OVER TWO MONTHS.

3 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: LITTLE OVER TWO MONTHS.

4 COULD YOU TELL US HOW THAT CAME TO BE?

5 DR. MURRAY: I WAS CALLED BY MR. JACKSON'S
6 ASSISTANT. HIS NAME IS AMIR.

7 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: AMIR.

8 DR. MURRAY: BROTHER AMIR.

9 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YEAH.

10 DR. MURRAY: AND HE SAID MR. JACKSON WANTED
11 TO SPEAK WITH ME. AND THEN HE MENTIONED THAT FOR THE
12 FIRST TIME, BECAUSE I HADN'T SEEN HIM FOR A WHILE,
13 THAT THEY WERE GOING TO BE DOING A CONCERT TOUR IN
14 ENGLAND AND MR. JACKSON WOULD VERY MUCH LIKE ME TO BE
15 PART OF THE TRIP AND TO BE THERE FOR THE CONCERTS, AND
16 WOULD I AGREE TO THAT. AND I SAID, "WELL, I NEED MORE
17 DETAILS ABOUT THAT," AND THAT WAS IT. THAT WAS
18 BASICALLY THE GIST OF THE QUESTION.

19 THEN HE CALLED MR. JACKSON APPARENTLY. I
20 WAS NOT PRESENT. AND SHORTLY AFTER, WITHIN AN HOUR OR
21 SO, I GOT A CALL FROM MR. JACKSON TELLING ME HOW
22 ELATED HE WAS THAT I WAS GOING TO JOIN THE TRIP. OF
23 COURSE, I DID NOT HAVE A COMMITMENT MADE, BUT THAT WAS
24 HOW IT STARTED.

25 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. AND I'M SURE YOU

1 GUY'S HAVE HEARD ON THE NEWS. THE NEWS IS REPORTING
2 THAT YOU DON'T WORK FOR MR. JACKSON BUT YOU WORK FOR
3 A.E.G. IS THAT CORRECT OR INCORRECT?

4 DR. MURRAY: HOW DO I DEFINE THAT? WELL,
5 MR. JACKSON ASKED ME TO BE ON HIS TEAM. I WAS TALKING
6 TO MR. JACKSON HIMSELF. HE OFFERED ME EMPLOYMENT, AND
7 I WAS OF THE OPINION THAT HE WOULD BE MY EMPLOYER
8 DIRECTLY. SUBSEQUENTLY TO ACCEPTING THAT, I -- I
9 REALIZED THAT A.E.G. WOULD BE THE ONE PAYING FOR THE
10 SALARY THAT HE REQUESTED. SO THAT WAS THEIR
11 ARRANGEMENT AS FAR AS WHAT THEY WOULD FINANCE ME. SO
12 I AM AN EMPLOYEE FOR MICHAEL JACKSON BUT PAID THROUGH
13 A.E.G. DOES THAT HELP YOU?

14 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OH, YEAH. SO MICHAEL
15 PICKED YOU, BUT SOMEBODY ELSE IS GETTING THE TAB.

16 DR. MURRAY: I HAD NO IDEA THAT THAT WAS THE
17 CASE.

18 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. OKAY. SO TWO
19 MONTHS CARING FOR HIM. DID THIS -- HAS THE TWO MONTHS
20 ALL BEEN HERE IN CALIFORNIA, OR WAS IT SPLIT BETWEEN
21 HERE AND LAS VEGAS?

22 DR. MURRAY: BASICALLY HERE.

23 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: BASICALLY HERE?

24 DR. MURRAY: UH-HUH.

25 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. CAN YOU TELL US

1 ABOUT THE GENERAL HEALTH OF MR. JACKSON?

2 DR. MURRAY: GENERALLY SPEAKING, HE WAS NOT
3 A PERSON WHO ATE WELL. HE'S VERY THIN. THERE WERE --
4 I KNEW HE PROBABLY WAS SEEING OTHER PHYSICIANS FOR
5 OTHER ISSUES THAT HE DOES NOT DISCLOSE TO ME, CLEARLY.
6 SO I'M NOT SURE IF HE WAS SO VERY CANDID ABOUT ALL OF
7 HIS GENERAL CONDITIONS. BUT DURING A CURSORY PHYSICAL
8 EXAMINATION, I DID NOT FIND ANY MAJOR PHYSICAL CHANGE
9 EXCEPT FOR A SUBLUXATION OF HIS RIGHT HIP.

10 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: A WHAT?

11 DR. MURRAY: SUBLUXATION.

12 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: I DON'T KNOW WHAT THAT
13 MEANS.

14 DR. MURRAY: HE -- IT'S LIKE IF YOU HAVE A
15 JOINT THAT GOES OUT OF PLACE AND COMES BACK IN AT A
16 CERTAIN ANGLE. SO WHENEVER HE BENT TO 90 DEGREES OR
17 GREATER, HIS RIGHT HIP WOULD SLIP OUT OF JOINT - SITS
18 BACK UP, SLIDES BACK IN. THAT WAS THE CASE. HE HAD
19 SOME FUNGAL DISEASE OF THE TOES, WHICH WAS TREATED
20 BEFORE, AND THAT WAS WELL. NO OTHER SYSTEMIC ILLNESS,
21 LIKE HYPERTENSION OR HIGH BLOOD PRESSURE OR SO, WAS
22 RECOGNIZED BY ME.

23 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YOU HAVE ANY FOLLOW-UPS
24 ON THAT?

25 DETECTIVE SMITH: NO, NOT ON THAT.

1 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: GO AHEAD. JUMP IN.

2 DETECTIVE SMITH: THE DAY THAT YOU WERE
3 NOTIFIED -- I GUESS IT WOULD HAVE BEEN SOMETIME LATE
4 WEDNESDAY EVENING INTO THE EARLY MORNING HOURS OF
5 THURSDAY -- WHO TELEPHONED YOU?

6 DR. MURRAY: I WAS TELEPHONED BY AMIR,
7 BROTHER MICHAEL AMIR, LETTING ME KNOW THAT MR. JACKSON
8 WAS FINISHING REHEARSAL AROUND THAT TIME. I LOOKED AT
9 MY WATCH WHEN I GOT THE CALL. IT WAS ABOUT 12:10 IN
10 THE MORNING, 12:10 A.M. AND I WOULD MEET THEM AT THE
11 HOME.

12 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: DID HE MENTION ANY --
13 JUST THAT -- JUST THAT REHEARSAL WAS FINISHING, OR DID
14 HE SAY THAT THERE WERE ANY PROBLEMS?

15 DR. MURRAY: I ASKED ABOUT PROBLEMS, BECAUSE
16 I CONSTANTLY MADE THAT INQUIRY INTO HOW WELL HE HAD
17 DONE THAT DAY, DID HE PERFORM WELL. AND I'M TOLD THAT
18 HE HAD A LOT OF MEETINGS, THAT HE DID A PARTIAL
19 PERFORMANCE, NOT FULL PERFORMANCE. AND HE WANTED ME
20 THERE BY THE TIME HE'D GOTTEN HOME.

21 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. SO HE DIDN'T
22 COMPLAIN OF ANYTHING, JUST WANTED YOU THERE AT THE
23 HOUSE NORMALLY.

24 DR. MURRAY: YES.

25 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: WE UNDERSTAND THAT YOU

1 HAD BEEN SPENDING SOME NIGHTS AT THE -- AT THE HOUSE?

2 DR. MURRAY: NOT SOME NIGHTS. I SPENT EVERY
3 NIGHT.

4 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OH, EVERY NIGHT?

5 DR. MURRAY: WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE
6 NIGHTS I WAS OFF, WHICH WAS ON A SUNDAY.

7 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: WAS IT FOR MEDICAL
8 REASONS OR JUST TO MAKE HIM FEEL BETTER, THAT YOU
9 SPENT THE NIGHT?

10 DR. MURRAY: IT WAS MR. JACKSON'S REQUEST.

11 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

12 DETECTIVE SMITH: SO YOU WERE THERE SIX
13 NIGHTS A WEEK?

14 DR. MURRAY: YES.

15 DETECTIVE SMITH: AND SUNDAY WAS TYPICALLY
16 YOUR DAY OFF.

17 DR. MURRAY: YES.

18 DETECTIVE SMITH: UNLESS SOMETHING --

19 DR. MURRAY: YES.

20 DETECTIVE SMITH: -- SHOULD HAPPEN TO
21 MICHAEL.

22 DR. MURRAY: SURE.

23 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. THE BEDROOM WHERE
24 HE WAS -- WELL, LET ME BACK UP A LITTLE BIT. WHAT
25 TIME DID YOU ARRIVE THERE THAT NIGHT AFTER YOU

1 RECEIVED THIS CALL AT A LITTLE AFTER MIDNIGHT?

2 DR. MURRAY: IT TOOK -- I GOT THERE ABOUT
3 ONE -- 12:50, CLOSE TO 1:00 O'CLOCK.

4 DETECTIVE SMITH: DID YOU ARRIVE ALONE?

5 DR. MURRAY: YES.

6 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. AND WHEN YOU GOT
7 THERE, WHAT TOOK PLACE?

8 DR. MURRAY: I WENT TO MR. JACKSON'S ROOM.
9 OF COURSE, HE HAS TWO ROOMS IN THE HOUSE. THE ONE
10 THAT I WAS CUSTOMARILY SEEING HIM AT, I WENT TO HIS
11 ROOM, AND I WAITED FOR HIS ARRIVAL.

12 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OH, SO YOU ARRIVED AT
13 THE HOUSE BEFORE HE GOT BACK --

14 DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

15 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: -- FROM REHEARSAL?

16 DR. MURRAY: UH-HUH.

17 DETECTIVE SMITH: SO MICHAEL HADN'T BEEN
18 BACK YET. YOU GOT THERE BEFORE HIM; IS THAT CORRECT?

19 DR. MURRAY: SURE, UH-HUH.

20 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. AND WHAT TIME DID
21 MICHAEL ARRIVE?

22 DR. MURRAY: SHORTLY AFTER. PROBABLY JUST
23 MAYBE AROUND 1:00, 1:05.

24 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

25 DR. MURRAY: A.M. I CAN'T SAY EXACTLY WHAT

1 THE PRECISION OF TIME WOULD BE.

2 DETECTIVE SMITH: ROUGHLY. THAT'S FINE.

3 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YEAH, ESTIMATION IS
4 GOOD.

5 DETECTIVE SMITH: AND ONCE MICHAEL ARRIVES,
6 WHAT TAKES PLACE?

7 DR. MURRAY: HE, I USUALLY ASKS -- HE SAID,
8 "GOOD NIGHT. HI. HOW ARE YOU?" AND I SAID THE SAME
9 TO HIM. AND THEN HE SAYS -- I SAID, "HOW WAS YOUR
10 DAY? ARE YOU FINE? WHAT ARE YOU FEELING?" AND HE
11 SAYS "OH, TIRED AND FATIGUED, AND I'M TREATED LIKE I'M
12 A MACHINE BECAUSE OF -- HE SAID THAT. BUT LET ME JUST
13 HAVE A QUICK SHOWER AND CHANGE, AND I'LL COME BACK TO
14 YOU."

15 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. AND WHAT TOOK PLACE
16 NEXT?

17 DR. MURRAY: AFTER SHOWERING, SO HE CAME
18 BACK TO THE ROOM. AND HE WOULD -- I WOULD PUT ON SOME
19 CREAM ON HIS BODY FOR HIM, LOTION, ON AN AREA ON HIS
20 BACK.

21 DETECTIVE SMITH: WHAT KIND OF CREAM WAS
22 THIS?

23 DR. MURRAY: IT'S A CREAM THAT HE USES
24 FOR -- CHRONICALLY FOR DERMATOLOGICAL ISSUES.

25 DETECTIVE SMITH: I'M SORRY. FOR WHAT?

1 DR. MURRAY: DERMATOLOGICAL ISSUES.

2 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

3 DR. MURRAY: HE WALKS WITH AN UMBRELLA IN
4 THE SUN. HE SAYS THAT HE IS -- HE HAS ALLERGIC
5 REACTION TO THE SUN, WHICH PROBABLY STEM FROM A
6 HISTORY OF VITILIGO.

7 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: THAT'S THE WHITE SPOTS?

8 DR. MURRAY: YES.

9 DETECTIVE SMITH: AND WHEN THIS WAS BEING
10 DONE, WAS THIS -- THERE'S TWO ROOMS WHEN YOU GO
11 UPSTAIRS, ONE IMMEDIATELY TO YOUR LEFT, WHICH I GUESS
12 WOULD HAVE BEEN MICHAEL'S, AND THEN THERE'S ANOTHER
13 ROOM WHERE THE I.V. DRIP WAS SET UP, IF YOU WILL --

14 DR. MURRAY: RIGHT.

15 DETECTIVE SMITH: -- AND ALL THE OXYGEN
16 BOTTLES.

17 DR. MURRAY: RIGHT.

18 DETECTIVE SMITH: WOULD THAT TYPICALLY BE
19 YOUR ROOM?

20 DR. MURRAY: THAT WOULD BE THE ROOM WHERE I
21 WOULD TYPICALLY SEE HIM. NO ONE WAS ALLOWED TO GO
22 INTO THE OTHER ROOM TO THE LEFT.

23 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OH.

24 DR. MURRAY: I ASKED HIM ABOUT THAT, AND
25 TYPICALLY WHEREVER HE LIVED, HE ALWAYS HAD TWO SITES.

1 FIRST OF ALL, HE DOES NOT TRUST PEOPLE COMING INTO HIS
2 ROOM, BECAUSE HE SAID HE HAD LOST THINGS BEFORE. AND
3 HIS ROOM IS ALWAYS IN A BAD STATE, AND NOT EVEN THE
4 CLEANERS WOULD BE ALLOWED TO GO IN THERE. SO I NEVER
5 WENT INTO THAT ROOM.

6 DETECTIVE SMITH: AND WHEN YOU WERE SEEING
7 MICHAEL THIS NIGHT, PUTTING THIS CREAM ON HIM, WAS HE
8 IN THE ROOM THAT YOU WOULD TYPICALLY STAY IN?

9 DR. MURRAY: YES, YES.

10 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. ON THE BED?

11 DR. MURRAY: YES.

12 DETECTIVE SMITH: WAS ANYONE ELSE IN THE
13 ROOM?

14 DR. MURRAY: NO.

15 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. SO IT WAS JUST YOU
16 AND MICHAEL. OKAY.

17 DR. MURRAY: USUALLY THAT'S HOW IT IS.

18 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. AND THIS NIGHT, IT
19 WAS JUST YOU AND MICHAEL.

20 DR. MURRAY: JUST MYSELF AND HIM.

21 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. SO AFTER YOU PUT
22 THIS CREAM ON HIM, WHAT TAKES PLACE? WHAT HAPPENS
23 NEXT?

24 DR. MURRAY: WELL, THE USUAL THING IS THAT
25 HE WANTS TO SLEEP.

1 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. AND DOES HE GO TO
2 SLEEP? DOES ANYTHING TAKE PLACE AFTER YOU PUT THE
3 CREAM ON HIM AND --

4 DR. MURRAY: NO, HE'S NOT ABLE TO SLEEP
5 NATURALLY.

6 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. SO WHAT HAPPENS
7 NEXT?

8 DR. MURRAY: SO BASICALLY I WOULD PUT AN
9 I.V.

10 DETECTIVE SMITH: IS THAT FOR DEHYDRATION
11 OR --

12 DR. MURRAY: HYDRATION AS WELL, BECAUSE, YOU
13 KNOW, WHEN HE EXERCISES AND DANCES, HE LOSES A LOT OF
14 FLUID.

15 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. SO THIS EVENING,
16 YOU PUT THE I.V. IN?

17 DR. MURRAY: YES.

18 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

19 DR. MURRAY: UH-HUH.

20 DETECTIVE SMITH: AND WHAT HAPPENED NEXT?

21 DR. MURRAY: WE TALKED A LITTLE BIT, AND
22 THEN I GAVE HIM MEDICATION TO HELP HIM SLEEP.

23 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. WHEN YOU PUT THE
24 I.V. IN HIS ARM?

25 DR. MURRAY: NO, THE I.V. IS PLACED ON --

1 THIS PARTICULAR NIGHT, THE I.V. WAS PLACED ON HIS
2 RIGHT OR HIS LEFT, EITHER HIS RIGHT OR HIS LEFT LEG,
3 BUT BELOW THE KNEE.

4 DETECTIVE SMITH: SOMEWHERE IN THIS AREA?

5 DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

6 DETECTIVE SMITH: IN THE CALF AREA?

7 DR. MURRAY: NO, HIGHER, SUPERIOR, CLOSER TO
8 THE KNEE.

9 DETECTIVE SMITH: JUST BELOW, EITHER THE
10 RIGHT OR LEFT.

11 DR. MURRAY: YES.

12 DETECTIVE SMITH: YOU DON'T REMEMBER WHICH.

13 DR. MURRAY: NO.

14 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

15 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: TOWARDS THE BACK?
16 TOWARDS THE BACK --

17 DR. MURRAY: OF THE LEG? WHEREVER THERE WAS
18 A MORE PROMINENT VEIN.

19 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. AND THEN YOU -- I
20 THINK YOU SAID YOU GAVE HIM A SEDATIVE?

21 DR. MURRAY: YES.

22 DETECTIVE SMITH: WHAT DID YOU GIVE HIM?

23 DR. MURRAY: HE TOOK A VALIUM, WHICH IS --
24 THAT HE HAD, WHICH WAS ONE PILL, 10 MILLIGRAM, ORALLY.

25 DETECTIVE SMITH: DO YOU KNOW WHAT -- THE

1 VALIUM, DO YOU KNOW EXACTLY WHAT IT WAS?

2 DR. MURRAY: VALIUM. WHAT, THE DOSE?

3 DETECTIVE SMITH: 10 MILLIGRAMS?

4 DR. MURRAY: 10 MILLIGRAM.

5 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

6 DR. MURRAY: ONE TABLET, UH-HUH.

7 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: ANYTHING ELSE?

8 DR. MURRAY: THAT'S WHAT HE TOOK ORALLY.

9 AND THEN HE SAT THERE. THE EFFECTS OF VALIUM ARE
10 DELAYED. IT DOES NOT COME UP IMMEDIATELY. AND HE
11 NEEDED TO SLEEP. SO THEN I GAVE HIM ADDITIONAL
12 MEDICATIONS SAFELY, WHICH WAS THE I.V. FORM OF
13 LORAZEPAM.

14 DETECTIVE SMITH: DORAZEPAM?

15 DR. MURRAY: LO. LORAZEPAM.

16 DETECTIVE SMITH: LORAZEPAM?

17 DR. MURRAY: UH-HUH. L-O-R-A-Z-A-P-E-M.

18 DETECTIVE SMITH: E-P-E-M?

19 DR. MURRAY: L-O-R-A-Z-E-P-A-M, LORAZEPAM.

20 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: IS THAT MEASURED IN
21 MILLIMETERS?

22 DR. MURRAY: MILLIGRAMS.

23 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: MILLIGRAMS?

24 DR. MURRAY: PER ML.

25 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: DO YOU REMEMBER HOW

1 MUCH YOU GAVE HIM?

2 DR. MURRAY: YES. THE CONCENTRATION THAT IT
3 CAME IN WAS 4 MILLIGRAMS PER ML IN THE VIAL, AND THE
4 VIAL THEN CARRIES 10 CC. SO I GAVE HIM HALF A
5 MILLIGRAM, EQUIVALENT TO 2 MILLIGRAMS TOTAL, AND I
6 DILUTED THAT UP WITH NORMAL SALINE.

7 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. SO THE TOTAL
8 AFTER YOU DILUTED WAS ABOUT HALF A MILLIGRAM; IS THAT
9 CORRECT?

10 DR. MURRAY: 2 MILLI -- 2 MILLIGRAMS.

11 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OH, 2 MILLIGRAMS.

12 DR. MURRAY: YEAH. BECAUSE I ONLY TOOK HALF
13 A MILLIGRAM, HALF OF -- HALF WAS -- HALF A CC, AND
14 EACH CC CARRIES 4 MILLIGRAMS.

15 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. SO 2 MILLIGRAMS
16 AFTER DILUTION.

17 DETECTIVE SMITH: AND WAS THAT PUT INTO HIS
18 DRIP, HIS I.V., OR --

19 DR. MURRAY: NO, THAT --

20 DETECTIVE SMITH: -- WAS IT ANOTHER SITE?

21 DR. MURRAY: NO, THAT WAS PUSHED SLOWLY.

22 DETECTIVE SMITH: I'M SORRY?

23 DR. MURRAY: IT WAS I.V. PUSHED SLOWLY.

24 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. INTO -- INTO HIS
25 I.V. DRIP ALREADY.

1 DR. MURRAY: NO. THE I.V. DRIP WAS WITH THE
2 SALINE, NORMAL SALINE FOR HYDRATION. AND LOWER DOWN
3 ON THE -- ON THE CORD, THERE IS A PORT THAT I CAN
4 INJECT A NEEDLE.

5 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

6 DR. MURRAY: SO I WOULD TURN OFF THE I.V. AT
7 THAT TIME, AND THEN I WOULD SLOWLY INFUSE THE
8 MEDICATION.

9 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

10 DR. MURRAY: OVER ABOUT TWO TO THREE
11 MINUTES.

12 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

13 DR. MURRAY: AND ONCE THAT WAS SAFELY
14 INFUSED, THEN I WOULD UNCLAP -- UNCAP THE LINE AND
15 THEN JUST HAVE THE I.V. CONTINUE TO DRIP.

16 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. SO OBVIOUSLY THAT
17 WAS DONE WITH A SYRINGE.

18 DR. MURRAY: YES.

19 DETECTIVE SMITH: SLOWLY.

20 DR. MURRAY: YES.

21 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. AND WHAT HAPPENED
22 NEXT?

23 DR. MURRAY: WELL, I WATCHED HIM. I
24 OBSERVED HIM, AND HE CONTINUED TO BE AWAKE FOR MORE
25 THAN AN HOUR.

1 DETECTIVE SMITH: ANY ADDITIONAL
2 MEDICATIONS?

3 DR. MURRAY: WELL, I WATCHED HIM BECAUSE,
4 YOU KNOW, I WANT TO BE CAUTIOUS. SO I WATCHED HIM
5 LONG ENOUGH TO SEE IF THERE WAS AN EFFECT OF DRUGS,
6 YOU KNOW, AS IF HE'D START TO SLEEP. AND AFTER AN
7 HOUR OR SO OF WATCHING HIM, HE WAS STILL WIDE AWAKE.

8 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: DIDN'T WORK.

9 DR. MURRAY: DIDN'T CHANGE. HE CONTINUED TO
10 COMPLAIN ABOUT HE CANNOT SLEEP. AND SO AFTER AN HOUR,
11 I DECIDE "WELL, OKAY. I'M GOING TO GIVE HIM A
12 DIFFERENT AGENT," BECAUSE HE IS WIDE AWAKE, AND AFTER
13 AN HOUR, THE FULL EFFECTS OF THE MEDICATION BY THIS
14 TIME IS SEEN. SO I GAVE HIM SOMETHING CALLED
15 MIDAZOLAM.

16 DETECTIVE SMITH: HOW DO WE SPELL THAT,
17 DOCTOR?

18 DR. MURRAY: M-I-D-A-Z-O-L-A-M.
19 M-I-D-A-Z-O-L-A-M.

20 MR. CHERNOFF: IT HAS A -- IT HAS A PRODUCT
21 NAME.

22 DR. MURRAY: VERSED.

23 MR. CHERNOFF: VERSED?

24 DR. MURRAY: YEAH, V-E-R-S-E-D, UH-HUH.
25 V-E-R-S-E-D.

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DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: S-E-D OR --

DR. MURRAY: S-E-D.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: S-E-D.

DR. MURRAY: VERSED, YEAH.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. IT'S ONE AND THE
SAME, MIDAZOLAM?

DR. MURRAY: NO, NOT -- YEAH, OF COURSE,
THEY'RE THE SAME, SAME PRODUCT.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: UH-HUH.

DETECTIVE SMITH: AND HOW MUCH OF THAT DID
YOU GIVE HIM?

DR. MURRAY: I GAVE HIM 2 MILLIGRAMS.

DETECTIVE SMITH: AND THIS IS INJECTED
ALSO?

DR. MURRAY: INJECTED SLOWLY.

MR. CHERNOFF: CAN YOU GIVE US A TIME FRAME,
DOCTOR?

DR. MURRAY: ROUGHLY AFTER AN HOUR OF
WAITING FOR THE EFFECT OF THE I.V. LORAZEPAM.

MR. CHERNOFF: SO LORAZEPAM WAS GIVEN AT
WHAT TIME?

DR. MURRAY: WELL, AFTER HE GOT TO BED WITH
HIS LOTION ON, HE HAD HIS -- HIS -- HIS PAJAMAS. AND
AFTER HAVING A SHOWER, I WOULD SAY -- AND I'M

1 GUESSING -- AROUND 2:00 O'CLOCK.

2 MR. CHERNOFF: SO AN HOUR AFTER THAT.

3 DR. MURRAY: AN HOUR AFTER THAT, WHICH WAS
4 WITH THE --

5 MR. CHERNOFF: VERSED.

6 DR. MURRAY: -- VERSED.

7 MR. CHERNOFF: ALL RIGHT.

8 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: ABOUT 3:00, 3:00 IN THE
9 MORNING.

10 DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

11 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. HOW DID THAT
12 WORK OUT?

13 DR. MURRAY: I WAITED AGAIN. AND IT DIDN'T
14 WORK. HE WAS WIDE AWAKE. I SAID, "DO YOU FEEL A
15 LITTLE BIT DROWSY? DO YOU THINK YOUR EYES ARE TELLING
16 YOU YOU WANT TO SLEEP?" HE SAID, "NO." I SAID, "HOW
17 ABOUT IF YOU TRY TO MEDITATE? LET'S CHANGE THE
18 LIGHTING OF THE ROOM. LET'S LOWER THE MUSIC" THAT HE
19 LIKES TO SLEEP WITH, WHICH IS LOUD, "LET ME -- I'LL
20 RUB YOUR FEET. AND TRY TO RELAX. TRY TO MEDITATE."
21 HE DID THAT RELUCTANTLY. AND HIS EYES CLOSED. I WAS
22 GRATEFUL FOR THAT. SO I WATCHED HIM FOR ABOUT 15 --
23 10 OR 15 MINUTES.

24 DETECTIVE SMITH: DO YOU KNOW WHAT TIME IT
25 WAS WHEN HE KIND OF FINALLY DRIFTED OFF?

1 DR. MURRAY: AFTER I GAVE HIM THE
2 MEDICATION? ABOUT ANOTHER 15, 20 MINUTES DURING MY
3 WAITING PERIOD, I WOULD SAY.

4 DETECTIVE SMITH: SO APPROXIMATELY 3:20,
5 3:30 IN THE MORNING NOW OR -- AND I'M JUDGING THAT --

6 DR. MURRAY: YEAH, YEAH.

7 DETECTIVE SMITH: -- AFTER YOU'D GIVEN THE
8 VERSED.

9 DR. MURRAY: YEAH. WELL, I GAVE HIM ABOUT
10 3:00 O'CLOCK. ANYWHERE FROM ABOUT 3:15, 3:20 OR SO
11 WOULD BE A REASONABLE TIME. THAT'S WHAT I WOULD
12 GUESSTIMATE.

13 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

14 DR. MURRAY: I'M NOT WATCHING MY WATCH.

15 DETECTIVE SMITH: SURE, NATURALLY.

16 DR. MURRAY: YEAH. AND TALKING TO HIM ABOUT
17 MEDITATING DURING THAT TIME AND TRYING TO RELAX
18 HIMSELF AND TRYING TO SLEEP NATURALLY. I WAS SO
19 (UNINTELLIGIBLE) THAT DURING THOSE 20 MINUTES OR SO,
20 FROM 3:00 O'CLOCK TO THE TIME. AND THEN HIS EYES
21 CLOSED, AND HE FELL ASLEEP. THAT, I TIMED, BECAUSE
22 THAT WAS REALLY GREAT. AND AS I LOOKED AT MY WATCH
23 AND I KEPT LOOKING AT HIM, WITHIN 10 MINUTES OR SO, 12
24 MINUTES, HE JUST JUMP RIGHT BACK UP.

25 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: WOKE UP AGAIN.

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DR. MURRAY: WIDE AWAKE.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: SO HE FELL ASLEEP FOR ABOUT 10, 15 MINUTES.

DETECTIVE SMITH: YEAH.

DR. MURRAY: YOU KNOW? AND HE SAID, "WOW." HE SAID, "AFTER YOU ASKED ME TO MEDITATE, I NEVER THOUGHT IT WOULD WORK, BUT I GUESS I SLEPT A LITTLE BIT, DIDN'T I?" I SAID, "YOU DID. SO LET'S KEEP TRYING THAT." AND WE TRIED. AND 4:00 O'CLOCK CAME, AND 4:00 O'CLOCK WENT, AND HE STILL WAS STILL AWAKE. IT WAS 4:30 IN THE MORNING, AND HE WAS WIDE AWAKE. AND THEN HE COMPLAINED, "I GOT TO SLEEP, DR. CONRAD. I HAVE THESE REHEARSALS TO PERFORM. I MUST BE READY FOR THE SHOW IN ENGLAND. AND TOMORROW I WILL HAVE TO CANCEL MY PERFORMANCE. I HAVE TO CANCEL MY TRIP, BECAUSE, YOU KNOW, I CANNOT FUNCTION IF I DON'T GET THE SLEEP." I SAID, "WELL, I WANT YOU TO TRY. JUST TRY, YOU KNOW. SO YOU HAVE TO CLOSE YOUR EYES." YOU KNOW, SO I START WORKING AGAIN. HE TRIED TO CLOSE HIS EYES, AND NOTHING WOULD WORK. HE IS MOVING HIS FEET, MOVING IN BED, COMPLAINING ABOUT "OH, I JUST CAN'T SLEEP. THE MEDICINE DOESN'T WORK." SO THEN I LOOKED AT MY WATCH, AND I REALIZED, WELL, SINCE I GAVE HIM THE ATIVAN, THE LORAZEPAM EARLIER, WHICH WAS ABOUT, WHAT, 2:00 O'CLOCK?

1 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: UH-HUH.

2 DR. MURRAY: (UNINTELLIGIBLE.) AND NOW WE
3 ARE PAST 4:00, 4:30, HEADING INTO 5:00 O'CLOCK. HE
4 HAS GOTTEN A SECOND AGENT. I DECIDED, WELL, IT IS
5 RELATIVELY REASONABLE TO GIVE AN ADDITIONAL AMOUNT OF
6 THE -- OF THE LORAZEPAM.

7 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. SO --

8 DR. MURRAY: THE ATIVAN. SO I GAVE HIM
9 ANOTHER 2 MILLIGRAMS SLOWLY, AFTER ABOUT TWO AND A
10 HALF HOURS.

11 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. AND THIS IS AN
12 ADDITIONAL 2 MILLIGRAMS?

13 DR. MURRAY: YES. NOT OF -- NOT OF THE
14 VERSED. OF THE LORAZEPAM.

15 DETECTIVE SMITH: LORAZEPAM?

16 DR. MURRAY: YEAH. IT WAS THE FIRST AGENT I
17 GAVE AT 2:00 O'CLOCK.

18 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

19 DR. MURRAY: THE OTHER NAME FOR LORAZEPAM IS
20 ATIVAN, A-T-I-V-A-N, IF IT MIGHT HELP YOU.
21 A-T-I-V-A-N.

22 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. AND I'M SORRY.
23 WHAT TIME WAS THIS NOW WHEN YOU --

24 DR. MURRAY: CLOSE TO 5:00 O'CLOCK.

25 DETECTIVE SMITH: ABOUT 5:00 O'CLOCK?

1 DR. MURRAY: YEAH. IT WAS PAST 4:30 LIKE,
2 YOU KNOW? AND HE WAS WIDE AWAKE.

3 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: DID THAT HELP HIM RELAX
4 AND --

5 DR. MURRAY: NO.

6 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: NO?

7 DR. MURRAY: AT THAT TIME, HE COMPLAINED
8 THAT HE COULDN'T PERFORM; HE'LL HAVE TO CANCEL
9 REHEARSALS AGAIN; IT WILL PUT THE SHOW BEHIND; AND HE
10 WOULD JUST -- HE WOULD, YOU KNOW, NOT SATISFY HIS FANS
11 IF HE WASN'T RESTED WELL AND ALL OF THOSE THINGS. SO
12 THERE WAS A LOT OF PRESSURE PLACED ON ME THERE. AND I
13 TOLD HIM. I SAID, "YOU KNOW, IF I GOT THE MEDICINE
14 THAT I GAVE YOU, I'D BE SLEEPING UNTIL TOMORROW
15 EVENING, A NORMAL PERSON'S WAY. YOU ARE NOT NORMAL."
16 I TOLD HIM THAT. AND THEN I WAITED, WAITED AGAIN.
17 DAYLIGHT CAME UPON US. MR. JACKSON WAS STILL --

18 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: STILL WHAT?

19 DR. MURRAY: STILL AWAKE, STILL TALKING.

20 DETECTIVE SMITH: 6:00, 6:30 NOW?

21 DR. MURRAY: OH, YES. STILL SLEEP. 7:30,
22 MR. JACKSON IS STILL WIDE AWAKE. AT THAT TIME, I GIVE
23 HIM ANOTHER 2 MILLIGRAMS OF THE VERSED, NOT LORAZEPAM.

24 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. NOW, YOU GAVE HIM 2
25 MILLIGRAMS -- I'M SORRY -- OF WHAT?

1 DR. MURRAY: OF VERSED, V-E-R-S-E-D.

2 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: DID YOU DO IT THE SAME
3 WAY, WHERE YOU DILUTED IT?

4 DR. MURRAY: YES. AND THEN SLOWLY INFUSED.
5 VERSED IS THE SAME AS, AGAIN, MIDAZOLAM. OKAY?
6 M-I-D-A-Z-O-L-A-M. HE HAD IT BEFORE.

7 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

8 DR. MURRAY: I DID NOT CHANGE MEDICATION.

9 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

10 DR. MURRAY: SO BETWEEN THE HOURS OF THE
11 FIRST DOSE OF VERSED, WHICH WAS ABOUT SOMETIME LIKE
12 4:00 O'CLOCK, I THINK, IN THE MORNING. I JUST --

13 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: ABOUT 3:00 O'CLOCK.

14 DR. MURRAY: 3:00 O'CLOCK? THEN THERE IT
15 WAS PAST 7:30, AND NO EFFECT. THAT'S WHEN I GAVE HIM
16 THE OTHER DOSE, HOPING THAT HE WOULD GET SOME SLEEP.
17 AND IT DID NOT WORK.

18 DETECTIVE SMITH: STILL NO EFFECT.

19 DR. MURRAY: NO EFFECT. I THEN -- I THEN
20 CAUTIOUSLY CHECKED THE I.V. SITE. I CHECKED THE SITE
21 OF INFUSION ON HIS BODY TO MAKE SURE THE I.V. WAS
22 FLOWING INTO HIM AND IT WAS NOT WETTING THE BEDSHEETS.
23 SO I MEAN -- I MEAN WHERE IS THIS MEDICINE GOING? WHY
24 IS THIS MAN NOT RESPONDING?

25 DETECTIVE SMITH: HE'S AWAKE.

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DR. MURRAY: WIDE AWAKE.

DETECTIVE SMITH: STILL AWAKE.

DR. MURRAY: WIDE AWAKE.

DETECTIVE SMITH: AND HE STILL HADN'T URINATED, NOTHING?

DR. MURRAY: HE URINATED THEN. I MADE HIM STAND AND HAD HIM URINATE, AND HE FILLED A -- HE HAD A BAG ON HIM. AND THAT WAS FILLED, AND I EMPTIED THAT. THEN I FILLED ANOTHER PORTABLE JUG, WHICH HE PLACED ANOTHER 6, 700 CC'S IN OF URINE. SO HE URINATED, YEAH. OH, YEAH, HE DOESN'T -- BECAUSE HE'S GETTING THE I.V. FLUID, YOU KNOW, WHICH IS ALSO HYDRATING HIM.

DETECTIVE SMITH: NOW WE'RE BEYOND 7:30. YOU'VE ADMINISTERED TWO MORE MILLIGRAMS OF THE VERSED.

DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

DETECTIVE SMITH: THERE WAS STILL NO EFFECT.

DR. MURRAY: NO EFFECT.

DETECTIVE SMITH: IT'S GETTING LATER NOW. WHAT -- WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

DR. MURRAY: NOW WE ARE -- WE ARE BEYOND 10:00 O'CLOCK IN THE MORNING.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: AND NOTHING HAS WORKED.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: BUT BETWEEN THE 7:30 AND THE 10:00, THERE'S -- YOU'RE JUST WATCHING HIM AND

1 TELLING HIM TO MEDITATE.

2 DR. MURRAY: WE'RE TRYING, TRYING. AND NOW
3 HE'S REALLY COMPLAINING THAT HE CANNOT SLEEP; YOU
4 KNOW, WHAT I'M DOING ISN'T WORKING; AND HE HAS TO
5 CANCEL THE DAY, CANCEL REHEARSAL; EVERYTHING IS GOING
6 TO BE THROWN OFF, THROWN BACK; AND WE HAVE VERY LITTLE
7 TIME TO TAKE THE SHOW TO ENGLAND. AT THAT TIME, HE
8 SAID, "I'D LIKE TO HAVE SOME MILK."

9 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: MILK?

10 DETECTIVE SMITH: ABOUT WHAT TIME WAS THIS?

11 DR. MURRAY: THIS, HE SAID, "PLEASE, PLEASE
12 GIVE ME SOME MILK SO THAT I CAN SLEEP, BECAUSE I KNOW
13 THAT THIS IS ALL THAT REALLY WORKS FOR ME."

14 DETECTIVE SMITH: HOT MILK OR WARM OR
15 JUST --

16 DR. MURRAY: IT'S JUST SOME MEDICINE --

17 DETECTIVE SMITH: WHAT --

18 DR. MURRAY: -- THAT HE WAS FAMILIAR WITH.

19 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: WHAT IS THE MEDICINE?

20 DR. MURRAY: IT'S CALLED PROPOFOL.

21 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: PROPOFOL. OKAY.

22 DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

23 DETECTIVE SMITH: SO HOW DO WE SPELL THAT,
24 DOCTOR?

25 DR. MURRAY: P-R-O-P-O-F-O-L.

1 DETECTIVE SMITH: AND WHAT IS THIS PROPOFOL?

2 DR. MURRAY: IT IS A SEDATIVE THAT COULD
3 ALSO BE USED FOR ANESTHESIA.

4 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. AND HOW IS THAT --
5 IS IT INJECTED AS WELL?

6 DR. MURRAY: IT IS BOTH GIVEN IN INTRAVENOUS
7 FORM. USUALLY MOST PATIENTS ARE GIVEN A CERTAIN
8 AMOUNT OF THE DRUG BASED UPON BODY WEIGHT, AND THEN
9 THEY CAN BE STARTED WITH AN INFUSION SLOW ENOUGH TO
10 KEEP THEM -- THE LEVELS IN THE PLASMA UP SO THAT WE
11 CAN -- THEY CAN SLEEP.

12 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. SO YOU GAVE HIM
13 THIS PROPOFOL.

14 DR. MURRAY: YES.

15 DETECTIVE SMITH: DO YOU REMEMBER ABOUT WHAT
16 TIME IT WAS NOW? THE LAST TIME I GOT WAS ABOUT
17 10:00 O'CLOCK, WHEN THERE WAS STILL NO EFFECT AND HE'S
18 COMPLAINING THAT HE'S GOING TO HAVE TO CANCEL.

19 DR. MURRAY: IT WAS -- I KNEW I LOOKED AT
20 THE TIME. I LOOKED AT THE SUN. AND IT WAS -- IT
21 WAS -- I SAW 10:30. SO I WOULD SAY ROUGHLY 10:40.

22 MR. CHERNOFF: WHY DID YOU LOOK AT THE TIME?

23 DR. MURRAY: BECAUSE I'M LOOKING AT THE TIME
24 FROM THE TIME I STARTED TREATING HIM AND ALL THAT I
25 HAVE GIVEN HIM TO THIS POINT, WAITING FOR THE EFFECT

1 AND EVERYTHING ELSE, AND I'M NOT SEEING ANY EFFECT.
2 AND I LOOKED AT THE TIME, BECAUSE I ALSO KNOW THAT IF
3 HIS DAY IS TO BE PRODUCTIVE, HE ALSO HAS TO GET UP BY
4 A CERTAIN TIME.

5 AND IF HE -- IF -- AND AS HE AND I SPOKE
6 OPENLY AND HE WAS -- AND THERE'S NO SEDATIVE EFFECT
7 FROM THE ONE THAT HE RECEIVED SO FAR, I SAID, "IF YOU
8 GOT PROPOFOL NOW," WHICH, OF COURSE, HE REFERRED TO AS
9 THE MILK, "HOW MUCH TIME -- HOW MUCH SLEEP YOU EXPECT
10 TO HAVE? YOU KNOW, YOU GOING TO BE NEEDED TO BE UP NO
11 LATER THAN NOON." AND HE SAID, "JUST MAKE ME SLEEP.
12 DOESN'T MATTER WHAT TIME I GET UP."

13 I SAID, "WHAT WILL HAPPEN TO YOU? YOUR
14 REHEARSAL IS ALREADY SCHEDULED FOR TODAY." HE SAID,
15 "I CAN'T FUNCTION IF I DON'T SLEEP. THEY'LL HAVE TO
16 CANCEL IT. AND I DON'T WANT THEM TO CANCEL IT, BUT
17 THEY WILL HAVE TO CANCEL IT." SO I -- I AGREED AT
18 THAT TIME THAT I WOULD SWITCH THE -- OVER TO THE
19 PROPOFOL.

20 DETECTIVE SMITH: THIS IS THE FIRST TIME NOW
21 THAT YOU'RE USING THIS.

22 DR. MURRAY: FIRST TIME, YES.

23 DETECTIVE SMITH: ' OKAY.

24 DR. MURRAY: AND I WOULD GIVE HIM A SMALL
25 AMOUNT THAT WOULD HELP HIM TO SLEEP AND THEN SEE IF

1 THE EFFECT WOULD BE THERE.

2 DETECTIVE SMITH: HOW MUCH DID YOU
3 ADMINISTER INITIALLY?

4 DR. MURRAY: 25 MILLIGRAMS.

5 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. AND AGAIN, THIS WAS
6 APPROXIMATELY 10:40 NOW, GIVE OR TAKE?

7 DR. MURRAY: WELL, BY 10:40, WE -- WE HAVE
8 DISCUSSED THAT NOTHING IS HAPPENING. SO BY THE TIME I
9 WITHDRAW IT FROM THE BOTTLE, GET IT DILUTED -- I HAD
10 TO DILUTE IT, AND USUALLY I DILUTE IT WITH LIDOCAINE,
11 L-I-D-O-C-A-I-N-E, BECAUSE IT COULD BE VERY -- IT
12 BURNS THE VESSELS. IN THE SENSE OF THE SIDE EFFECT,
13 IT CAUSES IT TO BURN.

14 DETECTIVE SMITH: AND I'M SORRY. YOU GAVE
15 HIM HOW MUCH NOW?

16 DR. MURRAY: 25 MILLIGRAMS.

17 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. AND ALWAYS THE SAME
18 WAY.

19 DR. MURRAY: YES.

20 DETECTIVE SMITH: REGARDLESS OF WHAT YOU
21 WERE GIVING HIM, WAS INTO THE --

22 DR. MURRAY: YES, I PUSHED IT.

23 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

24 DR. MURRAY: UH-HUH.

25 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. AND I'M SORRY. I

1 INTERRUPTED YOU, BUT WE WERE GETTING TOWARDS THE TIME
2 AT 10:40, YOU REALIZED THAT NOTHING WAS HAPPENING, AND
3 SO BY THE TIME YOU GOT YOUR THINGS TOGETHER AND YOU
4 PUSHED IT, IT WAS --

5 DR. MURRAY: IT WOULDN'T TAKE A LONG TIME
6 FOR ME TO JUST WITHDRAW FROM A VIAL AND DILUTE IT WITH
7 THE LIDOCAINE, WHICH IS A LOCAL ANESTHETIC AGENT THAT,
8 YOU KNOW, ALSO IS A SODIUM BLOCKER TO MAKE HIM NOT
9 FEEL THE BURNING SENSATION OF THE SLOW INJECTION. SO
10 I HAD A TOTAL OF MEDICATION MIXED WITH THE LIDOCAINE,
11 AND I ADMINISTERED IT.

12 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. DOES THAT TAKE
13 YOU ABOUT AN EXTRA 5 MINUTES OR 10 MINUTES?

14 DR. MURRAY: SLOWLY INFUSED. SLOWLY INFUSED
15 OVER, I WOULD SAY, 3 TO 5 MINUTES.

16 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: 3 TO 5?

17 DR. MURRAY: YEAH, BECAUSE THE EFFECT IS
18 GONE VERY QUICKLY.

19 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: SO WE'RE LOOKING LIKE
20 AT 10:50ISH.

21 DR. MURRAY: YES. YEAH, THE EFFECT IS GONE
22 VERY QUICKLY. SO THE EFFECT WAS ONLY LAST -- ONLY
23 LASTS ABOUT 15 MINUTES.

24 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. SO NOW WE'RE AT
25 ROUGHLY 10:50, 11:00 O'CLOCK.

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DR. MURRAY: UH-HUH.

DETECTIVE SMITH: WHAT TAKES PLACE NEXT?

DR. MURRAY: WELL, YOU KNOW, HE'S NOW ASLEEP, YOU KNOW.

DETECTIVE SMITH: HE DOES GO TO SLEEP.

DR. MURRAY: HE NOW GOES TO SLEEP.

DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: UH-HUH.

MR. CHERNOFF: WERE YOU -- WHEN YOU DID THIS, WHILE YOU WERE ADMINISTERING TO HIM, DID YOU ACTUALLY HAVE ANY PRECAUTIONS THAT YOU TOOK, MONITORING MACHINES OR ANYTHING LIKE THAT?

DR. MURRAY: YES, I TOOK ALL PRECAUTIONS THAT WAS AVAILABLE TO ME. I -- SINCE I STARTED SEEING HIM, I MADE SURE THAT THERE WAS OXYGEN AT THE BEDSIDE, THAT HE WAS PLACED ON OXYGEN EVERY NIGHT VIA NASAL CANNULA AND PULSE OXIMETER, WHICH IS A PLASTIC TUBE THAT GOES OVER THE FINGER OR THE TOE. IT'S A DEVICE. IT IS BATTERY OPERATED. THAT SHOWS ME THE OXYGEN SATURATION LEVEL AND ALSO BEAT BY BEAT DYNAMICALLY SHOWS ME THE HEART RATE FOR THE PATIENT.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YOU SAID PULSE OXIPETER?

DR. MURRAY: OXIMETER.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OXIMETER.

1 DR. MURRAY: O-X-I-M-E-T-E-R. THAT
2 REGISTERS THE AMOUNT OF OXYGEN THAT HE HAS IN HIS
3 BLOOD, AND IT ALSO HELPS ME TO LOOK AT THE HEART RATE.
4 SO THOSE THINGS ARE IN PLACE.

5 DETECTIVE SMITH: YOU WERE DOING IT THIS
6 EVENING, THROUGHOUT THE NIGHT?

7 DR. MURRAY: YES.

8 DETECTIVE SMITH: THIS PARTICULAR TIME?

9 DR. MURRAY: YEAH --

10 MR. CHERNOFF: AND YOU HAD -- HE HAD ASKED
11 FOR THIS PARTICULAR DRUG, HIS --

12 DETECTIVE SMITH: REFERRED TO AS MILK.

13 MR. CHERNOFF: -- PROPOFOL. MILK

14 DR. MURRAY: MILK.

15 MR. CHERNOFF: YEAH, LET'S JUST CALL IT
16 MILK. HE HAD ASKED FOR THIS BEFORE, AND YOU KNEW HOW
17 HE REACTED TO IT. YOU'D GIVEN IT TO HIM BEFORE.

18 DR. MURRAY: I'VE GIVEN IT TO HIM BEFORE.

19 MR. CHERNOFF: AND HE HANDLED IT FINE.

20 DR. MURRAY: HE HANDLED IT FINE.

21 DETECTIVE SMITH: THE SAME DOSE?

22 DR. MURRAY: THE DOSE AND THE DRIP. NOT THE
23 SAME DOSE IN THIS CASE, BECAUSE I HAD GIVEN HIM
24 EARLIER VERSED. I HAD GIVEN HIM THE ATIVAN AT
25 DIFFERENT TIMES DURING THE NIGHT. AND I KNOW THAT

1 THEIR HALF-LIFE IS NOT AS SHORT AS LORAZEPAM. SO I
2 TOOK A PRECAUTION, KNOWING THAT THERE WAS POSSIBLE ALL
3 OF THE MEDICATIONS STILL ON BOARD. SO THE
4 25 MILLIGRAM ORDINARILY WOULD NOT BE A DOSE I WOULD
5 GIVE HIM IF HE DID NOT HAVE THOSE OTHER AGENTS ON
6 BOARD. I WOULD GIVE HIM A HIGHER DOSE.

7 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OH, OKAY. SO IT'S A
8 LOWER DOSE THAN NORMAL.

9 DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

10 DETECTIVE SMITH: WHAT HAVE YOU -- WHAT'S
11 THE HIGHEST AMOUNT OF MILK YOU'VE GIVEN HIM IN THE
12 PAST?

13 DR. MURRAY: WELL, BASED --

14 DETECTIVE SMITH: IF THESE OTHER AGENTS
15 WEREN'T IN HIM?

16 DR. MURRAY: BASED UPON HIS WEIGHT, IT WOULD
17 BE WEIGHT BASED.

18 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: UH-HUH.

19 DR. MURRAY: AND THE HIGHEST AMOUNT I'D
20 GIVEN HIM INITIALLY, DIRECT ON THE I.V. BEFORE
21 STARTING THE DRIP ON HIM, WOULD BE TWICE THAT AMOUNT,
22 WHICH IS ABOUT 50 MILLIGRAMS.

23 DETECTIVE SMITH: SO IT WAS APPROXIMATELY
24 HALF OF WHAT YOU'D GIVEN HIM BEFORE.

25 DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

1 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

2 DR. MURRAY: BUT I HALVED THE DOSE HERE TO
3 BE CAUTIOUS, AS THERE WERE OTHER MEDICATIONS GIVEN TO
4 HIM DURING THE NIGHT, WHICH ALSO INDUCES SLEEP. AND
5 HE HAD NO -- THERE WAS NO RESPONSE OR EFFECT.

6 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: CAN YOU RECALL OFF THE
7 TOP OF YOUR HEAD APPROXIMATELY HOW MANY OTHER TIMES
8 HE'S RECEIVED THIS MILK AND HANDLED IT FINE?

9 DR. MURRAY: WELL --

10 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: I'M SORRY. THAT YOU'VE
11 GIVEN IT TO HIM, NOT THAT OTHER DOCTORS HAVE.

12 DR. MURRAY: I'VE GIVEN IT TO HIM --

13 MR. CHERNOFF: WAS IT MORE THAN TEN TIMES?

14 DR. MURRAY: YES.

15 MR. CHERNOFF: OKAY.

16 DR. MURRAY: MUCH MORE THAN TEN TIMES.

17 DETECTIVE SMITH: MORE THAN -- WELL, HOW FAR
18 BACK WE GOING NOW, TIME SPAN WISE? IT WAS IN THE LAST
19 COUPLE OF MONTHS YOU WERE CONTACTED -- RIGHT? -
20 INITIALLY --

21 DR. MURRAY: TWO MONTHS.

22 DETECTIVE SMITH: -- BY AMIR FOR THIS
23 TOUR.

24 DR. MURRAY: TWO MONTHS.

25 DETECTIVE SMITH: SO IN THE LAST COUPLE

1 MONTHS --

2 DR. MURRAY: TWO MONTHS.

3 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. YOU'VE ADMINISTERED
4 IT MORE THAN TEN TIMES.

5 DR. MURRAY: YES.

6 DETECTIVE SMITH: MORE THAN 20 TIMES?

7 DR. MURRAY: 30 DAYS A MONTH ROUGHLY, EVERY
8 DAY.

9 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: SO IT'S A DAILY --

10 DETECTIVE SMITH: A DAILY

11 DR. MURRAY: DAILY, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF
12 THREE DAYS LEADING UP TO HIS DEATH. I TRIED TO WEAN
13 HIM OFF --

14 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

15 DR. MURRAY: -- THAT MEDICATION.

16 MR. CHERNOFF: AND LET'S -- LET'S BE CLEAR.
17 LET'S MAKE SURE THAT YOU GUYS ASK THIS QUESTION, IF
18 YOU DON'T MIND.

19 DETECTIVE SMITH: SURE.

20 MR. CHERNOFF: BEFORE YOU WERE HIRED ON AS
21 HIS DOCTOR, WERE YOU AWARE THAT MICHAEL JACKSON WAS
22 TAKING THIS ON A DAILY BASIS?

23 DR. MURRAY: I WAS NOT AWARE THAT MICHAEL
24 JACKSON WAS TAKING THIS ON A DAILY BASIS, BUT I WAS A
25 BIT SURPRISED OF HIS PHARMACOLOGICAL KNOWLEDGE,

1 BECAUSE THAT IS NOT AN AGENT THAT MOST PEOPLE PULL
2 THIS OUT FROM THEIR HAT. AND HE EXPLAINED TO ME THAT
3 HE HAD TAKEN IT MULTIPLE TIMES. HE USED IT FREQUENTLY
4 ON HIS TOURS. IT WAS GIVEN TO HIM BY MULTIPLE OTHER
5 DOCTORS.

6 HE KNEW EXACTLY THAT WE HAD TO HAVE
7 ANTIBURN. ANTIBURN WAS HIS WORD FOR THE LIDOCAINE,
8 BECAUSE HE SAID WHENEVER IT WAS INJECTED -- HE CALLED
9 IT ANTIBURN, WHICH WAS THE WORD FOR LIDOCAINE, BECAUSE
10 HE SAID WHENEVER IT WAS INJECTED INTO HIM OR IT WAS
11 RUNNING INTO HIM, INFUSING, IT WOULD SET HIS LIMB OR
12 WHEREVER ON FIRE.

13 AND HE ASKED ME IF I EVER HAD IT, AND I
14 SAID, "NO." AND HE SAID, "WELL, I AM JUST LETTING YOU
15 KNOW. WITHOUT THE ANTIBURN, IT'S REALLY
16 UNCOMFORTABLE. SO MAKE SURE THAT THERE IS ALWAYS A
17 LOT OF THAT AVAILABLE." BUT HE IS SPEAKING FROM A
18 SOURCE OF EXPERIENCE. AND HE ALSO SAID THAT HE HAD
19 USED IT IN GERMANY AND SEVERAL OTHER PLACES BUT NEVER
20 REALLY TRULY DISCLOSED THE DOCTOR'S NAME.

21 DETECTIVE SMITH: AND THAT'S SOMETHING THAT
22 YOU UNDERSTOOD THAT WAS ADMINISTERED BY A DOCTOR AND
23 NOT MICHAEL HIMSELF, OR COULD IT --

24 DR. MURRAY: HE NEVER TOLD ME THAT HE
25 ADMINISTERED IT HIMSELF, BUT HE HAD SAID TO ME THAT

1 THE DOCTORS ALLOWED HIM TO INFUSE IT HIMSELF. AND I
2 REFUSED HIM THAT OPPORTUNITY. AND HE ASKED ME, "WHY
3 WOULD YOU -- WHY DON'T YOU WANT ME TO PUSH IT? I LOVE
4 TO PUSH IT. YOU KNOW, IT MAKES ME FEEL MEDICINE IS
5 GREAT." I SAID, "WELL, IF I'M GOING TO GIVE YOU AN
6 AGENT THAT IS GOING TO PUT YOU TO SLEEP IMMEDIATELY
7 AND BE SO QUICK TO ACT, I DON'T WANT YOU EVER TO
8 INFUSE SUCH A SUBSTANCE WHEN I'M PRESENT. I'LL DO
9 THAT. SO SORRY ABOUT THE OTHER DOCTORS WHO HAVE DONE
10 THIS. I WOULD NOT."

11 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. SO TO BE -- YOU
12 KNOW, I KNOW WHAT THE ANSWER TO THIS QUESTION IS, BUT
13 JUST TO -- SO I'M NOT ASSUMING. THE FIRST TIME THAT
14 MILK WAS USED ON HIM, WAS IT YOUR IDEA OR WAS IT HIS
15 IDEA?

16 DR. MURRAY: HIS. HIS.

17 MR. CHERNOFF: HE KNEW HOW MUCH TO PUT IN.
18 HE KNEW WHAT IT WAS. HE KNEW HOW TO INJECT IT. HE
19 KNEW ALL THAT.

20 DR. MURRAY: YES. AND HE ALSO -- AND HE
21 KNEW THAT THAT WAS THE ONLY THING THAT WORKED FOR HIM.
22 NOW, I CONSTANTLY CAUTIONED HIM THAT THAT IS AN
23 ARTIFICIAL WAY TO GO TO SLEEP. IT WOULD BE NICE TO
24 GET HIM BACK TO A MORE PHYSIOLOGICAL STATE. LIKE MOST
25 PEOPLE, WHEN THEY WORK AND THEY'RE TIRED, THEY FALL

1 ASLEEP.

2 AND HE ASKED ME. HE SAID, "COULD YOU SLEEP
3 LIKE THAT?" AND I SAID, "NO DOUBT ABOUT IT. YOU
4 KNOW, MOST PEOPLE COULD SLEEP. I DO UNDERSTAND THAT
5 CHILDREN HAVE A BETTER SLEEPING HABIT FOR REM SLEEP
6 THAN ADULTS. AND AS WE GROW OLDER, WE DON'T SLEEP AS
7 WELL AND AS LONG. AND SOMETIME PATIENTS NEEDED HELP,
8 SEDATIVE THAT THEY WILL USE AS NEEDED. AND THAT'S
9 OKAY." BUT I SAID TO DO THIS ON THAT FREQUENCY, I DID
10 NOT -- I TRIED TO COUNSEL HIM AWAY FROM THAT.

11 MR. CHERNOFF: DO YOU HAPPEN TO KNOW -- I'M
12 SORRY TO INTERRUPT, GUYS.

13 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: THAT'S FINE.

14 MR. CHERNOFF: DO YOU HAPPEN TO KNOW WHO HIS
15 DOCTOR WAS -- WAS ANY NAME GIVEN OF A DOCTOR BEFORE
16 YOU WERE HIRED ON?

17 DR. MURRAY: YES. MIND YOU, HE NEVER -- HE
18 TOLD ME THAT THERE WERE A COUPLE DOCTORS IN GERMANY
19 AND THEY WOULD HIGH-FIVE EACH OTHER AND DO DIFFERENT
20 THINGS BASED UPON THE SUBSTANCES THAT HE GOT. BUT
21 PRIOR TO STARTING WITH HIM IN MAY, HE CAME TO VEGAS
22 SOMETIME IN -- IT WAS IN MARCH OR APRIL, I WOULD SAY.

23 MR. CHERNOFF: DID HE -- I GUESS THE POINT
24 I'M TRYING TO MAKE IS DID HE TELL YOU -- LET'S JUST
25 GET DOWN TO THIS DR. LEE.

1 DR. MURRAY: YEAH, LET'S GET ON.

2 MR. CHERNOFF: THIS DR. LEE DEAL, WHERE YOU
3 ASKED HIM ABOUT SOME THINGS THAT WERE -- THESE MARKS
4 THAT WERE ON HIS -- ON HIS FEET ALREADY.

5 DR. MURRAY: YES, ON HIS HANDS AND SO, LOTS
6 OF I.V. SITES. AND HE HAD VEINS THAT WERE SCLEROTIC.
7 SO I ASKED HIM WHAT WAS HE GETTING. AND HE TOLD ME
8 THAT HE WAS SEEING A DR. LEE, WHO WAS GIVING HIM A
9 SPECIAL COCKTAIL FOR FLUSHING HIS BODY AND SUPPOSED TO
10 GIVE ENERGY. AND DR. LEE HAD STATED THAT SHE -- NEVER
11 MET HER -- THAT SHE WORKED WITH THE LAKERS DURING THE
12 TIMES THEY WON THE CHAMPIONSHIP, AND HER COCKTAIL WAS
13 SO GOOD FOR GIVING THE TEAM ENERGY.

14 AND I SAID, "WELL, WHAT'S IN THE COCKTAIL?"
15 HE SAID, "I DON'T KNOW," BUT HE REMEMBERED ONE NAME,
16 WHICH I THINK WAS METHIONINE. I DON'T REMEMBER, BUT I
17 KNOW IT WAS AN AMINO ACID IN THERE. AND I SAID,
18 "WELL, COULD YOU FIND FROM DR. LEE EXACTLY WHAT THE
19 COCKTAIL IS? BECAUSE I'D LIKE TO REVIEW IT. I'M NOT
20 SURE IF IT'S GOOD FOR YOU, BECAUSE I'M FINDING THAT AS
21 YOUNG AS YOU ARE, YOUR VEINS ARE ALL BEING SCLEROTIC."

22 HIS VEINS ARE BECOMING CLOTS, LIKE FILLED
23 WITH CLOTS AND DRIED UP. AND YOU CANNOT BARELY FIND
24 SITES FOR AN I.V. THAT'S WHY YOU HAVE TO SEE ME
25 LOOKING FOR SOMETHING ON HIS LEG OR SOMETHING LIKE

1 THAT. HIS HANDS ARE ALL SCLEROTIC FROM TOO MUCH USE
2 OF I.V. OVER TIME.

3 THEN HE TOLD ME THAT AFTER A WHILE -- HE
4 NEVER GOT ME THE INFORMATION, BUT HE DID TELL ME --
5 WHEN I JOINED HIM REGULARLY, I SAID, "WHAT'S THE STORY
6 WITH YOU AND DR. LEE, AND WHAT'S HAPPENING?" HE SAID,
7 "OH, WE GOT RID OF HER." I SAID, "WHAT HAPPENED?" HE
8 SAID, "WELL, SHE WAS UNPROFESSIONAL." I SAID, "WHY
9 WAS SHE UNPROFESSIONAL?" HE SAID SHE JUST CALLED ONE
10 DAY WHEN HE WAS EXPECTING HER: SHE SAID HER CHILD HAD
11 GOTTEN SICK AND SHE HAD TAKEN HIM TO THE URGENT CARE
12 AND SHE COULDN'T MAKE IT. SO SHE DIDN'T COME.

13 I SAID, "WELL, THAT'S REASONABLE. YOU KNOW,
14 YOU HAVE CHILDREN, TOO. AND THAT COULD BE REAL." BUT
15 HE FELT THAT THE DOCTOR DID NOT TELL HIM THE TRUTH.
16 SO HE WAS UPSET AND TOLD HER NOT TO COME BACK. I
17 BELIEVE SHE WAS NOT SEEN AGAIN. THAT'S DR. LEE. SO I
18 DON'T KNOW EXACTLY WHAT WAS IN HER COCKTAIL, BUT SHE
19 WAS GIVING HIM --

20 MR. CHERNOFF: OR IF THERE WAS A COCKTAIL.

21 DR. MURRAY: WHATEVER. BUT SHE'LL GIVE HIM
22 SOME I.V.

23 MR. CHERNOFF: ALL RIGHT.

24 DR. MURRAY: SEVERAL TIMES A WEEK.

25 DETECTIVE SMITH: AND WAS THIS IN

1 LAS VEGAS?

2 DR. MURRAY: NO, THIS WAS HERE LOCALLY.

3 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. SO THAT WAS WITHIN
4 THE LAST SIX MONTHS?

5 DR. MURRAY: YES. NOW, THE REASON I MENTION
6 THAT IS BECAUSE I WANTED TO GIVE YOU ANOTHER NAME OF
7 DR. ADAMS, BECAUSE YOU ASKED ABOUT THE MILK.

8 MR. CHERNOFF: OH, THAT'S RIGHT.

9 DR. MURRAY: DOCTOR --

10 MR. CHERNOFF: HE MENTIONED THAT MICHAEL
11 MENTIONED A DR. ADAMS THAT ACTUALLY WAS IN VEGAS;
12 RIGHT?

13 DR. MURRAY: YEAH, YEAH. DAVID ADAMS.

14 MR. CHERNOFF: OKAY.

15 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. AND WHAT ABOUT DR.
16 ADAMS?

17 DR. MURRAY: I NEVER KNEW MICHAEL JACKSON
18 WAS COMING TO TOWN. AND AGAIN, NOT KNOWING THAT, I
19 DON'T KEEP A RECORD OF HIS TIME, BUT IT WAS SOMETIME
20 BETWEEN MARCH AND APRIL. AND HE CALLED ME. AND I
21 SAID, "HI. HOW YOU DOING, MICHAEL? WHERE ARE YOU?"
22 AND HE SAYS, "OH, I'M IN VEGAS."

23 "REALLY? WHY HERE?"

24 "I BROUGHT MY CHILDREN TO SEE A SHOW."

25 I SAID, "WOW. WELL, THAT'S NICE." I CAN'T

1 REMEMBER WHAT SHOW HE WAS SEEING. AND I SAID, "WHEN
2 ARE YOU LEAVING?" HE SAYS, "I'M LEAVING TOMORROW."
3 SO HE WAS JUST HERE FOR ONE NIGHT. HE STAYED AT THE
4 WYNN HOTEL. AND THEN AFTER SPEAKING WITH HIM, I HUNG
5 UP.

6 THEN I GOT ANOTHER CALL FROM HIS ASSISTANT,
7 MICHAEL AMIR. AND HE SAID MR. JACKSON WANTS TO SPEAK
8 TO ME AGAIN. SO I SPOKE WITH HIM. AND THEN HE ASKED
9 ME. HE SAYS "I'M HAVING DIFFICULTY SLEEPING. I CAN'T
10 SLEEP." BUT I SAID, "WELL, YOU'RE HERE JUST FOR A
11 NIGHT, A SHOW AND FILM. WHY YOU HAVING DIFFICULTY
12 SLEEPING? CAN'T YOU JUST SLEEP? YOU HAD A LONG TRIP
13 ON THE ROAD FROM L.A. TO LAS VEGAS. YOU KNOW, IF YOU
14 GO TO BED" -- I SAID, "ARE YOU GOING OUT TONIGHT AND
15 DOING ANYTHING?" HE SAID, "NO, I'M STAYING INSIDE.
16 BUT I JUST CAN'T SLEEP."

17 HE SAID, "COULD YOU HELP ME TO SLEEP?" I
18 SAID, "WELL, DON'T YOU HAVE ANY SLEEPING PILL THAT I
19 GAVE YOU IN THE PAST THAT YOU CAN USE AS NEEDED?"
20 LIKE -- LIKE LORAZEPAM OR RESTORIL, WHICH I HAD GIVEN
21 TO HIM BEFORE, PILL FORM. HE SAID, "THEY DON'T WORK."
22 I SAID, "DID YOU TRY THEM?" HE SAID, "YES,
23 DR. CONRAD. NOTHING WORKS. YOU KNOW, I'VE HAD PILLS
24 FROM THE OTHER DOCTORS IN BEVERLY HILLS, AND I'VE HAD
25 MEDICINE FROM DR. KLEIN, WHO SAYS HE GAVE ME THE

1 STRONGEST MEDICATION. AND I HAVE MEDICINE FROM
2 DR. METZER, M-E-T-Z-E-R. THEY ALL DON'T WORK."

3 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: DR. KLEIN, DR. METZER.
4 WAS THERE ANOTHER ONE?

5 DR. MURRAY: THOSE ARE THE NAMES THAT HE HAD
6 MENTIONED. I SAID, "I DON'T HAVE ANYTHING I CAN OFFER
7 YOU THAT WOULD WORK." HE SAID, "WELL, WHAT ABOUT
8 DIPRIVAN?" WHICH IS ANOTHER NAME FOR -- WHICH IS THE -

9 MR. CHERNOFF: BRAND NAME FOR PROPOFOL.

10 DR. MURRAY: WHICH IS THE OTHER NAME --

11 DETECTIVE SMITH: FOR WHAT?

12 DR. MURRAY: DIPRIVAN, D-I-P-R-I-V-A-N,
13 WHICH IS THE OTHER NAME FOR PROPOFOL.

14 DETECTIVE SMITH: OH.

15 DR. MURRAY: WHICH IS THE MILK.

16 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

17 MR. CHERNOFF: OH, YEAH, THE MILK.

18 DR. MURRAY: SO HE ASKED ME, "WHAT ABOUT
19 DIPRIVAN?" I SAID, "DIPRIVAN? WHY YOU ASK THAT?" HE
20 SAID, "WELL, IT WORKS. I KNOW IT WORKS." I SAID,
21 "WELL, THAT'S NOT A MEDICINE YOU CAN JUST CALL AND
22 READILY PUT YOUR HANDS ON. YOU KNOW, IT'S A MEDICINE
23 THAT YOU'LL HAVE TO ORDER. AND I DON'T KNOW ANYWAY
24 HOW I CAN GET THAT TO YOU."

25 SO HE SAID -- SO YOU CAN TELL HE GOT

1 RESTLESS. AND FRUSTRATION CAME UPON HIM BECAUSE I
2 COULDN'T SATISFY HIM. AND THEN HE SAID, "DO YOU KNOW
3 THIS DR. ADAMS? WHAT'S HIS NAME AGAIN? DR. ADAMS?
4 CAN'T REMEMBER HIS FIRST NAME." HE SAID, "HE'S A
5 BLACK DOCTOR. HE IS ABOUT YOUR HEIGHT. LOOKS LIKE A
6 FOOTBALL PLAYER. HE HAS MORE WEIGHT THAN YOU. AND
7 YOU KNOW, HE GAVE IT TO ME BEFORE IN LAS VEGAS SEVERAL
8 TIMES. AND YOU KNOW, HE WALKS WITH HIS LITTLE BAG."
9 THAT'S WHAT HE SAID.

10 DETECTIVE SMITH: DR. ADAMS GAVE HIM THE
11 MILK BEFORE?

12 DR. MURRAY: YEAH. DAVID ADAMS.

13 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. I'M SORRY.

14 DR. MURRAY: YEAH. SO I SAID, "WELL, I
15 CAN'T HELP YOU, BECAUSE I DON'T HAVE ACCESS TO SUCH
16 PRODUCTS. AND THOSE HAS -- THOSE HAVE TO BE ORDERED,
17 AND THIS IS THE WEEKEND, A SUNDAY." SO HE SAID, "YOU
18 DON'T KNOW HIM?" I SAID, "NO."

19 "DO YOU HAVE HIS NUMBER?"

20 I SAID, "I DON'T KNOW HIM. SO I DON'T HAVE
21 A NUMBER." HE SAID, "WELL, I THINK I CAN CALL BROTHER
22 MICHAEL," WHICH IS MR. AMIR. HE SAID, "LET ME CALL
23 HIM BECAUSE HE HAS THE NUMBER. SO I'LL CALL YOU
24 BACK."

25 SO WITHIN FIVE MINUTES TO TEN MINUTES, I GOT

1 ANOTHER CALL BACK FROM MR. JACKSON HIMSELF. AND HE
2 SAID, "THIS IS THE NUMBER, AND THIS IS HIS NAME,
3 MR. ADAMS. COULD YOU ASK HIM IF HE CAN HELP ME TO
4 SLEEP? IF YOU CAN FIND HIM, AS A DOCTOR TO A DOCTOR,
5 COULD YOU CALL HIM?" SO I MADE THAT CALL. IT WAS
6 ABOUT -- THIS IS SUNDAY, THE DAY HE'S SUPPOSED TO BE
7 GOING BACK TO LOS ANGELES. AND THIS IS LIKE
8 2:00 O'CLOCK IN THE DAY. AND I THOUGHT HE'D BE ON THE
9 ROAD BY NOW.

10 HE SAID MR. ADAMS -- HE SAID, "HE HELPED ME
11 BEFORE. HE WOULD TAKE ME TO THIS PLASTIC SURGEON'S
12 OFFICE. AND HE WILL COME THERE WITH HIS BAG, AND HE
13 ALWAYS HAD IT, AND HE WOULD START IT," AND HE WOULD
14 GET SLEEP. I SAID, "WHAT IS THE SURGEON'S NAME?" HE
15 MENTIONED THE NAME, BUT I DON'T KNOW THE SURGEON
16 EITHER. SO HE SAID HE IS GOING TO MAKE A CALL TO THE
17 SURGEON TO SEE IF DR. ADAMS IS AVAILABLE, IF HE COULD
18 COME THERE TO HELP HIM. HE WOULD GO ANYWHERE WHERE IT
19 WAS NECESSARY.

20 SO I SAID, "OKAY. GO MAKE YOUR CALL." AND
21 THE CALL IS MADE, AND WHAT I WAS TOLD BY MR. JACKSON
22 IS THAT MICHAEL AMIR SAID THE SURGEON -- OR THE
23 COSMETOLOGIST, I THINK HE IS, SAID THAT TODAY HE
24 WASN'T GOING TO LET THEM USE HIS OFFICE UNLESS
25 MR. JACKSON AGREED TO HAVE SOME OTHER COSMETOLOGICAL --

1 COSMETOLOGICAL PROCEDURE.

2 MR. CHERNOFF: (UNINTELLIGIBLE.)

3 DR. MURRAY: YEAH, WHICH, OF COURSE, HE
4 WOULD BE ABLE TO GET PAID FOR FOR USING HIS PREMISES,
5 AND AT THE SAME TIME HE COULD BE ASLEEP WHILE HE IS
6 DOING HIS THING. SO I TOLD HIM THE DOCTOR SAID IF HE
7 WASN'T GOING TO MAKE ANY MONEY FOR A PROCEDURE, THEN
8 HE WASN'T GOING TO HAVE IT DONE.

9 I DID CALL DR. ADAMS, DAVID ADAMS. I TOLD
10 HIM THAT I HAD NEVER MET HIM. MR. JACKSON SAID THAT
11 HE HAD WORKED WITH HIM BEFORE, THAT HE HAD GIVEN HIM
12 DIPRIVAN TO SLEEP, AND HE WANTED TO KNOW IF HE WAS
13 AVAILABLE TO HELP. DR. ADAMS SAID TO ME, "GIVE HIM
14 ONE HOUR, AND HE'LL CALL ME BACK."

15 I CALLED MR. JACKSON. I SAID, "I SPOKE TO
16 MR. ADAMS, DR. ADAMS. HE TOLD ME THAT HE MAY HAVE
17 ENOUGH OF THE PRODUCT THAT YOU WANT." HE'S QUITE
18 FAMILIAR WITH HIM, BECAUSE DR. ADAMS SAID TO ME, "OH,
19 YEAH, I KNOW MICHAEL. I KNOW MICHAEL VERY WELL. HE
20 ALWAYS -- HE DOES WELL ON DIPRIVAN. HE LOVES THAT
21 DRUG."

22 DETECTIVE SMITH: MILK.

23 DR. MURRAY: MILK. HE DID NOT CALL IT MILK.
24 HE JUST SAID, "HE LOVES THAT DRUG." MILK WAS ADOPTED
25 LATER ON. WHEN I STARTED TO WORK WITH HIM, I GUESS,

1 HE STARTED TO CALL IT MILK AND ANTIBURN.

2 SO MR. ADAMS CANNOT GET THE COSMETOLOGIST TO
3 OPEN HIS PRACTICE. SO I ALLOWED HIM ON A SUNDAY TO
4 USE MY OFFICE, WHERE I HAD OXYGEN, A CRASH CART, AND
5 MONITORING DEVICES LIKE THE OXIMETER, TO USE MY OFFICE
6 TO TREAT MR. JACKSON. AFTER MR. JACKSON GOT THERE,
7 MR. ADAMS, DR. ADAMS WAS WAITING. I BROUGHT HIM
8 UPSTAIRS. I INTRODUCED MYSELF. AND I LEFT THEM.

9 I SAID, "HOW LONG ARE YOU GOING TO LET HIM
10 SLEEP?" HE TOLD ME HE WAS GOING TO DO FIVE OR SIX
11 HOURS. THIS WAS ABOUT 1:00 O'CLOCK IN THE DAY. SO I
12 SAID, "OKAY. SO I'LL COME BACK AROUND 7:00?" AND HE
13 SAID, "YEAH, 7:00 WILL BE GOOD." AND I CAME BACK AT
14 7:00 O'CLOCK. WHEN I CAME BACK TO MY OFFICE AT
15 7:00 O'CLOCK, HE HAD HIS DIPRIVAN DRIP GOING. THERE
16 WAS A PULSE OXIMETER THERE. I HAD SUPPLIED OXYGEN FOR
17 HIS USE DURING THE PROCEDURE. I'M NOT SURE IF IT WAS
18 USED OR NOT. BUT DR. ADAMS DID HAVE AN I.V. BAG THAT
19 WAS DILUTED WITH THE AGENT. AND HE WAS -- MR. JACKSON
20 SLEPT.

21 WHEN MR. JACKSON WOKE UP, OF COURSE, I BEING
22 HIS INTERMITTENT GENERAL PHYSICIAN, I ASKED HIM HOW HE
23 FELT. AND HE SAID HE NOW FELT WONDERFUL BECAUSE HE
24 WAS ABLE TO GET TO SLEEP. I SAID, "ARE YOU GOING TO
25 LEAVE FOR LOS ANGELES TONIGHT?" HE SAID HE WASN'T

1 SURE IF HE WAS GOING THAT NIGHT OR THE FOLLOWING DAY.

2 HE THEN SURPRISED ME THAT SAME EVENING,
3 BECAUSE BY THEN HE HAD ALREADY MADE THE PROPOSAL TO ME
4 JOINING HIS TEAM AND GOING TO ENGLAND.

5 DETECTIVE SMITH: HE'S STILL IN VEGAS NOW.

6 DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

7 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

8 DR. MURRAY: BUT HE HAD ALREADY PROPOSED TO
9 ME JOINING HIS TEAM AND GOING TO ENGLAND AS HIS
10 EXCLUSIVE MEDICAL DOCTOR. HE THEN SURPRISED ME AND
11 SAID -- HIS WORDS WERE "THIS IS DIVINE GUIDANCE." AND
12 I SAID, "WHAT DO YOU MEAN?" HE SAID, "COME, COME.
13 COME WITH ME. YOU MIND?" SO WE LEFT THE DOCTOR IN
14 ONE ROOM. HE SAID -- I SAID, "EXCUSE ME, DOCTOR."
15 AND MR. JACKSON PULLED ME DOWN THE HALL,
16 INTO MY OFFICE ON THIS SUNDAY AFTERNOON -- SUNDAY
17 EVENING. HE SAID, "CONRAD, YOU KNOW, WHEN I'M ON THIS
18 COURSE, WHEN I'M ON -- ON THE TOUR, I HAVE DIFFICULTY
19 SLEEPING. AND WHAT MOST DOCTORS HAVE DONE FOR ME,
20 THEY HELP ME TO SLEEP FOR 15 TO 18 HOURS, BECAUSE I
21 NEED IT." SO INNOCENTLY, I WASN'T THINKING THAT HE
22 WAS SLEEPING 15 TO 18 HOURS WITH ASSISTANCE. I WASN'T
23 THINKING THAT IT WAS A REGULAR EVERYDAY BASIS.

24 BUT WHAT HE SAW, AS I LOOK RETROSPECT, IS
25 THAT WHAT DEVELOPED QUICKLY WITHIN THAT EVENING,

1 HIS -- WHAT HE CALLED THE DIVINE GUIDANCE WAS TO
2 INTRODUCE TO ME, EVEN BEFORE I AGREED TO GO ON HIS
3 TEAM, "HOW ABOUT IF YOU HAVE ANOTHER DOCTOR JOIN YOU?"
4 AND I SAID, "WHY WOULD YOU WANT THAT?" HE SAID,
5 "BECAUSE YOU DON'T QUITE KNOW OR UNDERSTAND THAT THESE
6 HOURS ARE LONG. YOU KNOW, WHEN I SLEEP FOR 15 TO
7 18 HOURS, THAT'S WHEN I FEEL GOOD ENOUGH TO GET UP TO
8 PERFORM. AND THAT'S WHAT MOST OF THE DOCTORS HAVE
9 DONE FOR ME. AND I THINK ON YOU, IT MAY BE TOO MUCH."

10 I DIDN'T SEE IT AS BEING TOO MUCH. BUT WHAT
11 MR. JACKSON KNEW IS THAT THIS IS SOMETHING THAT HE DID
12 EVERY DAY. AND BY HIM HAVING THAT EVERY DAY, IT WOULD
13 CERTAINLY BE TOO MUCH FOR ONE DOCTOR. AND I WAS
14 CAUGHT SITTING THERE, IN THE SENSE THAT I SAID, "YOU
15 KNOW, I COULDN'T MAKE A DECISION FOR YOU, MR. JACKSON.
16 YOU WILL HAVE TO KNOW BEST WHAT YOU THINK."

17 AND SO I SAT THERE WITH DR. ADAMS, AND I --
18 I INTRODUCED MYSELF BETTER, AND I GOT TO KNOW HIM.
19 AND I SAID, "YOU KNOW, WELL, I'VE TAKEN CARE OF
20 MICHAEL INTERMITTENTLY, AND HIS CHILDREN. AND IF
21 THERE'S A NEED FOR A DOCTOR, A SPECIALIST, THEN I
22 USUALLY SCREEN THEM AND SUPPLY WHAT HE WANTS. BUT YOU
23 KNOW, HE'S ASKING TO HAVE TWO DOCTORS ON HIS TEAM NOW,
24 AND I'M NOT SURE WHETHER OR NOT HE COULD AFFORD THAT."
25 I DID NOT KNOW.

1 DETECTIVE SMITH: WAS HE MAKING REFERENCE TO
2 DR. ADAMS?

3 DR. MURRAY: JOINING THE TEAM?

4 DETECTIVE SMITH: JOINING THE TEAM?

5 DR. MURRAY: UH-HUH.

6 DETECTIVE SMITH: DID HE SAY DR. ADAMS --

7 DR. MURRAY: HE WAS --

8 DETECTIVE SMITH: -- OR DID YOU INFER?

9 DR. MURRAY: NO, HE'S SITTING RIGHT THERE.

10 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

11 DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

12 DETECTIVE SMITH: SO HE WAS GOING TO BE THE
13 SECOND DOCTOR ON THE TEAM.

14 DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

15 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

16 DR. MURRAY: AND I WAS SURPRISED THAT HE WAS
17 BRINGING THAT UP ONLY WITHOUT ANY WARNING. SO I SAID,
18 "WHATEVER YOU WANT." BUT HE WAS FAMILIAR WORKING WITH
19 DR. ADAMS BEFORE AND GETTING THAT SUBSTANCE AS ONE OF
20 HIS TREATING PHYSICIANS FOR DIPRIVAN. AND THAT'S WHAT
21 HAPPENED.

22 SO I SAID -- I SAID, "WHATEVER HE WANTED."
23 AND SO DR. ADAMS CONTINUED TO CALL ME, AND HE LEFT
24 WORD FOR MR. JACKSON, "WHO SHOULD I CONTACT IN CASE I
25 WANT TO GO TO ENGLAND? SHOULD I GO TO YOU, OR SHOULD

1 I GO TO MICHAEL?" I SAID, "IT'S UP TO MICHAEL." NOW,
2 MICHAEL SAY, "WELL, TALK TO CONRAD. LET HIM KNOW WHAT
3 YOU WANT, AND THEN WE WILL WORK IT OUT."

4 WELL, AT THAT TIME, EVEN THOUGH I SORT OF
5 SOMEWHAT AGREED TO GO ON THE TEAM, WE WERE NOT IN
6 CONTRACT. WE HAD NOT LOCKED INTO NUMBERS. I KNOW I
7 HAD MY PRACTICES. I MEAN HOW DO I CLOSE THAT DOWN TO
8 MAKE SENSE TO GO ON A TRIP LIKE THIS WITH THE
9 GENTLEMAN? AND DR. ADAMS DID CALL ME BACK, AND THEN
10 HE SAID THAT HE HAD SPOKEN TO HIS MOTHER. HE HAD
11 CALLED HER. HE HAD SPOKEN TO A FRIEND. AND HE WAS
12 SINGLE AND AVAILABLE AND IS ON BOARD, JUST CALL.

13 SO I SAID, "WHAT KIND OF INCOME ARE YOU
14 GOING TO LOOK FOR?" HE SAID --

15 MR. CHERNOFF: IS THIS IMPORTANT TO YOU
16 GUYS?

17 DETECTIVE SMITH: YOU'RE -- AND WHEN YOU'RE
18 SAYING "WHAT KIND OF INCOME ARE YOU GOING TO LOOK
19 FOR," ARE YOU TALKING TO DR. ADAMS OR MICHAEL?

20 DR. MURRAY: YEAH, DR. ADAMS. IS THAT
21 IMPORTANT TO YOU?

22 DETECTIVE SMITH: YEAH, THAT'S FINE. YEAH,
23 THAT'S FINE.

24 DR. MURRAY: ARE YOU SURE?

25 MR. CHERNOFF: HE'S COMPLETELY SKIPPED THE

1 MOST IMPORTANT PART.

2 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: WE'LL GET BACK TO IT.

3 DETECTIVE SMITH: I KNOW. WE'LL GET BACK TO
4 IT, AND THAT'S FINE. THAT'S FINE.

5 MR. CHERNOFF: OKAY.

6 DR. MURRAY: I DON'T WANT TO WASTE TIME.

7 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OH, NO, NO, THAT'S --
8 WE'LL FINISH THIS SUBJECT.

9 DETECTIVE SMITH: QUITE ALL RIGHT.

10 DR. MURRAY: MR. ADAMS, DR. ADAMS SAID THAT
11 HE HAD MADE ABOUT \$600,000 IN HIS PREVIOUS YEAR
12 WORKING IN VEGAS WITH A MINIMUM STAFF. THE OVERHEAD
13 WAS SMALL. AND HE TOOK HOME ABOUT HALF A MILLION.
14 AND -- BUT IF HE HAD TO MAKE THE TRIP OR CHANGE AND
15 GIVE UP HIS PRACTICE, HE WANTED TO HAVE A COMMITMENT
16 FOR MAYBE THREE YEARS WITH MR. JACKSON, AND HE WOULD
17 LIKE TO HAVE ABOUT A MILLION TWO OR MILLION THREE.
18 THAT WAS HIS REQUEST. I TOLD THAT TO MICHAEL. AND
19 THERE WAS NO SUBSEQUENT FOLLOW-UP ON THAT.

20 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: SO HE DIDN'T END UP
21 JOINING THE TEAM.

22 DR. MURRAY: NO, BUT HE SAID WAS AVAILABLE.
23 HE KEPT ASKING. HE KEPT TEXTING ME, "HOW ARE THINGS
24 GOING?" AND I JUST SAID, "YOU KNOW, THINGS ARE
25 STILL" --

1 DETECTIVE SMITH: FOR A MILLION TWO OR A
2 MILLION THREE.

3 DR. MURRAY: UH-HUH.

4 MR. CHERNOFF: JUST FOR THE TRIP?

5 DETECTIVE SMITH: JUST FOR THE TOUR,
6 EXACTLY.

7 DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

8 MR. CHERNOFF: HOW LONG WAS THE TOUR FOR?

9 DR. MURRAY: THE TOUR IN ENGLAND WAS GOING
10 TO BE A YEAR, BUT MR. JACKSON HAD SAID THAT FOLLOWING
11 THE TOUR, THERE WERE THREE OR FOUR MOVIES ALREADY
12 PROGRAMMED WITH A.E.G. TO DEVELOP, FOR WHICH HE WANTED
13 ME TO STILL BE AROUND. HE WANTED ME TO BE AROUND
14 FOREVER. THAT'S WHAT HE SAID.

15 (TELEPHONE INTERRUPTION.)

16 DETECTIVE SMITH: EXCUSE ME.

17 DR. MURRAY: HE WANTED ME TO BE AROUND
18 FOREVER.

19 MR. CHERNOFF: SCOTT, I KIND OF -- I TOOK
20 YOU FOR (UNINTELLIGIBLE).

21 DETECTIVE SMITH: I'M SORRY THERE. YEAH.

22 DR. MURRAY: HE WANTED ME TO BE AROUND --

23 DETECTIVE SMITH: I PUT THE VIBRATING THING,
24 AND THEN I COULDN'T FEEL IT AFTER A WHILE. SO THEN
25 I'D HEAR IT.

1 DR. MURRAY: YEAH, HE WANTED ME TO BE AROUND
2 FOREVER. AND HE WANTED TO OPEN A CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL,
3 WHERE KIDS FROM ALL OVER THE WORLD CAN COME AND GET
4 TREATMENT. AND HE WANTED ME TO BE THE MEDICAL
5 DIRECTOR, NOT PARTICULARLY TO SEE THEM BUT TO HELP TO
6 HIRE THE SPECIALISTS SO I'LL HAVE THE DIFFERENT
7 DEPARTMENTS RUNNING. AND THOSE WERE PEOPLE THAT HE
8 HAD IN MIND FOR DOWN THE ROAD. SO THAT'S -- THAT'S
9 IT.

10 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. WE'RE GOING TO
11 GET BACK ON TRACK. WE'RE AT ABOUT 10:50 HOURS.

12 DR. MURRAY: UH-HUH.

13 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: WHERE YOU GIVE HIM THE
14 PROPOFOL. WE'VE GONE INTO THE HISTORY OF HOW HE
15 ALREADY KNEW ABOUT IT. HE'S THE ONE WHO REQUESTED
16 YOU --

17 DR. MURRAY: YES.

18 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: -- FOR IT, GIVING YOU
19 SOME PRESSURE.

20 MR. CHERNOFF: WE GOT THE MILLIGRAMS, 25.

21 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: 25 MILLIGRAMS, HALF OF
22 WHAT YOU NORMALLY GIVE. NOW, WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

23 DR. MURRAY: I AM -- I'M MONITORING HIM AT
24 THE HOUSE. AND HE FELL ASLEEP.

25 DETECTIVE SMITH: 11:00 O'CLOCK NOW? LATER?

1 DR. MURRAY: HE FELL ASLEEP FAIRLY QUICKLY,
2 I WOULD SAY. BUT HE WAS NOT SNORING. NORMALLY, IF
3 HE'S IN DEEP SLEEP, HE WOULD BE SNORING. I WAS A
4 LITTLE BIT HESITANT THAT HE WOULD PROBABLY JUMP OUT OF
5 SLEEP, BECAUSE THAT IS -- HE DOES. HE JUST (SNAPS)
6 GETS UP LIKE THAT, AND HIS EYES GOES, AND HE'S WIDE
7 AWAKE. AND WHENEVER HE'S UP, HE REACHES FOR HIS I.V.
8 SITE.

9 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: REAL QUICK ASIDE,
10 BECAUSE I'M NOT FAMILIAR. IS THIS SOMETHING THAT HAS
11 TO BE CONTINUALLY INTRODUCED INTO HIM AS A DRIP, OR IS
12 THIS SOMETHING THAT YOU JUST DO A SMALL INJECTION AND
13 THEN --

14 DR. MURRAY: YOU DO A SMALL INJECTION TO
15 HELP HIM TO SLEEP, AND THEN YOU TRY TO DRIP SLOWLY.

16 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

17 DR. MURRAY: SO THAT HE CONTINUES TO SLEEP.

18 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

19 MR. CHERNOFF: IT'S LIKE ANESTHETIC. IT'S
20 LIKE A GENERAL ANESTHETIC. IN FACT, IT'S USED FOR
21 THAT, PRIMARILY BEFORE IT -- BEFORE THE GAS GOES DOWN,
22 A LOT OF TIMES THEY'LL HAVE THAT DRIP. THAT'S WHAT
23 HE'S BEEN SLEEPING ON FOR YEARS.

24 DR. MURRAY: BUT THERE'S ALSO -- USED
25 IN PATIENTS WHO, YOU KNOW, ARE VERY ILL AND THEY NEED

1 TO KEEP THEM COMPLETELY SEDATED. YOU KNOW, IT'S BEING
2 USED.

3 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. SORRY. DIDN'T
4 MEAN TO INTERRUPT. SO HE FELL ASLEEP QUICKLY, BUT HE
5 WASN'T SNORING. SO HE'S NOT IN A DEEP SLEEP.

6 DR. MURRAY: I WAS WORRIED ABOUT THAT,
7 BECAUSE WHEN HE IS NOT DEEP, THEN HE COULD JUST
8 QUICKLY WAKE UP. BUT I WAS -- I'M MONITORING HIM. I
9 STAYED THERE AND WATCHED. I MONITORED, SAW HIS OXYGEN
10 SATURATION. IT WAS IN THE HIGH 90'S, 90 PERCENT.
11 HEART RATE WAS ROUGHLY IN THE 70'S. EVERYTHING LOOKED
12 STABLE.

13 I MONITORED HIM. I SAT THERE AND WATCH HIM
14 FOR LONG ENOUGH PERIOD THAT I FELT COMFORTABLE. THEN
15 I NEEDED TO GO TO THE BATHROOM. SO I GOT UP, WENT TO
16 THE BATHROOM TO RELEASE MYSELF OF URINE AND ALSO
17 CONSIDER GETTING RID OF SOME OF HIS URINATION THAT HE
18 HAD PUT IN THE JUGS OVERNIGHT.

19 THEN I CAME BACK TO HIS BEDSIDE AND WAS
20 STUNNED IN THE SENSE THAT HE WASN'T BREATHING, BECAUSE
21 I ALWAYS WANT TO LOOK AT HIS CHEST AND LOOK AT HIS
22 DIAPHRAGMATIC MOTION AND ALL OF THOSE THINGS. I
23 CHECKED -- I LOOKED AT THE PULSE OXIMETER RIGHT AWAY,
24 AND HIS HEART RATE WAS LIKE 122 BEATS.

25 MR. CHERNOFF: THAT'S WHAT --

1 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: LET'S -- TO GO BACK, I
2 KNOW IT'S A HUGE HOUSE. I DON'T KNOW WHERE THE
3 BATHROOM WAS. ABOUT HOW LONG WOULD THAT TAKE TO GO TO
4 THE RESTROOM?

5 DR. MURRAY: WELL, BASED UPON THE ROOM THAT
6 HE HAS, I GO THROUGH -- I LEAVE HIS BEDSIDE. I WALK
7 THROUGH ANOTHER CHAMBER, WHICH IS LIKE A DRESSING
8 AREA. AND THEN I GET INTO THE THIRD VAULT, WHICH IS
9 WHERE THE BATHROOMS ARE AND THE -- AND WHERE I CAN
10 URINATE.

11 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. SO COUPLE
12 MINUTES THAT YOU WERE GONE?

13 DR. MURRAY: I WAS GONE, I WOULD SAY, ABOUT
14 TWO MINUTES.

15 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: ABOUT TWO MINUTES.
16 OKAY.

17 DR. MURRAY: UH-HUH.

18 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: ALL RIGHT. SO YOU HAD
19 THE IMPRESSION HE WASN'T BREATHING, AND YOU SAID HIS
20 PULSE WAS HIGH?

21 DR. MURRAY: WHEN I CAME BACK, YEAH.

22 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: GO ON.

23 DR. MURRAY: BEDSIDE AND MY CLINICAL
24 OBSERVATION. SO IMMEDIATELY I FELT FOR A PULSE, AND I
25 WAS ABLE TO GET A TREADY PULSE IN THE FEMORAL REGION.

1 HIS BODY WAS WARM. THERE WAS NO CHANGE IN COLOR. SO
2 I -- I ASSUMED THAT EVERYTHING HAPPENED VERY QUICKLY,
3 JUST ABOUT THE TIME I WAS GONE, WITHIN THAT TIME AND
4 COMING BACK. SO I STARTED IMMEDIATELY TO PERFORM
5 C.P.R. AND MOUTH-TO-MOUTH RESUSCITATION.

6 DETECTIVE SMITH: MANUALLY YOU'RE DOING THE
7 C.P.R., OR DO YOU HAVE A RESUSCITATOR?

8 MR. CHERNOFF: FIRST THING HE DID?

9 DR. MURRAY: WELL, I OBSERVED HIM
10 CLINICALLY.

11 MR. CHERNOFF: DID YOU APPLY ANY MEDICINE OR
12 DO ANYTHING?

13 DR. MURRAY: WELL, THE FIRST THING I WANTED
14 TO DO -- I DID APPLY MEDICINE BUT NOT FIRST. I WANTED
15 TO RESUSCITATE HIM.

16 MR. CHERNOFF: ALL RIGHT. SORRY.

17 DR. MURRAY: AND THE KEY THING IS THAT IF HE
18 WAS NOT BREATHING, I WANTED TO MAKE SURE I VENTILATE
19 HIM AND TO COMPRESS HIM. I ALSO KNOW WITH C.P.R.,
20 THAT THE BEST THING YOU CAN DO FOR A PATIENT IS TO --
21 IF YOU DON'T EVEN VENTILATE, MAKE SURE YOU DO
22 COMPRESSIONS.

23 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: DO COMPRESSIONS.

24 DR. MURRAY: SO I STARTED WITH HIS CHEST
25 COMPRESSIONS, AND THEN I -- I SWIFTLY WENT A

1 SINGLE-MAN RESUSCITATION TO VENTILATE HIM DIRECTLY,
2 MOUTH TO MOUTH. I SAW HIS CHEST RISE APPROPRIATELY
3 AND FALL. SO I KNEW THAT I WAS VENTILATING HIM AND
4 I'M GETTING OXYGEN INTO HIM. AND THEN I WOULD SWITCH
5 BACK TO C.P.R.

6 I -- WHILE I'M DOING THAT, I LOOK AT THE
7 TELEPHONE. OF NOTE, NO TELEPHONES IN THAT HOUSE
8 WORKS. WHY IS THAT DESIGNED SO? I GUESS TO AVOID
9 CALLS, BECAUSE MR. JACKSON CONSTANTLY CHANGED HIS CELL
10 PHONE NUMBER.

11 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: REAL QUICK, IS HE --
12 ARE YOU DOING C.P.R. WHILE HE'S ON THE BED, OR DID YOU
13 MOVE HIM OFF THE BED?

14 DR. MURRAY: I CAN'T MOVE HIM OFF THE BED ON
15 MY OWN AND THEN DO --

16 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

17 DR. MURRAY: QUICKEST THING I CAN DO IS TO
18 TRY TO GET HIM VENTILATED AND DO C.P.R. BUT WHAT I
19 DID WAS TO IMPROVISE. HIS BED IS FAIRLY FIRM BUT
20 STILL MAY NOT BE FIRM ENOUGH FOR IT TO BE VERY
21 EFFECTIVE. SO I GOT MY LEFT HAND UNDER HIS BODY, AND
22 I COMPRESSED WITH MY HAND NOT MOVING, IN PLACE.

23 AND ONCE I THOUGHT I HAD GIVEN HIM
24 APPROPRIATE C.P.R. -- THE HOUSE IS CLOSED. AT NIGHT,
25 IT'S JUST HIS CHILDREN, HE, AND MYSELF ARE INSIDE.

1 SECURITY DON'T COME INTO HIS HOUSE TO EVEN USE THE
2 BATHROOM. I'M TOLD THAT THEY USE A GAS STATION AROUND
3 THE CORNER. I FELT THAT IT WAS A LITTLE BIT INHUMANE,
4 AND THAT WEEK I SPOKE TO THEM TO AT LEAST LET SECURITY
5 HAVE SOME ACCESS TO A GUEST BATHROOM, BECAUSE WHEN ONE
6 GUY LEAVES -- THERE WERE JUST TWO AT NIGHT. IT MAY --
7 YOU NEVER KNOW WHAT CAN HAPPEN, AND YOU MAY NEED
8 ASSISTANCE. I DON'T THINK THAT THAT TOOK EFFECT.

9 BUT ANYWAY, I GOT MY HAND UNDER HIS BACK.
10 AND IN ADDITION TO DOING C.P.R., I VENTILATED HIM MAN
11 -- ORALLY. AND IT WAS -- I MADE SURE THAT HIS CHEST
12 WAS RISING COMPLETELY WITH DEEP BREATHS AND FALLING.
13 THEN KNOWING THAT THE PHONES DON'T WORK, I FOUND THAT
14 OUT A FEW WEEKS BEFORE, WHEN I LIFTED FOR DIAL TONE
15 AND TRIED TO MAKE A CALL, AND THERE WAS NO WAY THIS
16 PHONE IS WORKING. AND I ASKED ABOUT THAT. AND THEY
17 SAID, "WELL, YOU KNOW, THE PHONES AROUND HERE DON'T
18 WORK."

19 SO HAVING THAT KNOWLEDGE, THE ONLY WAY I CAN
20 GET HELP IS -- WELL, I KNOW THAT HE LIVES AT 100 NORTH
21 CAROLWOOD. I DON'T KNOW THE ZIP CODE. TO SPEAK TO A
22 911 OPERATOR WOULD BE TO NEGLECT HIM. I DON'T HAVE
23 THAT AVAILABILITY. I WANT TO VENTILATE HIM, DO CHEST
24 COMPRESSION, ENOUGH TO GIVE ME AN OPPORTUNITY.

25 WHILE I GOT THAT DONE, I THEN CONTINUED

1 C.P.R. WITH MY LEFT HAND SINGULARLY, REACHED FOR MY
2 CELL PHONE AND THEN CALLED HIS ASSISTANT, WHICH NUMBER
3 I HAD, BROTHER MICHAEL. I TOLD HIM, "BROTHER MICHAEL,
4 YOU NEED TO SEND SECURITY UP TO MR. JACKSON'S ROOM
5 IMMEDIATELY. WE HAVE A PROBLEM." OKAY?

6 DETECTIVE SMITH: THAT'S MICHAEL AMIR;
7 CORRECT?

8 DR. MURRAY: YES, UH-HUH.

9 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

10 DR. MURRAY: I DID NOT WANT HIM TO -- I
11 COULDN'T ASK HIM AT THAT TIME TO CALL 911 BECAUSE HE
12 WOULD WANT TO KNOW WHAT IT WAS ABOUT AND I HAVE A
13 PATIENT THAT NEEDS HELP AND I'M TRYING TO ASSIST, AND
14 I'M TRYING TO DO IT THE BEST I CAN AND TO TRY TO GET
15 HELP.

16 I THEN RETURNED TO -- AFTER THAT PHONE CALL,
17 I RETURNED TO HIS BODY WITH THE SAME CONSISTENCY OF
18 C.P.R. AND ORAL AIRWAY MOUTH-TO-MOUTH RESUSCITATION.
19 RECOGNIZING THAT HIS PULSE WAS -- I DIDN'T HAVE A
20 PULSE NOW. I THEN LIFTED HIS LEG, WHICH CAN GIVE YOU
21 WHAT IS AN AUTOTRANSFUSION. IN OTHER WORDS, THE BLOOD
22 IN YOUR LEGS, IF YOU LIFT THE LEGS, THEY CAN POOL BACK
23 TOWARDS HIS HEART. SO I DID THAT, ELEVATE HIS LEGS,
24 JUST FOR A BRIEF MOMENT. I WOULD LOVE TO HAVE HAD IT
25 STAY UP, BUT I HAD NOTHING TO PROP IT UP. SO I

1 AUTOTRANSFUSED HIM AS BEST AS I CAN, CONTINUE C.P.R.,
2 CONTINUE MOUTH-TO-MOUTH RESUSCITATION.

3 NO ONE CAME TO THE DOOR. NO ONE KNOCKED THE
4 DOOR. ABOUT A MINUTE WAS GONE. I DID C.P.R. THEN I
5 REACHED INTO THE BAG. I QUICKLY TOOK A SYRINGE AND
6 GOT FLUMAZENIL, F-L-U-M-A -- FLUMAZENIL,
7 F-L-U-M-A-Z-E-N-I-L, FLUMAZENIL.

8 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

9 DR. MURRAY: YEAH. FLUMAZENIL IS AN
10 ANTIDOTE THAT CAN REFUSE THE EFFECTS OF A
11 BENZODIAZEPINE. AND THE FACT THAT HE HAD GOTTEN
12 LORAZEPAM, THE FACT THAT HE HAD GOTTEN VERSED, I
13 WANTED TO REVERSE THE EFFECTS OF THOSE AGENTS, SHOULD
14 THEY BE WORKING TOGETHER NOW IN ADDITION TO THE MILK
15 THAT HE WAS GIVEN, ALL IN THE EFFORT OF ASSISTING HIM.
16 I GAVE 0.2 MILLIGRAM OF FLUMAZENIL.

17 DETECTIVE SMITH: 0.2?

18 DR. MURRAY: 0.2 MILLIGRAMS.

19 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: AND THIS WAS INTO THE
20 I.V. AGAIN OR --

21 DR. MURRAY: STRAIGHT --

22 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: -- INTO HIM?

23 DR. MURRAY: INTO THE I.V.

24 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

25 DR. MURRAY: INTO THE I.V. TO -- I

1 CONTINUED TO DO CHEST COMPRESSION TO CIRCULATE THE
2 MEDICATION. HOPEFULLY, IT WILL HAVE -- IF HIS
3 RESPIRATORY STATUS WAS DEPRESSED, IT WILL REVERSE THE
4 EFFECT OF THE MEDICATION, AND HE WILL TRY TO BREATHE.
5 BUT HE STILL DID NOT BREATHE.

6 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: AND NO HELP IS COMING.

7 DR. MURRAY: NO HELP IS COMING. SO I NOW
8 DID CHEST COMPRESSION, DID MOUTH-TO-MOUTH
9 RESUSCITATION AGAIN, ENOUGH TO MAKE SURE THAT HE WAS
10 WELL VENTILATED. CHEST COMPRESSION WAS THERE. OPENED
11 THE DOOR, RAN OUT AND WENT LEFT ON THE SECOND LEVEL,
12 DOWN TOWARDS THE KITCHEN, WHERE SECURITY WOULD BE.
13 AND WHEN I GOT TO THE BOTTOM OF THE STAIRS, I SAW THE
14 CHEF, WHO WAS COOKING. I THINK HER NAME IS ROSE. AND
15 I TOLD HER, "I HAVE AN EMERGENCY. HAVE SECURITY COME
16 IMMEDIATELY."

17 THAT'S WHEN THE GENTLEMAN YOU HEAR ON THE
18 911 CALL COMES UPSTAIRS. THE DOOR IS OPEN. HE GETS
19 INSIDE THERE. I SAID, "CALL 911." WHILE HE'S DOING
20 911, I AM DOING CHEST COMPRESSIONS. I'M DOING
21 MOUTH-TO-MOUTH RESUSCITATION. BUT I WANT 911 TO BE
22 CALLED NOW, EVEN THOUGH HE'S STILL ON THE BED, BECAUSE
23 I WOULD STILL NEED HELP TO MOVE HIM OFF FROM THE BED
24 AND PLACE HIM AT AN APPROPRIATE SITE ON THE FLOOR,
25 WHERE I WOULD HAVE A FIRMER SURFACE.

1 SO I CONTINUE TO SUPPORT HIS BACK WHEN I DO
2 THE CHEST COMPRESSIONS. I CONTINUE TO VENTILATE HIM
3 WITH MY MOUTH. THE OPERATOR IS ASKING THE SECURITY
4 GUARD WHAT'S GOING ON. I SAID, "WE HAVE A PATIENT
5 THAT IS NOT BREATHING." ALL OF THE THINGS HE'S
6 SAYING, HE'S GETTING FROM ME. "HOW OLD IS HE?" I
7 SAID, "50 YEARS," BECAUSE HE DOESN'T KNOW HIS AGE.

8 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: BUT DO YOU KNOW WHO THE
9 SECURITY GUARD WAS?

10 DR. MURRAY: ALBERTO ALVAREZ. ALBERTO
11 ALVAREZ.

12 AND THE OPERATORS CONTINUED TO ASK
13 QUESTIONS, AND I SAID, "JUST TELL THEM TO GET HERE,"
14 BECAUSE I WANTED HIM TO COME DOWN AND HELP ME MOVE HIM
15 TO A HARDER SURFACE SO WE CAN DO C.P.R. AND VENTILATE
16 HIM. AND SO THE OPERATOR SAID THAT THEY WERE ON THE
17 WAY. SO HE PUT THE PHONE DOWN. HE CAME THEN TO THE
18 BEDSIDE. WE MOVED THE PATIENT TO THE FLOOR, WHICH WAS
19 WHAT I WANTED TO DO. AND THEN I CONTINUED TO DO
20 C.P.R. AND MOUTH-TO-MOUTH RESUSCITATION UNTIL
21 PARAMEDICS CAME.

22 WHEN PARAMEDICS CAME, THEY CALLED U.C.L.A.
23 THEY HOOKED HIM UP TO THE PULSE OXIMETER. HE WAS NOT
24 BREATHING. WE WERE DOING CHEST COMPRESSION. WE WERE
25 BAGGING HIM. WE GOT HIM INTUBATED. WE ALSO REALIZED

1 THAT HIS RHYTHM WAS WHAT WE CALL P.E.A. P.E.A.

2 DETECTIVE SMITH: P.E.A.?

3 DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

4 DETECTIVE SMITH: WHAT IS THAT?

5 DR. MURRAY: PULSELESS ELECTRICAL ACTIVITY.

6 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: PULSELESS?

7 DR. MURRAY: PULSELESS ELECTRICAL ACTIVITY.

8 THIS IS WHERE YOU HAVE --

9 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: GO AHEAD.

10 DR. MURRAY: -- A HEARTBEAT THAT IS
11 ELECTRICALLY SEEN, BUT EVERY TIME THE BEAT -- YOU SEE
12 THE BEAT, THE HEART DOES NOT CONTRACT TO PUSH A PULSE.
13 THE TREATMENT OF THAT IS NEVER TO SHOCK THE PATIENT.
14 SO THERE WAS NO REASON TO SHOCK HIM. THEY USE SHOCK
15 FOR CONDITIONS LIKE VENTRICULAR FIBRILLATION,
16 VENTRICULAR TACHYCARDIA, AND SUCH STATE. BUT WITH
17 P.E.A., YOU NEVER SHOCK. YOU TREAT THE UNDERLYING
18 CONDITION.

19 SO HE GOT MEDICINES AS CALLED IN BY
20 U.C.L.A., ATROPINE, EPINEPHRINE. I THEN ENCOURAGED
21 THEM TO CONSIDER BICARBONATE, WHICH IS -- BECAUSE I
22 WOULD BELIEVE THAT AT THIS TIME HE WOULD HAVE SOME
23 ACIDEMIA, ACID MEANING THAT, YOU KNOW, NOT GETTING
24 MUCH OXYGEN, YOU CAN -- YOUR BLOOD PH WILL GO DOWN.
25 SO I ASKED FOR BICARBONATE TO HELP HIM METABOLICALLY

1 WHILE WE CONTINUED TO DO C.P.R., TO START AN I.V.,
2 WHICH WAS DONE. THE PARAMEDICS FOUGHT FOR A WHILE TO
3 GET AN I.V. WHY?

4 DETECTIVE SMITH: TRYING TO FIND A VEIN?

5 DR. MURRAY: VEIN IS DIFFICULT WITH
6 MR. JACKSON. AND IN THE PROCESS OF MOVING HIM, MY
7 I.V. SITE BECAME DISLODGED.

8 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: NOW, REAL QUICK, WHEN
9 YOU TALKED ABOUT THERE'S NO NEED TO SHOCK HIM, DID
10 THEY DO IT AGAINST YOUR WISHES? DID THE PARAMEDICS
11 SHOCK HIM?

12 DR. MURRAY: NO.

13 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

14 DR. MURRAY: NO.

15 DETECTIVE SMITH: SO HE WAS NEVER SHOCKED.

16 DR. MURRAY: NO, NEVER.

17 DETECTIVE SMITH: DEFIBRILLATOR WAS NEVER
18 USED?

19 DR. MURRAY: NEVER. THERE WAS NO INDICATION
20 FOR THAT. I'M A CARDIOLOGIST. I KNOW THAT. SO --

21 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: AND DID THE -- DID THEY
22 GIVE HIM THAT BICARBONATE STUFF?

23 DR. MURRAY: YES.

24 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

25 DR. MURRAY: AND THEY -- THE U.C.L.A. AGREED

1 TO GIVE HIM SOME BICARBONATE. THEY AGREED FOR THE
2 EPINEPHRINE, THE ATROPINE. BUT I THOUGHT AS A DOCTOR,
3 U.C.L.A. GIVING ORDERS, THEY WERE KIND OF SLOW. YOU
4 KNOW, IT WAS SLOW STATUS. AND THEN THEY FIND THAT --
5 TOLD THEM THEY DON'T HAVE AN I.V. ACCESS EASILY, IT
6 MADE THINGS WORSE, AND THEY HAD TO SEARCH FOR I.V.
7 SITES EVERYWHERE SO THAT, NEEDLES AND EVERYTHING ELSE.

8 SO BASICALLY MR. JACKSON, AFTER ABOUT
9 20 MINUTES OF AN EFFORT, WHICH I THINK WAS LIMITED,
10 BECAUSE HIS CONDITION WAS ALMOST, I WOULD SAY,
11 WITNESSED, IN THE SENSE THAT I HAD NOT GONE FOR A LONG
12 TIME BEFORE I GOT BACK TO THE BED. IT WAS JUST SO
13 SHORT. HERE, I WOULD CALL IT A WITNESS STATE. AND I
14 STARTED C.P.R. AND EVERYTHING RIGHT AWAY. IT WAS
15 EFFECTIVE. IT WAS DEEP. I KNOW THAT I CAN FEEL
16 FEMORAL PULSES WITH MY COMPRESSIONS. SO I KNEW THAT
17 HIS CIRCULATION WAS INTACT -- WAS BEING -- WAS KEPT
18 GOING WITH MY EFFORT.

19 I THEN ASKED U.C.L.A. TO TRANSFER THE CARE
20 TO ME. AND THEY SAY -- SO INSTEAD OF CALLING HIM
21 DEAD, BECAUSE THEY'RE FEELING NOTHING WAS WORKING AT
22 THE TIME AND THEY DIDN'T THINK THAT THEY WOULD BE ABLE
23 TO GET HIM BACK, THEY SAID, "IF THE DOCTOR WANTS TO
24 TRY, IF HE -- ACCEPT THE CARE, THAT WILL BE FINE,"
25 BECAUSE THE DOCTOR DIDN'T WANT TO SPEND TOO

1 MUCH LONGER ON THE LINE TRYING TO GIVE MEDICATION. I
2 FIGURE THAT I WANTED TO GIVE HIM THE BEST EFFORT.

3 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: SO ALL OF THIS IS GOING
4 ON. YOU'RE CARING FOR HIM, WITH THE PARAMEDICS' HELP,
5 ON THE FLOOR AT THE HOUSE, NOTHING IN THE AMBULANCE
6 YET.

7 DR. MURRAY: NO.

8 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. AND THEY WANT TO
9 GIVE UP, AND YOU DON'T WANT TO GIVE UP.

10 DR. MURRAY: I SAID NO.

11 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: SO THEY TRANSFER CARE
12 TO YOU.

13 DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

14 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

15 DR. MURRAY: I MEAN I LOVE MR. JACKSON. HE
16 WAS MY FRIEND. AND HE OPENED UP TO ME IN DIFFERENT
17 WAYS. AND I WANTED TO HELP HIM AS MUCH AS I CAN. YOU
18 KNOW, HE WAS A SINGLE PARENT. YOU DON'T ALWAYS HEAR
19 THAT FROM A MAN. BUT HE WOULD STATE THAT, YOU KNOW,
20 HE WAS A SINGLE PARENT OF THREE. AND I -- I ALWAYS
21 THOUGHT OF HIS CHILDREN, YOU KNOW, AS I WOULD THINK
22 ABOUT MINE. SO I WANTED TO GIVE HIM THE BEST CHANCE.
23 SO I YOU KNOW --

24 DETECTIVE SMITH: DID THEY RELINQUISH THE
25 RESPONSIBILITY?

1 DR. MURRAY: THEY RELINQUISHED THE
2 RESPONSIBILITY TO ME.

3 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

4 DR. MURRAY: I CONTINUED C.P.R.,
5 EPINEPHRINE, ATROPINE, BICARBONATE. I.V. ACCESSED.
6 FLUID WAS GOING. I MEAN DEEP CHEST COMPRESSIONS ALL
7 THE WAY INTO THE AMBULANCE. AND I TOLD THEM THAT I'M
8 TRANSPORTING HIM TO THE U.C.L.A.

9 I WAS IN THE AMBULANCE WITH MR. JACKSON. WE
10 GOT TO U.C.L.A. WE TOOK HIM INTO THE -- INTO THE
11 OPERATING SUITE, WHERE THERE WAS A HOST OF MEDICAL
12 PERSONNEL WORKING TO ASSIST HIM. AND WE TRIED. WE
13 TRIED FOR AT LEAST AN HOUR. AND I THINK THEY MAY HAVE
14 GIVEN UP EARLIER HADN'T I BEEN INSISTING AND GIVING
15 HIM EVERY OPPORTUNITY.

16 AND THEY FINALLY DECIDED THAT THEY WILL TRY
17 A BALLOON PUMP ON HIM, WHICH WAS A DEVICE PLACED ON
18 THE AORTA THROUGH THE ARTERY AND IT WILL PUMP THE
19 HEART DURING DIASTOLE OR WHEN THE HEART -- IN BETWEEN
20 BEATS AND PUSH OXYGENATED BLOOD BACK TO HIS LUNGS --
21 TO HIS HEART. I ASKED THE CARDIOLOGIST. I SAID, "DO
22 YOU THINK THAT THAT WILL BE EFFECTIVE?" HE SAID HE
23 HAD DONE IT BEFORE AND HE HAD GOOD RESULTS. I SAID,
24 "THEN FINE." IT'S NOT SOMETHING THAT I WOULD DO,
25 BECAUSE I DON'T THINK BALLOON PUMPS HELP YOU IF

1 THERE'S NO BLOOD PRESSURE. BUT HE WANTED TO TRY, AND
2 I WAS WILLING TO GIVE HIM ANY EFFORT THAT WAS
3 NECESSARY. SO I SAID, "PROCEED."

4 SO HE -- AFTER EVERYTHING WAS DONE TO
5 MR. JACKSON, WE JUST CANNOT GET A BLOOD GAS. THE
6 FIRST BLOOD GAS CAME BACK, AND THE PH -- THE PO2,
7 WHICH IS THE OXYGEN PRESSURE, WAS IN THE 20'S. AND
8 THEY THOUGHT IT WAS VENOUS. AND THEN THEY LET -- I
9 ASKED THEM TO REPEAT IT AFTER THEY GOT THE ARTERIAL
10 LINE IN AND WE CAN SEE THAT THE BLOOD WAS RED. BUT
11 THE OTHER BLOOD GASES CAME BACK WITH A PO2 OF ABOUT IN
12 THE 30'S. SO THEN --

13 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: WHICH IS BETTER, 20'S
14 OR 30'S?

15 DR. MURRAY: IT SHOULD BE IN THE 70'S TO
16 90'S. SO IT'S A LITTLE OVER. 30 IS BETTER THAN 25.

17 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

18 DR. MURRAY: AND I WAS WONDERING AT THAT
19 TIME WHY WOULD THE CO2, WHICH IS COMMONLY
20 (UNINTELLIGIBLE), IT'S IN THE 50'S. NORMALLY, IT'S
21 ABOUT 40. HIS PH IS DOWN TO LIKE 7.2. WE EXPECT HIM
22 TO BE ACIDOTIC. WHY COULDN'T WE GET HIS OXYGEN UP?
23 SO AT THAT TIME WHEN WE CALL THE CODE AND THE DOCTOR
24 SAID SHE CAN'T EXPLAIN, AND I SAID, "I DON'T HAVE AN
25 EXPLANATION EITHER, BUT WE CANNOT RULE OUT THE

1 POSSIBILITY OF PULMONARY EMBOLISM."

2 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: AND WHAT IS A PULMONARY
3 EMBOLISM?

4 DR. MURRAY: A PULMONARY EMBOLISM IS A BLOOD
5 CLOT THAT GOES TO THE LUNGS AND PREVENTS ANY KIND OF
6 OXYGENATED BLOOD TO GO TO THE LUNG, WHERE OXIDATION
7 TAKES PLACE SO BLOOD CAN BE EXCHANGED WITH THE TISSUE.
8 A MASSIVE PULMONARY EMBOLISM WOULD SHUT DOWN ALL
9 CIRCULATION TO THE LUNGS AND WILL GIVE YOU THAT
10 PICTURE AND CAN ALSO GIVE YOU PULSELESS ELECTRICAL
11 ACTIVITY. THAT'S WHY WE DID NOT HAVE TO SHOCK HIS
12 HEART. SO --

13 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: REAL QUICK. SORRY TO
14 INTERRUPT. REAL QUICK. WHEN YOU ARRIVED AT U.C.L.A.,
15 DOES THE -- I'M NOT SURE. I'M NOT FAMILIAR WITH THE
16 RULES. DOES THE CARE THEN TRANSFER BACK TO U.C.L.A.
17 HOSPITAL, OR IT STAYS WITH YOU?

18 DR. MURRAY: THE TRANSFER WAS DIRECT TO
19 U.C.L.A.

20 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

21 DR. MURRAY: BECAUSE I DON'T HAVE
22 PRIVILEGES.

23 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

24 DR. MURRAY: BUT I STAYED IN THE AREA, AND
25 THEY ALLOWED ME TO DO THAT, YOU KNOW, IN THE

1 PERIPHERY. AND I MADE SUGGESTIONS, AND THEY WERE
2 AMENABLE TO THAT. AND THEN SUBSEQUENTLY THE
3 CARDIOLOGIST CAME. WE TRIED THE BALLOON PUMP.

4 MR. CHERNOFF: CAN I -- DO YOU GUYS MIND IF
5 I ADD A LITTLE BIT?

6 DETECTIVE SMITH: NO, NOT AT ALL.

7 MR. CHERNOFF: ONE OF THE THINGS THAT -- THE
8 DIFFERENCE HERE IS DESPITE THE FACT THAT MR. JACKSON
9 WAS USING THIS DRUG TO SLEEP, I GUESS, A LONG TIME,
10 THERE WAS A CHANGE IN HIS DRUG INTAKE THE THREE DAYS
11 PRIOR TO HIS DEATH. COULD YOU EXPLAIN WHY THAT WAS?
12 I DON'T THINK WE GOT TO IT.

13 DETECTIVE SMITH: NO, NOT YET.

14 DR. MURRAY: OKAY.

15 DETECTIVE SMITH: AND BEFORE WE GET THERE,
16 OBVIOUSLY, INEVITABLY, THINGS HAPPEN AND --

17 DR. MURRAY: HE PASSES.

18 DETECTIVE SMITH: -- HE PASSES.

19 DR. MURRAY: THEY PRONOUNCED HIM. AND AT
20 THAT TIME I RECOMMENDED. I AM THE ONE THAT
21 RECOMMENDED. THEY SAID, "WELL, IS THERE A DOCTOR
22 WHO'S GOING TO SIGN THE DEATH CERTIFICATE?" AND I
23 SAID, "I WOULDN'T WANT TO SIGN THE DEATH CERTIFICATE
24 ON MR. JACKSON WHEN I DON'T UNDERSTAND THE CAUSE OF
25 HIS DEATH." AND THEREFORE I RECOMMENDED THAT HE HAVE

1 AN AUTOPSY. THAT'S WHERE THE RECOMMENDATION CAME
2 FROM.

3 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YEAH, WE'VE BEEN TOLD
4 BY DIFFERENT SOURCES THAT THAT IS WHAT HAPPENED.

5 DR. MURRAY: I RECOMMENDED IT.

6 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YES.

7 DR. MURRAY: OKAY.

8 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: ALL RIGHT.

9 MR. CHERNOFF: JUST TELL HIM WHAT HAPPENED
10 THE THREE DAYS PRIOR, PLEASE.

11 DR. MURRAY: YEAH. MR. JACKSON WAS MY
12 FRIEND. I LOVED HIM. I MEAN WE HAD A GREAT
13 RELATIONSHIP. AND AFTER JOINING HIS TEAM, I FELL INTO
14 THE SITUATION WITH A GENTLEMAN WHO WANTED A REGULAR,
15 FREQUENTLY, NIGHTLY DIPRIVAN. THAT WAS NOT MY PURPOSE
16 OF JOINING HIS TEAM. I WAS THERE TO HELP HIM, AND I
17 WAS GOING TO BE AVAILABLE SHOULD SOMETHING GO WRONG,
18 TO HELP PROVIDE THE BEST CARE FOR HIM. THAT WAS
19 FRUSTRATING TO ME.

20 AND AFTER I SAW THAT THIS COULD BE A
21 HABIT -- WHICH I DID NOT RECOGNIZE BEFORE. BUT NOW
22 BEING WITH HIM ALL THE TIME, IT WAS NOT NATURAL. I
23 THEN TRIED TO HELP MR. JACKSON. I WAS TRYING TO WEAN
24 HIM OFF THE PROPOFOL.

25 BUT LIKE EVERYTHING ELSE, YOU HAVE TO LOOK

1 AT BEHAVIOR PATTERN. I HAD NOT SEEN ANY STUDY WHERE
2 SOMEONE WAS ADDICTED TO THAT MEDICATION, BECAUSE
3 THAT'S ALWAYS USED IN SOME SITUATION WHERE ONE DOES
4 NOT GET IT SO FREQUENTLY. BUT IF YOU GOT ACCUSTOMED
5 TO ANY AGENT THAT IS STUDIED IN THAT WAY, YOU
6 DEFINITELY MAY SEE THAT THERE COULD BE DEPENDENCY.

7 SO WITH CAUTIOUSNESS AGAIN, I WAS CONCERNED
8 HOW IT WAS DIFFICULT TO GET HIM TO SLEEP THAT NIGHT
9 AND COULD NOT TELL IF THAT WAS A WITHDRAWAL EFFECT
10 FROM WHAT HE WAS ACCUSTOMED TO. WHY DID I COME TO
11 THAT CONCLUSION? THREE DAYS BEFORE HIS DEATH, I
12 STARTED TO WEAN MR. JACKSON FROM PROPOFOL.

13 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: DID YOU DO THIS WITH
14 HIS KNOWLEDGE OR WITHOUT HIS KNOWLEDGE?

15 DR. MURRAY: WITH HIS KNOWLEDGE AND
16 INFORMATION. I TOLD HIM THAT I WANTED HIM TO ASSUME A
17 MORE NATURAL PATTERN OF SLEEP. I WANTED HIM TO BE
18 MORE PHYSIOLOGICAL, LIKE EMULOUS. IF YOU EXERCISE,
19 YOU PERFORM AND YOU'RE TIRED, I WANTED HIM TO GO TO
20 SLEEP NATURALLY. AND THEN I ASKED HIM, "IF THIS IS
21 YOUR PATTERN, WHAT'S GOING TO HAPPEN WHEN THE SHOW IS
22 OVER? ARE YOU GOING TO CONTINUE LIKE THIS?" HE SAID,
23 "NO, I THINK I'LL DO FINE. I THINK I'LL BE ABLE TO
24 SLEEP WITHOUT IT." BUT THAT'S WHAT HE'S SAYING TO ME
25 AT THAT TIME.

1 I SAID, "WELL, I THINK WE NEED TO TRY LESSER
2 AGENTS THAT IS NOT AS -- AS PROPOFOL -- TO HELP YOU
3 AND TRY TO SEE IF WE CAN WEAN IT AWAY." SO I STARTED
4 THREE DAYS BEFORE. IT WAS 72 HOURS BEFORE. I SAW HIM
5 EVERY NIGHT. THAT'S WHEN I STARTED TO USE MORE THE
6 LORAZEPAM AND VERSED.

7 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: BEFORE THAT NIGHT, HAD
8 HE USED THEM BEFORE, OR IS THAT --

9 DR. MURRAY: YES.

10 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: -- THE FIRST TIME THAT
11 YOU INTRODUCED IT TO HIM?

12 DR. MURRAY: NO

13 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY

14 DR. MURRAY: I INTRODUCED IT TO HIM ABOUT
15 THREE NIGHTS OR SO BEFORE. NOW, WHAT WAS THE --

16 MR. CHERNOFF: WELL, I THINK THE DETECTIVE
17 IS ASKING BEFORE THOSE THREE NIGHTS, HAD HE EVER USED
18 THE VERSED AND --

19 DR. MURRAY: YES. BUT NOT WHERE THAT WOULD
20 BE THE SOLE AGENTS.

21 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

22 DR. MURRAY: TRYING TO --

23 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: SO HE'D USE THEM IN
24 COMBINATION --

25 DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

1 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: -- AND LESSER AMOUNTS.

2 DR. MURRAY: LESSER AMOUNTS.

3 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: AND YOU'RE TRYING TO
4 BRING DOWN THE PROPOFOL AND --

5 DR. MURRAY: AND GET HIM OFF.

6 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: RIGHT. AND SO YOU GAVE
7 HIM --

8 DETECTIVE SMITH: -- LORAZEPAM AND --

9 DR. MURRAY: AND -- LORAZEPAM AND THE
10 MIDAZOLAM, WHICH IS THE VERSED AND THE ATIVAN. OKAY?

11 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: AND HE KNOWS -- HE
12 AGREED FOR YOU TO DO THIS.

13 DR. MURRAY: RELUCTANTLY.

14 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

15 DR. MURRAY: RELUCTANTLY. HE FOUGHT ME ON
16 IT, AND HE SAID, "YOU KNOW, I MEAN WOULD IT WORK THE
17 SAME WAY, BECAUSE I" -- BUT THAT WAS SHOWING ME SOME
18 DEPENDENCY HERE. "WOULD I BE ABLE TO SLEEP?"

19 I SAID, "WELL, YOU KNOW, CLEARLY IT IS NOT
20 AS STRONG AN AGENT. BUT IF WE CAN HELP YOU TO SLEEP
21 MORE NATURALLY AND THEN EVENTUALLY YOU CAN BE ON YOUR
22 OWN, MILK AND COOKIES AND ALL THE DIFFERENT THINGS
23 THAT IS NICE AND COMFORTING BEFORE YOU GO TO BED, THAT
24 WOULD BE BETTER FOR YOU, MICHAEL." AND HE SAID,
25 "WELL, I REALLY WANT TO -- BUT I REALLY WANT TO SLEEP.

1 ARE YOU SURE IT'S GOING TO MAKE ME SLEEP?" I SAID, "I
2 CANNOT TELL YOU WITH CERTAINTY THAT IT WILL MAKE YOU
3 SLEEP, BUT I'D LIKE YOU TO TRY."

4 I NEVER IDENTIFIED TO HIM THAT I BELIEVED AT
5 THAT TIME HE MAY -- HE WAS SHOWING DEPENDENCY OR THAT
6 HE MAY HAVE BEEN DRUG SEEKING, BECAUSE I WAS TRYING TO
7 FORM A DIFFERENT POLICY WITH HIM SO HE CAN TRANSFER
8 CONFIDENCE FROM THAT AGENT TO SOMETHING LESSER. SO I
9 GAVE HIM THE VERSED THE THIRD NIGHT. I GAVE HIM
10 VERSED, AND I GAVE HIM ATIVAN, AND I GAVE HIM A LOWER
11 DOSE OF THE INJECTION OF THE -- OF THE PROPOFOL MILK
12 AT A SLOWER DRIP RATE.

13 AND EXCEPT FOR SOME INTERRUPTIONS IN SLEEP,
14 I WAS ABLE TO GET HIM TO SLEEP FOR A REASONABLE TIME.
15 BUT HE WANTED TO GO ALL THE WAY AGAIN TILL ABOUT NOON,
16 YOU KNOW, VERY LONG HOURS OF SLEEP, WHICH AGAIN WAS
17 NOT IDEAL, BUT THAT'S WHAT HE WANTED, BECAUSE THE
18 OTHER DOCTORS WORKING WITH HIM GAVE HIM 15 TO
19 18 HOURS. SO THAT WAS NIGHT 1. REDUCE -- REDUCE
20 PROPOFOL, STARTING MORE LORAZEPAM AND VERSED.

21 ON THE SECOND NIGHT, WHICH WAS THE NIGHT
22 BEFORE HE DIED, NO MILK WAS GIVEN. I THOUGHT WE WERE
23 REALLY ONTO SOMETHING THEN. HE GOT THE LORAZEPAM AND
24 THE VERSED ONLY. HE SEEMED TO HAVE RESPONDED MORE
25 PHYSIOLOGICAL TO THAT. HE WAS NOT GROGGY WHEN HE WOKE

1 UP. IF HE GOT UP IN THE MIDDLE OF THE NIGHT, HE'D
2 WAKE UP VERY QUICKLY. BUT HE GOT SOME SLEEP.

3 HE ONLY TOLD ME THAT HE FELT A LITTLE BIT
4 MORE OF A HANGOVER DURING THE DAY, BUT I THINK THAT
5 THAT WAS SUBJECTIVE. I THINK THAT WAS HIS TELLING ME
6 "I TRIED IT YOUR WAY, BUT I REALLY DON'T LIKE IT. I
7 WANT DIPRIVAN." SO I SAID, "BUT YOU SLEPT PRETTY WELL
8 LAST NIGHT, MICHAEL. AND THIS IS DAY NUMBER 2. SO
9 LET'S CONTINUE TO TRY THE LORAZEPAM AND THE ATIVAN."
10 AND I -- I STARTED OFF THAT NIGHT TO DO THE LORAZEPAM
11 AND THE ATIVAN.

12 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: AND THAT'S NIGHT
13 NUMBER 3.

14 DR. MURRAY: AND THAT WAS THE NIGHT --

15 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: THAT'S NIGHT NUMBER 3?

16 DR. MURRAY: YES.

17 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

18 DR. MURRAY: AND THAT WAS --

19 MR. CHERNOFF: THAT'S THE DAY HE DIED.

20 DR. MURRAY: AND THAT'S THE NIGHT IT WAS
21 IMPOSSIBLE. IT WASN'T WORKING. SO WAS HE GOING
22 THROUGH A WITHDRAWAL FROM THAT AGENT? WAS IT HIS MIND
23 THAT WAS FORCING HIM TO STAY AWAKE? HE KEPT SAYING
24 THAT, YOU KNOW, HE WAS CONSTANTLY PRODUCING AND HE'S A
25 PRODUCER AND HE'S A WRITER AND HE HAD TO SLEEP; HIS

1 SHOW WAS GOING TO FALL APART; HE NEEDED TO SLEEP.

2 THIS IS WHY WE GOT ALL THE WAY TO THE NEXT
3 DAY, AT DAYLIGHT, WHEN AFTER TRYING ALL NIGHT FROM
4 NIGHT 2 WITH THOSE TWO AGENTS, I THEN DECIDED TO GO
5 AHEAD AND GIVE HIM SOME OF THE MILK SO HE COULD GET A
6 COUPLE OF HOURS SLEEP SO THAT HE COULD PRODUCE,
7 BECAUSE I CARED ABOUT HIM. I DID NOT WANT HIM TO
8 FAIL. I HAD NO INTENTIONS OF HURTING HIM. AND I WAS
9 COMPASSIONATE. BUT WHAT I WAS DOING, TOO, RECOGNIZING
10 THAT MICHAEL JACKSON MAY HAVE HAD A DEPENDENCY TO A
11 SUBSTANCE. I WAS TRYING TO WEAN HIM OFF. BUT --

12 DETECTIVE SMITH: AND YOU WERE DOING THAT
13 SUCCESSFULLY THE TWO NIGHTS PRIOR. SOME LITTLE
14 RESTLESSNESS, LIKE YOU MENTIONED --

15 DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

16 DETECTIVE SMITH: -- BUT EVERYTHING UP UNTIL
17 THIS NIGHT, THE NIGHT THAT THIS HAPPENED --

18 DR. MURRAY: CAN'T GO BACK TO SLEEP. HE
19 CAN'T --

20 DETECTIVE SMITH: HE'S JUST WIDE AWAKE AFTER
21 YOU'D DONE WHAT YOU COULD FOR HIM.

22 DR. MURRAY: YES.

23 DETECTIVE SMITH: AND HE'S REQUESTING MORE.
24 AND THEN ULTIMATELY HE REQUESTS THE MILK.

25 DR. MURRAY: YEAH. OKAY?

1 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

2 DR. MURRAY: SO WHAT I -- WHAT I DID AT THAT
3 TIME, I -- I REALIZED THAT MAYBE EVEN THOUGH THEY HAVE
4 NOT STUDIED THAT AGENT LIKE THAT ON A REGULAR DAILY
5 BASIS TO A PATIENT AND STUDIES HAVEN'T SHOWN THAT YOU
6 CAN DEVELOP DEPENDENCY, HE WAS CLEARLY PROBABLY
7 SHOWING SIGNS OF A WITHDRAWAL. AND WHETHER THAT WAS
8 ALL PHYSIOLOGICAL, PSYCHOLOGICAL, OR MENTAL, THERE'S A
9 SATISFACTION THAT HE WASN'T GETTING THE MILK, WHICH
10 PROBABLY WAS, WAS INVOLVED, IN THAT, IN THAT PROCESS.

11 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: WHEN -- SO AT THE
12 HOSPITAL, WHEN THEY PRONOUNCE HIM AND THE OTHER
13 DETECTIVES TALKED TO YOU FOR A LITTLE BIT, WHAT --
14 WHAT HAPPENS THEN? WHAT DO YOU DO?

15 DR. MURRAY: WHAT DID I DO AFTER TALKING TO
16 THEM?

17 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: .YEAH.

18 DR. MURRAY: WELL, AFTER TALKING TO THE
19 DETECTIVES, I GAVE THEM MY CELL PHONE, YOU KNOW, WHERE
20 THEY CAN CONTACT ME.

21 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: RIGHT.

22 DR. MURRAY: IT WAS NOW VERY IMPORTANT TO
23 CONSOLE MRS. JACKSON, THE MOTHER OF MICHAEL. I NEVER
24 MET HER BEFORE. BUT WHEN SHE CAME INTO THE HOSPITAL,
25 THE FIRST THING WAS HOW DO YOU BREAK THE NEWS TO HER.

1 I WAS ALSO TOLD THAT SHE HAD A HEART CONDITION. SO I
2 HAD ASKED THEM TO BE VERY, VERY CAREFUL IN GIVING
3 INFORMATION TO HER. WAS THERE ANY OTHER FAMILY MEMBER
4 PRESENT AT THE TIME? NO. SHE WAS THE ONLY ONE THERE.
5 HIS FATHER WAS EITHER IN ANOTHER STATE, WAS CLEARLY
6 NOT CLOSE. AND I CAN'T TELL ABOUT THE OTHER SIBLINGS.

7 DETECTIVE SMITH: DID YOU LEAVE THE
8 HOSPITAL, OR DID SHE COME TO THE HOSPITAL AND YOU
9 SPOKE WITH HER THERE?

10 DR. MURRAY: SHE CAME TO THE HOSPITAL.

11 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

12 DR. MURRAY: SO WE -- THEY BROUGHT HER INTO
13 A ROOM DOWN THE HALL. AND I WENT IN THERE WITH THE
14 EMERGENCY ROOM PHYSICIAN WHO WAS TREATING HIM, WHOM I
15 WAS WITH ALL THE TIME THROUGH HIS CODE, AND THEY WOULD
16 BREAK THE NEWS TO MRS. JACKSON. SO THE DOCTOR STARTED
17 TO TELL HER THAT, YOU KNOW, HER SON CAME IN AND HE WAS
18 HAVING DIFFICULTY BREATHING AND THEY TRIED EVERYTHING.
19 AND SHE SAID, "WELL, HOW IS HE? HE'S NOT
20 DEAD, IS HE?" AND THE DOCTOR SAID, "YES." AND SHE
21 BROKE DOWN. IT WAS VERY -- AND WEEPING. WE STAYED
22 THERE, HELD HER HAND.

23 THE DOCTOR LEFT. I STAYED. AND THEN I
24 ASKED FOR -- I ASKED FOR THE SOCIAL WORKERS TO COME
25 IN, OR PSYCHOLOGIST, WHICHEVER THE HOSPITAL HAD. THEY

1 BROUGHT THE SOCIAL TEAM. THEY BROUGHT THE HEAD OF
2 PSYCHOLOGY. AND I ASKED THEM TO -- BASED UPON THE
3 NEWS THAT MRS. JACKSON RECEIVED, TO PLEASE HELP HER,
4 TAKE CARE OF HER AT THIS TIME.

5 MY NEXT QUESTION WAS "WHERE ARE THE
6 CHILDREN?" I WAS NOT AWARE THAT THE CHILDREN WERE
7 BROUGHT TO THE HOSPITAL. I WAS TOLD THAT THEY WERE IN
8 ANOTHER ROOM OFF SITE AND THEY WERE HAVING SOMETHING
9 TO EAT. DECIDED THE CHILDREN HAD TO BE MADE AWARE OF
10 THE CONDITION, AND THEY NEEDED TO KNOW. SO HOW BEST
11 DO WE DO IT? SO I SPOKE TO FRANK DILEO. HE IS
12 MICHAEL'S MANAGER, FRANK DILEO. AND HE SAID HE WOULD
13 GO IN THERE WITH ME. I SAID, "NO, LET'S GET SOMEONE
14 ELSE, TOO, THAT THEY PRETTY WELL HAVE GOOD CAMARADERIE
15 WITH." AND THIS WAS BROTHER MICHAEL AMIR. SO
16 FRANK DILEO, MYSELF, AND MICHAEL AMIR, WITH A SOCIAL
17 WORKER, WENT INTO THE ROOM WHERE THE THREE CHILDREN
18 WERE HAVING SOMETHING TO EAT. I WALKED IN, AND I'M
19 NOT SURE WHO SPOKE FIRST. BUT SOMEHOW OR THE OTHER,
20 THEY ASKED THE QUESTIONS, AND THE CHILDREN FOUND OUT
21 THAT DADDY WASN'T DOING WELL, THAT HE HAD PASSED AWAY.
22 AND THEN THEY REALLY WERE WEEPING, REALLY WEEPING.

23 I STAYED THERE. I HUGGED THEM ALL, GAVE
24 THEM COMFORT TO PARIS, COMFORT TO PRINCE, COMFORT TO
25 BLANKET, WHICH IS THE LAST LITTLE GUY, BECAUSE

1 WHENEVER THEY WERE SICK, THEY WOULD ALWAYS ASK FOR
2 DR. CONRAD, "PLEASE CALL DR. CONRAD, YOU KNOW, DADDY."
3 AND I GAVE THEM COMFORT.

4 MRS. JACKSON'S NOT IN THAT ROOM, THE
5 MRS. JACKSON, HIS MOTHER. AFTER THEY CRIED AND CRIED
6 AND CRIED, THEN HIS DAUGHTER UTTERED A LOT OF WORDS OF
7 UNHAPPINESS AND, YOU KNOW, SHE WILL LIVE ALONE WITHOUT
8 HER DAD AND SHE DIDN'T WANT TO BE AN ORPHAN. AND REAL
9 SAD, REAL SAD. SHE'S LIKE MY DAUGHTER. AND I TOLD
10 HER, YOU KNOW, WE WILL TAKE CARE OF HER. FRANK DILEO
11 SAID THAT HE WOULD TAKE CARE OF HER ALSO.

12 AND SHE ASKED ME, "DR. MURRAY, YOU SAID YOU
13 SAVE A LOT OF PATIENTS. YOU KNOW, YOU SAVE PEOPLE
14 WITH HEART ATTACKS, AND YOU COULDN'T SAVE MY DAD." I
15 SAID, "I TRIED MY BEST." AND SHE SAID, "I KNOW THAT,
16 DR. MURRAY. AT LEAST I KNOW. I KNOW YOU TRIED YOUR
17 BEST. I KNOW YOU TRIED YOUR BEST, BUT I'M REALLY SAD.
18 YOU KNOW, I WILL WAKE UP IN THE MORNING, AND I WON'T
19 BE ABLE TO SEE MY DADDY." SHE CRIED AND WAS VERY
20 STARK. AND THEN SHE ASKED TO SEE HIM. AND THEN THAT
21 WAS ANOTHER THING. HOW DO YOU LET THE CHILDREN SEE
22 HIM?

23 SO BEFORE I SAID "YES," I PULLED A
24 PSYCHOLOGY TEAM TOGETHER. I'M DOING ALL OF THIS. AND
25 I SAID, "WE NEED SOME HELP, AND WE NEED SOME BACKUP

1 HERE. THE CHILDREN NEEDS TO SEE THEIR DADDY. DO YOU
2 THINK IT IS A GOOD IDEA?" I DID NOT MAKE AN
3 INDEPENDENT DECISION ON THAT CASE. AND THEN SOMEBODY
4 SAID, "WELL, YES, THEY SHOULD BRING CLOSURE TO THIS."
5 I SAID, "DO YOU THINK THAT THEY'RE MATURE ENOUGH TO
6 UNDERSTAND IT?" THEY SAY YEAH, THEY THINK SO.

7 SO I HAD THE SOCIAL WORKER TALK TO THE
8 CHILDREN SOME MORE. SHE BROUGHT SOME ASSISTANTS DOWN.
9 AND THEN THEY MOVED MRS. JACKSON, MICHAEL'S MOTHER, TO
10 A LARGER ROOM, BIG CONFERENCE ROOM. THE CHILDREN ALSO
11 JOINED THEIR GRANDMOTHER BECAUSE SHE WANTED TO SEE
12 GRANDMA. SO SHE WENT TO THE GRANDMOTHER, AND SHE WAS
13 SOBBING AND WEEPING. AND THEY HELD A LITTLE BIT, I
14 THINK, GRANDMA. BUT I'M NOT SURE HOW CLOSE THEY ARE,
15 BECAUSE THE TWO BOYS ARE STILL KIND OF RUNNING AWAY
16 FROM A DISTANCE. AND PARIS WAS MORE COMFORTED BY A
17 RELATIVE VERSUS THE GRANDMOTHER, BUT SHE DID WANT TO
18 SEE HER.

19 AND WHILE THAT WAS BEING -- WAS HAPPENING, I
20 ASKED THEM TO PREPARE MR. JACKSON'S BODY, MAKE IT AS
21 PRESENTABLE AS POSSIBLE, BECAUSE I RECOMMENDED AN
22 AUTOPSY BE PERFORMED, SO THAT THE CHILDREN WOULD BE
23 ABLE TO VIEW THEIR DADDY AND HAVE THEM SAY GOOD-BYE TO
24 HIM AT THIS TIME. AT THAT TIME, THEY -- HIS FAMILY
25 STARTED TO TRICKLE IN. FIRST PERSON I SAW WAS HIS

1 BROTHER JERMAINE, I THINK. I DIDN'T KNOW HIM BEFORE.
2 SOME COUSINS AND THEN LATOYA, HIS SISTER, CAME IN.
3 SHE SAW HIM, AND THEY WERE BRIEFED, AND THE FAMILY MET
4 TOGETHER.

5 AND THEN WHILE THEY WERE PREPARING
6 MR. JACKSON, AFTER HE WAS PRONOUNCED AND THEY'RE
7 GETTING HIM READY IN A DIFFERENT ROOM, I WENT INTO THE
8 BIGGER ROOM WITH THE FAMILY, BIG CONFERENCE ROOM. I
9 SAT WITH THE FAMILY. MRS. JACKSON, I PULLED MY CHAIR
10 ALL THE WAY UP TO HER. LATOYA WAS RIGHT THERE. I
11 HELD THEIR HANDS.

12 I ASKED THEM IF THEY HAD ANY QUESTIONS, "IS
13 THERE ANYTHING I CAN DO TO HELP?" THEY ASKED ME, YOU
14 KNOW, IF I -- "DO YOU KNOW WHY HE DIED?" MY ANSWER
15 WAS "NO." AND THAT'S THE REASON WHY I WAS
16 RECOMMENDING TO THE FAMILY TO HAVE AN AUTOPSY, BECAUSE
17 I ALSO WANTED TO KNOW. THEIR QUESTIONS WERE NOT VERY
18 DEEP. AND THEY -- YOU KNOW, THEY WERE NOT
19 (UNINTELLIGIBLE). BUT I WANTED TO BE THERE TO ANSWER
20 ANYTHING THAT THEY WANTED, ANY QUESTIONS THAT THEY MAY
21 HAVE HAD. AND I DID THAT.

22 I -- AFTER THAT, THE BODY WAS READY FOR
23 VIEWING. THE SOCIAL WORKERS HAD CONTROL OF THE
24 CHILDREN. AND THEY TOOK THE ENTIRE TEAM, INCLUDING
25 THE HEAD OF THE DEPARTMENT WHO STOOD OUTSIDE IN THE

1 HALLWAY, AND THEY WENT IN TO SEE THEIR DAD. I ALSO
2 WENT INTO THE VIEWING AREA. THERE WAS AN OFFICER
3 STANDING THERE WITH ME. AND THERE WAS ANOTHER GLASS
4 PARTITION (UNINTELLIGIBLE). AND THEY SPENT A LONG
5 TIME WITH THE FAMILY, WITH THEIR DAD. THEY CRIED.
6 OTHER PEOPLE CAME IN. I WENT BACK TO THE BIG ROOM.

7 I -- BECAUSE AT THAT TIME, AFTER THE
8 CHILDREN HAD SEEN THEIR DAD AND LATOYA AND SO HAD
9 VIEWED THE BODY, THEY WERE WONDERING AT THAT TIME
10 STILL WOULD THERE BE MORE RELATIVES COMING, BECAUSE
11 THEY SAID THAT THERE WAS A TWO-HOUR WINDOW, AT WHICH
12 POINT THEY HAD TO MOVE HIM TO THE CORONER'S OFFICE OR
13 THE CORONER WOULD BE THERE. SO I WENT BACK INTO THE
14 LARGE ROOM, AND I ASKED MRS. JACKSON IF SHE HAD A
15 DESIRE TO SEE HIM.

16 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: MRS. JACKSON.

17 DR. MURRAY: HIS MOTHER.

18 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: HIS MOTHER.

19 DR. MURRAY: AND SHE SAID NO.

20 MR. CHERNOFF: WAS HIS DAD -- THE DAD IS
21 THERE NOW?

22 DR. MURRAY: NO.

23 MR. CHERNOFF: NO?

24 DR. MURRAY: NO, HE NEVER -- HE NEVER SHOWED
25 UP.

1 SO FOR THE NEXT PART, I ASKED THE SECURITY
2 GUARD, "SO WHAT IS GOING ON? WELL, YOU KNOW, NOW
3 THAT -- YOU KNOW, THE FAMILY IS JUST BEING HERE.
4 MR. JACKSON -- THEY VIEWED THE BODY, AND NOW THEY'RE
5 WAITING FOR THE CORONER TO MOVE THE BODY BACK. WOULD
6 YOU BE ABLE TO TAKE THE CHILDREN HOME? WHAT ARE YOU
7 GOING TO DO?"

8 AND THEN THE SECURITY GUARD TOLD ME THAT
9 "WELL, NOBODY CAN GO INTO THE HOME AT THIS TIME," THAT
10 THE HOUSE WAS BASICALLY ON LOCKDOWN. SO I SAID,
11 "WELL, WHERE WILL THE CHILDREN GO?" THEY WERE THEN
12 TRYING TO FIGURE OUT WELL, WHERE THEY WILL GO, WITH
13 WHICH RELATIVE. I WAS NOT IN CHARGE OF THIS.

14 I WAITED AROUND AGAIN FOR A WHILE. AND THEN
15 I WENT TO RANDY PHILLIPS, WHO IS THE C.E.O./PRESIDENT
16 OF A.E.G. LIVE. I THEN SPOKE TO FRANK DILEO AGAIN. I
17 SPOKE TO BROTHER MICHAEL AMIR AND OTHER SECURITY
18 GUARDS, "IS THERE ANYTHING ELSE I CAN DO AROUND HERE?"
19 THEY SAID, "NO, DR. MURRAY. WE ARE TOLD NOW THAT WE
20 MAY HAVE TO BE AIR-LIFTED OUT OF HERE BECAUSE OF SO
21 MUCH OF THE CROWD THAT'S OUTSIDE." THAT WAS THE
22 SITUATION I HAD.

23 SO THEN THEY ASKED FOR HIS BROTHER JERMAINE
24 (UNINTELLIGIBLE) TO THE OTHER BUILDING. SO I WALKED
25 ACROSS ANOTHER PART OF U.C.L.A. AND THEN I WAS

1 INTRODUCTION TO THE LAWYERS OF THE JACKSONS WHO WAS
2 THERE FOR A NUMBER OF YEARS AND SOME OF THE PRESS.
3 AND THEY WANTED TO MAKE A PRESS RELEASE. BUT THEY
4 WANTED ME TO REVIEW THE PRESS RELEASE TO SEE IF IT WAS
5 OKAY WITH ME.

6 DETECTIVE SMITH: JERMAINE DID?

7 DR. MURRAY: YEAH. JERMAINE, HE AND A.E.G.,
8 RANDY PHILLIPS, WANTED ME TO LOOK AT THAT. AND THE
9 LAWYERS, THEY WANTED ME TO LOOK AT WHAT THEY HAD
10 WRITTEN. AND I KNEW WHAT THEY HAD WRITTEN, AND I
11 EDITED. I ADDED THAT THE CAUSE -- ALTHOUGH IT CAME

12 OUT AS WHAT WAS PRESUMED TO BE A POSSIBLE CARDIAC
13 ARREST, THE UNDERLYING CAUSE OF THAT CONDITION IS NOT
14 KNOWN UNTIL AN AUTOPSY IS PERFORMED. AND I --

15 MR. CHERNOFF: WHO IS THIS YOU WERE TALKING
16 TO, JERMAINE?

17 DR. MURRAY: I WAS SPEAKING TO THE -- THE
18 PRESS RELEASE AND THE LAWYER WHO WAS PREPARING THE
19 STATEMENT FOR JERMAINE TO GIVE. I THEN -- AFTER DOING
20 THAT, I THOUGHT IT WAS REASONABLE. THEY DON'T WANT TO
21 CHANGE ANYTHING. I MEAN IT WAS LEGAL. JERMAINE
22 WANTED TO CHANGE THE FACT THAT THEY HAD ASKED THE FANS
23 TO RESPECT THEIR PRIVACY. AND HE SAID, "THAT WON'T BE
24 A VERY GOOD IDEA BECAUSE THE FANS ARE FANS. MAYBE WE
25 SHOULD ASK THE MEDIA TO RESPECT OUR PRIVACY." SO HE

1 ADDED -- HE GOT RID OF "FANS" AND ADDED "MEDIA" FOR
2 PRIVACY.

3 AND THEN I WENT INTO HIM FURTHER. WE WERE
4 SITTING IN THE CORNER, AND THEN I SPOKE TO HIM AGAIN A
5 LITTLE BIT. AND HE ASKED ME WHERE I WAS FROM, AND I
6 TOLD HIM I WAS BORN IN THE CARIBBEAN, IN TRINIDAD,
7 BECAUSE HE HEARD MY ACCENT. AND I SAID, "ANYTHING
8 ELSE I CAN DO FOR YOU?" AND HE SAID NO, YOU KNOW,
9 THEY'RE WITH THEIR FAMILY; THEY'LL TRY TO DO THEIR
10 BEST IN THIS CONDITION. I ASKED. I SAID, "IS THERE
11 ANYTHING ELSE I CAN DO AROUND HERE?" HE SAID, "NO."

12 I WAS THEN TIRED. I SAID, "OKAY. I'M GOING TO TRY TO
13 MAKE MY WAY HOME." AND I LEFT THE HOSPITAL.

14 MR. CHERNOFF: YOU SPENT TIME WITH
15 MRS. JACKSON, TOO?

16 DR. MURRAY: YES. MRS.?

17 MR. CHERNOFF: YEAH.

18 DR. MURRAY: OH, YEAH. YEAH.

19 MR. CHERNOFF: THE PRESS -- BECAUSE JESSE
20 JACKSON WHO SAID THAT YOU SHOULD HAVE SPENT TIME WITH
21 THE FAMILY, GIVING THEM COMFORT IN THE LAST HOURS OF
22 THEIR SON.

23 DR. MURRAY: YOU WOULDN'T BELIEVE HOW SAD IT
24 IS TO SIT THERE AND SEE THE NEWS REPORT THAT COMES
25 AROUND AND IT'S SO FAR FROM THE TRUTH.

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DETECTIVE SMITH: UH-HUH. WE REALIZE THAT.

DR. MURRAY: THEY SAID -- THEY SAID THAT I LEFT THE CAR; I RAN AWAY. I WAS IN THE TRUCK WITH MR. JACKSON, TRYING TO HELP HIM TO SURVIVE. I WAS DOING EVERYTHING I CAN. AND I COULDN'T TAKE MY CAR WITH ME IF I HAD TO HELP HIM.

DETECTIVE SMITH: ALL RIGHT. YOU SPOKE WITH THE DOCTOR -- OR CORRECTION -- DETECTIVE PORCHE?

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: HE HAD A LITTLE FEDORA ON.

DR. MURRAY: PORCHE?

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: HE HAD A FEDORA ON. HIM AND HIS PARTNER?

DR. MURRAY: HE IS THE GUY. THAT'S THE ONE WHO --

DETECTIVE SMITH: WHITE-HAIRED GUY?

DR. MURRAY: THAT'S THE ONE WHO SPOKE TO ME AT THE HOSPITAL.

DETECTIVE SMITH: RIGHT. OKAY. AND YOU PROVIDED HIM WITH YOUR CONTACT INFORMATION AND INITIAL STATEMENT.

DR. MURRAY: YES.

DETECTIVE SMITH: BASICALLY WHAT YOU TOLD US.

DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

1 DETECTIVE SMITH: OBVIOUSLY, NOT AS IN
2 DEPTH. WHEN HE TRIED TO GET A HOLD OF YOU SEVERAL
3 TIMES, IT JUST WOULD GO STRAIGHT TO --

4 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: VOICE-MAIL.

5 DETECTIVE SMITH: -- VOICE-MAIL.

6 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: BY THEN YOUR VOICE-MAIL
7 WAS FILLED. I EVEN TRIED TEXTING YOU A COUPLE TIMES.

8 DR. MURRAY: WELL, I --

9 MR. PENA: IS THIS FRIDAY MORNING? IS THAT
10 WHAT YOU'RE --

11 DETECTIVE SMITH: THIS WOULD BE THAT
12 EVENING.

13 DR. MURRAY: OH, THE SAME DAY?

14 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YEAH, SAME DAY.

15 DETECTIVE SMITH: THURSDAY EVENING.

16 MR. PENA: I'LL LET YOU KNOW THAT ALL
17 MORNING FRIDAY IS WHEN HE'S TALKING TO ME VERY EARLY
18 IN THE MORNING.

19 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

20 MR. PENA: SO IT WAS MY ADVICE TO SIMPLY
21 LEAVE YOUR PHONE OFF, TALK TO ME. I HAD A BUSY DAY.
22 I WAS RUNNING AROUND DOING THREE DIFFERENT THINGS,
23 LOOKING AT THIS STORY. AND SO I TOLD HIM TO WAIT FOR
24 ME, TO TALK TO YOU LATER.

25 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

1 DR. MURRAY: AND THEN I DIDN'T WANT TO BE
2 BOMBARDED BY A NUMBER OF PEOPLE TRYING TO REACH ME ON
3 MY CELL PHONE.

4 DETECTIVE SMITH: BEING MICHAEL'S
5 ON-AGAIN-OFF-AGAIN PHYSICIAN, ARE YOU AWARE OF ANY
6 PREEXISTING MEDICAL CONDITIONS THAT HE HAD? I MEAN
7 YOU TALKED ABOUT HIM BEING POSSIBLY ADDICTED TO THESE
8 AGENTS, BUT ANYTHING THAT YOU'RE AWARE OF, ANY
9 PROBLEMS THAT HE HAD?

10 DR. MURRAY: WELL, AS FAR AS PROBLEMS THAT I
11 TREATED HIM FOR, I TREATED HIM FOR PNEUMONIA.

12 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. WHEN WAS THAT?

13 DR. MURRAY: I THINK SOMETIME IN 2008.

14 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY.

15 DR. MURRAY: OR 2007. 2007, 2008. I CAN'T
16 SAY FOR SURE. I TREATED HIM FOR A FRACTURED TOE, A
17 PRESUMED FRACTURED TOE, WHEN HE GOT UPSET IN HIS
18 HOUSE, HE SAID, FOR SOME REASON AND HE KICKED HIS DOOR
19 AND HURT HIS FEET.

20 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: DO YOU REMEMBER WHAT
21 YEAR?

22 DR. MURRAY: THAT, I THINK, WAS 2008. AND
23 OTHER THAN THAT I TREATED HIM FOR LIKE UPPER
24 RESPIRATORY VIRAL SYNDROME, LETHARGY -- I MEAN
25 WEAKNESS AND A LITTLE BIT DEHYDRATED STATE, BECAUSE HE

1 DON'T EAT VERY WELL.

2 DETECTIVE SMITH: WAS IT KIND OF CHRONIC
3 WITH HIM?

4 DR. MURRAY: WHAT?

5 DETECTIVE SMITH: THE DEHYDRATION AND --

6 DR. MURRAY: HE DON'T DRINK.

7 DETECTIVE SMITH: -- FATIGUE.

8 DR. MURRAY: HE DON'T DRINK AND EAT. HE
9 SAYS ALL HIS LIFE HIS MOTHER'S HAD TO FORCE HIM TO EAT
10 AS A CHILD. SO HE JUST DON'T LIKE TO EAT FOODS. AND
11 THE FOODS THAT HE EATS, WHEN HE EATS, IS MOSTLY
12 CHICKEN AND RICE.

13 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: WHAT YEAR WAS IT WHEN
14 YOU TREATED HIM FOR THE UPPER RESPIRATORY VIRAL
15 SYNDROME?

16 DR. MURRAY: 2007, 2008. OH, YOU MEAN THE
17 UPPER RESPIRATORY? THAT WAS THE VERY FIRST THING I
18 TREATED HIM FOR. THAT WAS LIKE A VIRAL
19 (UNINTELLIGIBLE) THAT WAS INFECTED IN THE CHILDREN AND
20 HIMSELF; AND THEY WERE COUGHING AND RUNNY NOSE AND NOT
21 DRINKING ENOUGH AND NOT GETTING ENOUGH REST.

22 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: THAT'D BE ABOUT 2006?

23 DR. MURRAY: YEAH, THAT WAS THE FIRST TIME.
24 AND I PROBABLY TREATED HIM A COUPLE OF TIMES, MAYBE
25 TWO OR THREE TIMES FOR THAT CONDITION.

1 MR. CHERNOFF: AND THEN HE HAD SOMETHING
2 WRONG ON HIS FOOT.

3 DR. MURRAY: OH, YEAH.

4 MR. CHERNOFF: BUT THAT'S (UNINTELLIGIBLE).

5 DR. MURRAY: WELL --

6 DETECTIVE SMITH: I'M SORRY. GO AHEAD.

7 DR. MURRAY: AS I LOOKED AT HIS FEET OVER
8 THE YEARS, YOU KNOW, AS A DANCER, HE HAD CALLOUSES
9 THAT WERE SO DEEPLY ENGRAVED IN HIS FEET, AND IT WOULD
10 BE SO PAINFUL WHEN HE DANCED. I GOT A PODIATRIST TO
11 COME TO THE HOUSE. SO THEY -- WELL, THEY DID CARVE
12 OUT THE CALLOUS SO THAT HIS PAIN WENT AWAY. AT THE
13 SAME TIME, WHILE LOOKING AT HIS FEET, HE HAD VERY
14 SEVERE FUNGAL MYCOSIS, WHICH IS FUNGAL INFECTION THAT
15 TOOK OVER EVERY TOE AND GOING INTO HIS FLESH.

16 DETECTIVE SMITH: AND WHEN DID YOU NOTICE
17 THAT?

18 DR. MURRAY: ON MY EXAMINATION.

19 DETECTIVE SMITH: WHEN WAS THIS, THOUGH?
20 HOW LONG AGO?

21 DR. MURRAY: (UNINTELLIGIBLE) INITIALLY WHEN
22 I FIRST SAW HIM AND HE HAD HIS SOCKS OFF. WITHIN THE
23 FIRST DAY I SAW HIM, I SAW THAT AS A CONDITION. AND
24 WE TALKED ABOUT IT. WE GOT HIS CALLOUSES TO COME OFF.

25 DETECTIVE SMITH: BUT HOW LONG AGO? WHAT

1 YEAR? WHAT MONTH? WAS IT THIS YEAR? WITHIN THE LAST
2 FEW MONTHS?

3 DR. MURRAY: NO, WITHIN THE -- ABOUT I'D SAY
4 MAYBE A YEAR AND A HALF AGO.

5 MR. CHERNOFF: ONE OF THE THINGS -- THE
6 IMPORTANT THINGS ABOUT THIS, YOU MIGHT WANT TO TELL
7 THE M.E. IS BEFORE YOU TREATED IT, YOU TREATED IT WITH
8 LAMISIL. THAT'S -- YOU KNOW, THEY DO SELL IT IN
9 CREAM. BUT THE THING IS IF YOU TAKE IT ORALLY, IT'S
10 PRETTY TOUGH ON THE LIVER.

11 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: LAMISIL?

12 DR. MURRAY: LAMISIL.

13 MR. CHERNOFF: SO THEY DID A FULL -- HE DID
14 A FULL BLOOD WORKUP ON HIM TO MAKE SURE HIS LIVER AND
15 EVERYTHING WAS WITHIN RANGE.

16 DR. MURRAY: RIGHT.

17 MR. CHERNOFF: SO AT LEAST YOU HAVE THAT
18 AVAILABLE. IT WAS DONE ON A FAKE NAME BECAUSE HE
19 DIDN'T LIKE ANY OF THAT INFO GETTING OUT.

20 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: RIGHT.

21 MR. CHERNOFF: BUT -- BUT EVERYTHING WAS IN
22 RANGE; RIGHT?

23 DR. MURRAY: EVERYTHING WAS FINE.

24 MR. CHERNOFF: YEAH.

25 DR. MURRAY: AND THEN I GAVE HIM THE THREE

1 MONTHS OF THE LAMISIL AND, YOU KNOW, KEPT CHECKING
2 WITH HIM TO MAKE SURE THAT HE WAS COMPLYING. BUT HE
3 WAS VERY HAPPY. AT THE END OF THE TREATMENTS, HIS
4 INFECTION IN THE FOOT -- HIS SKIN WAS SOFT. THERE WAS
5 NO MORE EXFOLIATION, NO HARDNESS. THE NAILS HAD GROWN
6 OVER NEW. HE WAS AMAZED. HE WAS VERY HAPPY.

7 MR. CHERNOFF: IS THERE A -- I'M NOT ASKING
8 FOR ANY TRADE SECRETS, BUT IS THERE ANY PRELIMINARY
9 TOXICOLOGY AT ALL?

10 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: NO, NOT THAT THEY
11 SHARED WITH US.

12 MR. CHERNOFF: IN THE EVENT THERE'S SOME --
13 SINCE WE DON'T KNOW WHAT'S GOING TO SHOW UP EXCEPT WE
14 KNOW (UNINTELLIGIBLE) THESE THREE DRUGS ARE GOING TO
15 SHOW UP. WERE YOU AWARE OF ANY OTHER MEDICATIONS HE
16 WAS TAKING?

17 DR. MURRAY: I WAS NOT AWARE OF ANY OTHER
18 MEDICATIONS THAT HE WAS TAKING, BUT I HEARD THAT HE
19 WAS SEEING A DR. KLEIN THREE TIMES A WEEK IN BEVERLY
20 HILLS. AND HE NEVER DISCLOSED THAT TO ME.

21 MR. CHERNOFF: YOU HEARD FROM WHO?

22 DR. MURRAY: HIS STAFF, LIKE FRANK DILEO,
23 KENNY ORTEGA. THEY WOULD BE AWARE, WORKING ON HIS
24 PRODUCTION TEAM, THAT HE WAS SEEING HIM THREE TIMES A
25 WEEK. RIGHT ABOUT THREE WEEKS AGO, DESPERATELY AROUND

1 NOON, HE WAS CALLING FOR SOMEONE AT DR. KLEIN'S
2 OFFICE. SO HE CALLED BROTHER AMIR TO CALL DR. KLEIN'S
3 OFFICE. HE WANTED TO SPEAK TO A SPECIAL PERSON THERE.
4 I THINK THE NAME WAS JASON. HE WANTED JASON TO SEE IF
5 HE CAN SQUEEZE HIM IN, YOU KNOW, AROUND THE OTHER
6 PATIENTS.

7 MR. CHERNOFF: IS THAT WHAT MICHAEL TOLD
8 YOU?

9 DR. MURRAY: I'M THERE WHILE HE'S DOING
10 THIS.

11 MR. CHERNOFF: (UNINTELLIGIBLE.)

12 DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

13 MR. CHERNOFF: DID YOU ASK HIM WHAT HE --
14 WHAT HE NEEDED?

15 DR. MURRAY: THAT, HE WASN'T DISCLOSING. I
16 MEAN THAT'S HIS OWN PERSONAL PREFERENCE. YOU KNOW,
17 HE'S -- HE'S IN CHARGE OF HIS MEDICAL HISTORY. HE
18 NEVER DECLARED IT TO ME BEFORE, BUT I'D SEEN BOTTLES
19 OF PILLS AT HIS BEDSIDE THAT HAD DR. KLEIN'S NAME ON
20 IT. I ALSO SAW LIKE A DR. METZER NAME ON THAT. SO I
21 REALIZED THAT HE'S ALSO SEEING OTHER PHYSICIANS. BUT
22 HE DOES NOT DISCLOSE TO ME.

23 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: I'M GOING TO GIVE YOU
24 THE NAMES OF SOME -- I'M GOING TO BUTCHER THE NAMES OF
25 SOME MEDICINES, AND YOU CAN TELL ME IF IT'S SOMETHING

1 THAT YOU'VE TREATED HIM WITH.

2 DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

3 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: WE'VE ALREADY COVERED
4 THE PROPOFOL. PROPOFOL INJECTABLE EMULSION,
5 1 PERCENT, THAT'S --

6 DR. MURRAY: LIDOCAINE. THAT'S CALLED THE
7 ANTIBURN.

8 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: RIGHT. THE FLUMA --
9 THE FLUMAZENIL.

10 DR. MURRAY: FLUMAZENIL. THAT IS THE
11 ANTIDOTE THAT I GAVE HIM --

12 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: RIGHT.

13 DR. MURRAY: -- 0.2 TO TRY TO REVERSE THE
14 EFFECTS OF THE BENZODIAZEPINE.

15 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: ALL RIGHT. CLONAZEPAM,
16 IS THAT SOMETHING THAT YOU'VE HAD TO ISSUE TO --

17 DR. MURRAY: CLONAZEPAM, THAT'S -- WHAT'S
18 THE OTHER NAME FOR THAT? IS THAT RESTORIL? HOW MANY
19 MILLIGRAMS OF THAT?

20 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: IT IS -- YOU KNOW, I
21 DON'T KNOW.

22 DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

23 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: I JUST KNOW THAT --

24 DR. MURRAY: I MAY HAVE -- I MAY HAVE
25 PRESCRIBED CLONAZEPAM, WHICH IS RESTORIL, WHICH IS A

1 30 MILLIGRAM PILL THAT HE SHOULD USE AT NIGHT P.R.N.
2 IF HE -- AS NEEDED, SHOULD HE WISH TO SLEEP.

3 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. SO THAT WOULD BE
4 FOR SLEEP. OKAY. TRAZODONE.

5 DR. MURRAY: NO.

6 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: NO?

7 DR. MURRAY: I DID NOT PRESCRIBE THAT.

8 DETECTIVE SMITH: WHAT IS IT?

9 DR. MURRAY: TRAZODONE IS BASICALLY AN
10 ANTIDEPRESSANT THAT MAY ALSO CAUSE SOME SEDATION.

11 MR. CHERNOFF: CAUSE WHAT?

12 DR. MURRAY: ALSO MAY CAUSE SEDATION, HELP
13 YOU TO SLEEP. BUT IT ALSO TREATS DEPRESSION.

14 MR. CHERNOFF: IT'S NOT A M.O.I. OR WHATEVER
15 THE HELL THAT IS?

16 DR. MURRAY: NO, IT'S NOT AN --

17 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: M.O.I. INHIBITOR?

18 DR. MURRAY: NO, NOT AN M.O.I.

19 MR. CHERNOFF: IT'S A FIRST TYPE OF
20 (UNINTELLIGIBLE).

21 DR. MURRAY: IT'S CALLED AN S.S.R.I.

22 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: ALL RIGHT. I GOT A
23 COUPLE MORE. JUST LET ME TAKE SOME NOTES. DO YOU
24 HAVE QUESTIONS IN THE MEANTIME?

25 DETECTIVE SMITH: YEAH, BUT GO AHEAD. I

1 CAN --

2 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: SO CLONAZEPAM, YOU MAY

3 HAVE.

4 DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

5 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: TRAZODONE, NO.

6 DR. MURRAY: NO.

7 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: DIAZEPAM?

8 DR. MURRAY: YES. I RECENTLY PRESCRIBED

9 THAT FOR HIM, VERY FIRST TIME.

10 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

11 MR. CHERNOFF: VALIUM.

12 DR. MURRAY: VALIUM, WHICH IS VALIUM.

13 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: RIGHT.

14 DR. MURRAY: AND THAT AGAIN WAS ONE OF THE

15 EFFORTS TO TRY TO GET HIM OFF THE MILK.

16 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: LORAZEPAM?

17 DR. MURRAY: THAT'S I.V. THAT'S THE ORAL

18 FORM OF THE I.V. ATIVAN, THE SAME THING I'VE GIVEN

19 HIM.

20 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OH, OKAY.

21 DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

22 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: ORAL FORM.

23 DR. MURRAY: IF THE -- IF THE PILL DOES NOT

24 WORK, BECAUSE WHEN YOU TAKE A MEDICINE BY MOUTH, ABOUT

25 70 TO 80 PERCENT BECOMES AVAILABLE IN THE BLOODSTREAM

1 BECAUSE OF ABSORPTION.

2 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YOU SAY IT'S THE ORAL
3 FORM OF --

4 DR. MURRAY: OF THE LORAZEPAM. REMEMBER
5 THAT? ATIVAN, AND IT WAS GIVEN TO HIM.

6 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OH, YEAH, RIGHT.
7 ATIVAN.

8 DR. MURRAY: YEAH. SO THE FACT THAT HE --
9 IT WASN'T WORKING ORALLY, I WAS WONDERING WHETHER OR
10 NOT TO GIVE IT TO HIM I.V. HE'LL HAVE A BETTER
11 CONCENTRATION OF THAT, AND THAT HELP HIM TO SLEEP. SO
12 THAT'S WHY THAT CAME INTO PLAY.

13 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: HOW ABOUT FLOMAX?

14 DR. MURRAY: FLOMAX, I GAVE THAT TO HIM.

15 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

16 DETECTIVE SMITH: WHAT'S THAT USED FOR?

17 DR. MURRAY: HE WAS -- MR. JACKSON HAD
18 TROUBLE URINATING. HE WOULD DESCRIBE -- AND AGAIN,
19 YOU KNOW, HE NEVER DISCLOSED EVERYTHING TO ME. THIS
20 WAS THE REASON -- IN THE COURSE OVER THE LAST FEW
21 MONTHS, HE EXPLAINED TO ME THAT WHEN HE WENT TO THE
22 BATHROOM, IT WOULD TAKE HIM HOURS TO URINATE. YOU CAN
23 COME IN THERE. HE WOULD ACTUALLY WET HIMSELF DOWN.
24 PEOPLE WOULD LEAVE HIM THERE AND COME BACK, AND HE
25 STILL COULDN'T GO TO THE BATHROOM. AND I SAID,

1 "REALLY? YOU'VE HAD THAT?"

2 I DID CHECK HIS P.S.A. BEFORE, HIS
3 PROSTATE-SPECIFIC ANTIGEN (UNINTELLIGIBLE), AND IT WAS
4 WITHIN RANGE. SO I THOUGHT THAT HE HAD BENIGN
5 PROSTATIC HYPERTROPHY, BECAUSE IF IT'S ELEVATED, YOU
6 THINK OTHER THINGS. AND SO FLOMAX IS A VERY GOOD
7 MEDICATION THAT WILL SHRINK THE PROSTATE AND ALLOW HIM
8 TO HAVE A PROPER STREAM. SO THAT'S BASICALLY WHY HE
9 STARTED THAT.

10 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: ALL RIGHT. NOW,
11 NYSTATIN CREAM MIXED WITH SOME STEROID, IS THAT
12 SOMETHING THAT YOU GIVE HIM?

13 DR. MURRAY: NYSTATIN?

14 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: NYSTATIN WITH TRIA --

15 DR. MURRAY: MAYBE TRIAMCINOLONE.

16 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: THAT'S IT.

17 DR. MURRAY: I DID NOT -- YEAH, I DID NOT
18 GIVE HIM THAT.

19 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

20 DR. MURRAY: HE PROBABLY GOT THAT FROM
21 SOMEBODY ELSE.

22 DETECTIVE SMITH: WHAT'S THAT USED FOR?

23 DR. MURRAY: THAT IS SOMETIMES -- IT'S A --
24 THE NYSTATIN IS AN ANTIFUNGAL AGENT. THE
25 TRIAMCINOLONE IS A CORTICOSTEROID. AND I DON'T -- I

1 DON'T KNOW IF HE'S HAVING SOME KIND OF JOCK ITCH OR
2 SOMETHING ELSE --

3 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: LIKE ATHLETE'S FOOT?

4 DETECTIVE SMITH: YEAH, OR THE TOENAIL.

5 DR. MURRAY: ATHLETE'S FOOT? NOT
6 NECESSARILY, BECAUSE THAT'S CLEARED UP.

7 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

8 DR. MURRAY: HIS FEET IS NOW -- IT'S CLEARED
9 UP. AND HE DID NOT HAVE ANY RESIDUAL ATHLETE'S FOOT
10 OR ANYTHING LIKE THAT. SO HE'S USING IT FOR SOMETHING
11 ELSE THAT I DON'T KNOW. IT COULD BE A JOCK ITCH OR
12 SOMETHING LIKE THAT.

13 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: LATANOPROST?

14 DR. MURRAY: WHAT'S THAT?

15 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: LATANOPROST.

16 DR. MURRAY: HOW DO YOU SPELL THAT?

17 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: L-A-T-A-N-O-P-R-O-S-T.

18 IT'S AN EYE DROP SOLUTION, USUALLY USED FOR GLAUCOMA?

19 DR. MURRAY: IS IT ALSO CALLED OPCON,
20 OPCON-A?

21 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: I DON'T KNOW. WELL, IT
22 DIDN'T HAVE ANY BRAND NAME. IT JUST SAID LATANOPROST
23 ON IT.

24 DR. MURRAY: I DON'T KNOW. IS IT
25 OVER-THE-COUNTER?

1 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: NO. NO, IT'S
2 PRESCRIBED.

3 DR. MURRAY: IF IT'S A PRESCRIBED AGENT, I
4 DON'T KNOW FOR THAT.

5 DETECTIVE SMITH: ANY PROBLEMS WITH HIS EYES
6 THAT YOU'RE AWARE OF?

7 MR. CHERNOFF: IT'S XALATAN.

8 DR. MURRAY: WHAT'S IT?

9 MR. CHERNOFF: XALATAN.

10 DR. MURRAY: OH, SOMEBODY ELSE GAVE HIM
11 THAT.

12 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

13 DR. MURRAY: XALATAN; RIGHT?

14 MR. CHERNOFF: WHATEVER.

15 DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

16 MR. CHERNOFF: I'M JUST SHOWING THESE GUYS
17 (UNINTELLIGIBLE).

18 DR. MURRAY: THAT'S -- THAT'S INTERESTING,
19 TOO, BECAUSE HE NEVER HAD SEEN AN OPHTHALMOLOGIST. I
20 WAS TRYING TO TAKE --

21 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: IT CAME IN THREE VIALS.

22 DR. MURRAY: REALLY?

23 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YEAH, THREE GLASS VIALS
24 FILLED WITH LIQUID THAT YOU COULD USE A DROPPER OR YOU
25 COULD USE A SYRINGE. BUT IT IS A PRESCRIBABLE ONE,

1 BUT THERE WASN'T THE NAME OF THE DOCTORS WHO
2 PRESCRIBED IT. SO --

3 DR. MURRAY: SURPRISE, SURPRISE.

4 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY. HOW ABOUT --

5 DR. MURRAY: LET'S TALK ABOUT THAT FOR A
6 MINUTE.

7 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

8 DR. MURRAY: BECAUSE THAT'S AGAIN ANOTHER
9 SURPRISE FOR ME. THAT'S WHY I DON'T KNOW EXACTLY ALL
10 THAT HE HAS AVAILABLE TO HIM. MR. JACKSON, I
11 SCHEDULED AN APPOINTMENT WITH DR. DIVAN (PHONETIC),
12 SOMEBODY FROM U.C.L.A. KNOWN TO BE VERY GOOD AT RADIAL
13 KERATOTOMY SURGERY FOR THE EYES.

14 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: UH-HUH.

15 DR. MURRAY: RECENTLY, BECAUSE MR. JACKSON
16 BUYS THESE READERS OVER-THE-COUNTER. HE HAS A
17 MAGNIFICATION GLASS.

18 MR. CHERNOFF: THAT'S WHAT I GOT. THEY WORK
19 GREAT. IF YOU LOSE ONE, YOU JUST REPLACE IT.

20 DR. MURRAY: HE HAS -- HE HAS A
21 MAGNIFICATION GLASS. HIS EYESIGHT WAS VERY, VERY BAD.
22 SO I DID FIGURE OUT HE COULD BE LEGALLY BLIND. HIS
23 EYES WAS ALSO VERY RED. I ASK HIM ABOUT GLAUCOMA TO
24 SEE -- BECAUSE I'M TRYING TO TAKE CARE OF HIM IN
25 GENERAL. AND HE SAYS NO, HE DON'T HAVE ANY GLAUCOMA.

1 AND EVEN I SPOKE TO HIM AT THAT TIME. HE NEVER TOLD
2 ME HE WAS SEEING A DOCTOR THAT HAD GIVEN HIM ANY
3 SUBSTANCE LIKE THAT FOR THE EYES.

4 JUST LAST WEEK I GOT THIS DOCTOR FROM
5 U.C.L.A. TO SEE HIM. LAST SUNDAY, THEY WERE GOING TO
6 OPEN THEIR CLINIC TO DO A COMPLETE DILATION, LOOK IN
7 THE BACK OF HIS EYES, CHECK HIS FUNDUS AND SEE WHAT
8 WAS HAPPENING, AND SEE IF THEY WERE GOING TO GIVE HIM
9 ANY MONOCULAR VISION OR CONTACTS, BECAUSE I WAS
10 WORRIED THAT WHEN HE WAS IN ENGLAND, IF YOU'RE NOT
11 SEEING ON THE STAGE AND ALL THE BRIGHT LIGHTS, MAYBE
12 YOU CAN FALL AND HURT YOURSELF. SO I ENCOURAGED HIM
13 TO HAVE THE EYE EXAMINATION. THAT EXAMINATION WAS
14 HOPEFULLY SCHEDULED FOR LAST MONDAY.

15 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: SO HE HAD AGREED TO IT?

16 DR. MURRAY: HE AGREED TO DO IT. BUT IT
17 NEVER HAPPENED. I STILL HAVE E-MAIL FROM THE DOCTOR
18 ASKING ME TO CALL AND RESCHEDULE IT. AND ONE THING OR
19 THE OTHER, IT LED TO THAT BEING PUT OFF. BUT HIS
20 TEAM, HIS PRODUCTION TEAM, AGREED THAT, YOU KNOW, IT'S
21 SOMETHING THAT HE SHOULD HAVE DONE. SO I WAS TRYING
22 TO FIND OUT ISSUES WITH MR. JACKSON AND TRYING TO
23 ADDRESS THEM IN A GRADUAL WAY OVERALL TO HELP HIM.
24 AND THAT WAS ONE OF THE THINGS I DISCOVERED. SO THAT
25 MEDICATION IS A SURPRISE.

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DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: HOW ABOUT VALISONE?

DR. MURRAY: VALISONE?

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YEAH, IT'S A STEROID
CREAM.

DETECTIVE SMITH: ALMOST LIKE A VASELINE.

DR. MURRAY: OH, NO, I DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT
THAT.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

DR. MURRAY: NO.

DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: IT'S FOR LIKE SOME TYPE
OF INFLAMMATION OF SKIN?

DR. MURRAY: WELL, I AM TOLD THAT DR. KLEIN
IS A -- IS MAYBE A DERMATOLOGIST. I DON'T KNOW. BUT
HIS PRODUCTION TEAM HAD -- HAD SAID TO ME RECENTLY
THAT HIS WORST DAYS ON THE SET IS WHEN HE HAD GONE TO
DR. KLEIN'S OFFICE, WHICH IS ABOUT THREE TIMES A WEEK;
AND WHEN HE CAME BACK, HE WAS BASICALLY WASTED AND
REQUIRED AT LEAST 24 HOURS FOR RECOVERY. NOW --

MR. CHERNOFF: IS THAT ARNOLD KLEIN?

DR. MURRAY: I DON'T REMEMBER. K-L-E-I-N.

MR. CHERNOFF: BEVERLY HILLS?

DR. MURRAY: YEAH, BEVERLY HILLS. SO I
WASN'T CERTAIN, AGAIN, WHY HE NEVER SHARED WITH ME, IF
YOU WANT ME TO BE YOUR TEAM AND OVERLOOK THINGS FOR
YOU, WHY WOULDN'T HE HAVE SHARED WITH ME THE FACT THAT

1 HE WAS SEEING A DERMATOLOGIST OR ANOTHER DOCTOR FOR
2 ANY KIND OF TREATMENT. THAT, HE DID NOT SHARE. THE
3 ONLY TIME I GOT HOLD OF THE ACTIVITY TRYING TO GET
4 INTO THE CLINIC, THAT DAY WHEN HE SAID HE HAD TO GO,
5 IT WAS VERY IMPORTANT. HE WAS INSISTING ON THAT.
6 THAT'S WHEN HE CALLED AROUND NOON TO THAT PLACE, ASKED
7 FOR JASON AND TRIED TO SEE IF HE CAN BE SQUEEZED IN.

8 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: HOW ABOUT BENOQUIN?

9 DR. MURRAY: BENOQUIN, YES.

10 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: IS THAT SOMETHING THAT
11 YOU --

12 DR. MURRAY: YES.

13 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

14 MR. CHERNOFF: WHAT IS IT?

15 DR. MURRAY: BENOQUIN, 20 PERCENT.

16 MR. CHERNOFF: WHAT IS IT?

17 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: WHAT DOES IT DO?

18 DR. MURRAY: IT'S A -- IT'S A CREAM MADE FOR
19 BLEACHING OR PERMANENTLY REMOVING SPOTS THAT WILL
20 ACCUMULATE ON THE SKIN. LIKE, FOR EXAMPLE, IF ONE HAS
21 VITILIGO AND YOU HAVE BLEMISHES ON YOUR SKIN, LIKE
22 DARK AND WHITE SPOTS THAT YOU DEVELOP, YOU CAN USE
23 BENOQUIN. IT TAKES FOR ABOUT NINE MONTHS OF THERAPY.
24 IT'S A VERY SAFE AGENT. AND IT WILL -- IT CAN
25 PERMANENTLY REMOVE THE SPOT.

1 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: AND WE ALREADY COVERED
2 THE PRIOR INJECTION MARKS. THAT WAS SOMETHING THAT
3 YOU NOTICED YOURSELF IN YOUR EXAMINATION AND CAUSE FOR
4 HIS VEINS TO HARDEN AND MAKE THEM MORE DIFFICULT TO
5 FIND.

6 DR. MURRAY: PHLEBITIS.

7 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YEAH.

8 DR. MURRAY: THAT'S A -- THAT'S ANOTHER
9 REASON WHY I THOUGHT HIS CAUSE OF DEATH COULD HAVE
10 BEEN A PULMONARY EMBOLISM OR A BLOOD CLOT MIGRATED TO
11 HIS LUNGS.

12 MR. CHERNOFF: IT PRODUCES IRREVERSIBLE
13 DEPIGMENTATION, BENOQUIN.

14 DR. MURRAY: THAT'S WHAT I SAID, PERMANENT.

15 MR. CHERNOFF: YEAH, COULDN'T TELL.

16 DR. MURRAY: NOW, HE ALSO HAD SOMETHING
17 CALLED HYDROQUIN, HYDROQUINONE, WHICH IS 8 PERCENT
18 CREAM, WHICH IS USED FOR TEMPORARY REMOVAL OF -- OF
19 SPOTS. IT WORKS MORE QUICKLY, BUT IT'S NOT PERMANENT.
20 SO YOU KNOW, HE WOULD USE BOTH IN CASE THERE WAS A
21 BLEMISH. HE WOULD FOLLOW THE 8 PERCENT WITH THE
22 20 PERCENT. AND WHEN THE -- THE SPOT WENT AWAY, HE
23 WOULD THEN TRY TO CONTINUE USING THE OTHER ONE SO IT
24 DOESN'T (UNINTELLIGIBLE).

25 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: WE FOUND A SMALL

1 PORTION OF MARIJUANA IN HIS ROOM. DID YOU KNOW HIM TO
2 BE A SMOKER?

3 DR. MURRAY: NO. MARIJUANA?

4 MR. CHERNOFF: WHICH ROOM? THE ONE THAT YOU
5 DON'T GO INTO OR --

6 DETECTIVE SMITH: YEAH, THE ONE YOU'D STAY
7 OUT OF, YOU DON'T GO INTO.

8 DR. MURRAY: NO.

9 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: OKAY.

10 DR. MURRAY: HE DENIED SO CLEARLY. I
11 FELT -- YOU KNOW, NOW THAT I'M FINDING OUT ALL OF
12 THESE THINGS AND IT'S PIECE BY PIECE, I -- I GAVE
13 MR. JACKSON LOVE. I WAS HIS FRIEND. I CARED ABOUT
14 HIM. I TRIED TO HELP HIM. THAT'S ALL I WAS TRYING TO
15 DO. AND I FEEL THAT NOW TO KNOW THAT, YOU KNOW, HE
16 WOULD BE USING THINGS LIKE THAT --

17 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: WELL, THE MARIJUANA WE
18 FOUND WAS OLD. IT HAD ALREADY ROTTED AWAY.

19 DR. MURRAY: OH, IT ROTTED AWAY.

20 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YEAH.

21 DETECTIVE SMITH: IT WAS IN A SUITCASE, IN A
22 CLOSET, BURIED. FAMILY MEMBERS CAME ACROSS IT WHEN
23 THEY WERE CLEANING.

24 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: YEAH, IT WASN'T LIKE A
25 FRESH JOINT OR ANYTHING. IT WAS SOMETHING THAT HAD

1 ROTTED.

2 DETECTIVE SMITH: SO WHO KNOWS. I DOUBT
3 THAT HE WOULD EVEN PACK HIS OWN SUITCASE WHEN HE WENT
4 AWAY.

5 WHAT ABOUT CIGARETTES?

6 DR. MURRAY: NO, HE PACKED HIS SUITCASE.

7 DETECTIVE SMITH: DID HE?

8 DR. MURRAY: YEAH, I KNOW THAT FOR A FACT.
9 HE PACKED -- HE PACKS CERTAIN SUITCASE.

10 DETECTIVE SMITH: CLOTHES OR OTHER THINGS?

11 DR. MURRAY: HE WOULD PACK CERTAIN SUITCASES
12 THAT HE WOULD (UNINTELLIGIBLE) BECAUSE HE WAS -- HE
13 WOULD BE FAMILIAR WITH WHERE CERTAIN THINGS WOULD BE
14 AND HE WOULD WANT TO KNOW THAT AND KEEP THAT
15 EXCLUSIVELY TO HIMSELF.

16 DETECTIVE SMITH: WHAT ABOUT CIGARETTES?

17 DR. MURRAY: I DON'T KNOW HIM TO SMOKE. YOU
18 FOUND CIGARETTES?

19 DETECTIVE SMITH: EMPTY PACKS.

20 DR. MURRAY: REALLY?

21 DETECTIVE SMITH: IN THE SAME SUITCASE THAT
22 THIS LITERALLY WAS RAUNCHY OLD -- YOU COULDN'T EVEN
23 TELL IT WAS MARIJUANA. IN FACT, WE THOUGHT IT WAS
24 INITIALLY TAR HEROIN. WE HAD IT ANALYZED, AND IT WAS
25 JUST DECOMPOSED BASICALLY MARIJUANA. THE T.H.C. WAS

1 PRESENT. NONETHELESS, THERE WAS TWO EMPTY PACKS OF
2 CIGARETTES IN THERE. I KNOW HIS FAMILY'S DEFINITELY
3 AGAINST THAT.

4 DR. MURRAY: WOW.

5 DETECTIVE SMITH: BUT AGAIN, WHO KNOWS.

6 DR. MURRAY: WELL, BUT AT THE SAME TIME, YOU
7 KNOW, NO ONE WENT INTO THAT ROOM. HE WOULDN'T LET
8 ANYONE IN. BUT HE USED EXCESSIVE COLOGNE. AND I
9 NEVER UNDERSTOOD HOW HE SPRAYED THAT MUCH ON ALL THE
10 TIME. I MEAN HE SAT AND HE JUST KEEP SPRAYING. AND
11 IT COULD HAVE BEEN TO DISMISS ANY ODOR. I DON'T KNOW.

12 DETECTIVE SMITH: MENTIONING SOME DOCTORS,
13 WE TALKED ABOUT A DR. LEE.

14 DR. MURRAY: YES.

15 DETECTIVE SMITH: AND SHE -- WAS SHE IN
16 VEGAS?

17 DR. MURRAY: NO, SHE'S HERE IN CALIFORNIA.

18 DETECTIVE SMITH: WHERE AT? DO WE KNOW?

19 DR. MURRAY: IT HAS TO BE LOS ANGELES,
20 BECAUSE THIS IS WHERE APPARENTLY SHE WAS COMING IN AND
21 GIVING HIM INFUSIONS, DIFFERENT -- DIFFERENT TIMES
22 DURING THE WEEK. THAT'S WHAT HE TOLD ME.

23 DETECTIVE SMITH: AND THEN THERE WAS ALSO A
24 -- THE DR. DAVID ADAMS IN LAS VEGAS.

25 DR. MURRAY: HE'S IN LAS VEGAS, UH-HUH.

1 DETECTIVE SMITH: WE TALKED ABOUT A
2 DR. KLEIN, POSSIBLY AN ARNOLD KLEIN?

3 DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

4 DETECTIVE SMITH: IN BEVERLY HILLS?

5 DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

6 DETECTIVE SMITH: AND THEN A DR. METZER.

7 DR. MURRAY: IN BEVERLY HILLS, TOO. THAT'S
8 WHAT I --

9 DETECTIVE SMITH: BEVERLY HILLS?

10 DR. MURRAY: THEIR PRESCRIPTION BOTTLE SAYS
11 BEVERLY HILLS. I THINK IF YOU HAVE THE MEDICATION,
12 YOU CAN LOOK AT THE MEDICATION BOTTLES AND YOU'LL FIND
13 OUT.

14 MR. CHERNOFF: HOW DO YOU SPELL METZER?

15 DR. MURRAY: I THINK IT'S M-E-Z --

16 DETECTIVE SMITH: M-E-T-Z-E-R?

17 DR. MURRAY: SOMETHING SO. I THINK THAT'S
18 WHAT I SAW ON THE BOTTLE.

19 MR. CHERNOFF: METZER?

20 DETECTIVE SMITH: YES.

21 MR. CHERNOFF: YEAH, IT'S METZGER WITH A
22 "G."

23 DETECTIVE SMITH: M-E-T-G-E-R?

24 MR. CHERNOFF: YEAH.

25 DR. MURRAY: IS THAT CORRECT? I WOULDN'T

1 KNOW. I SAW IT ON THE BOTTLES OF MEDICINES AT THE
2 BEDSIDE. SO IF YOU LOOK AT THE BOTTLES, YOU'LL SEE
3 THE DOCTOR'S NAME ON IT.

4 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: LIKE M-E-T-Z-G-E-R?

5 DR. MURRAY: Z-E-R, YEAH.

6 (UNINTELLIGIBLE.)

7 DR. MURRAY: YOU'LL SEE THE PRESCRIPTION
8 BOTTLES.

9 DETECTIVE SMITH: THESE -- THE EVENING THAT
10 THIS WAS GOING ON AT MR. JACKSON'S HOUSE, HIS FINAL
11 NIGHT, THESE DIFFERENT SYRINGES OR ONE SYRINGE WAS
12 USED WHEN YOU INJECTED IT INTO HIS I.V. DRIP DOWN
13 BELOW?

14 DR. MURRAY: YEAH ONE SYRINGE FOR THAT,
15 YEAH.

16 DETECTIVE SMITH: I'M SORRY.

17 DR. MURRAY: YES.

18 DETECTIVE SMITH: ONE SYRINGE WAS USED FOR
19 THE VARIOUS MEDICATIONS YOU GAVE HIM, OR --

20 DR. MURRAY: NO, I HAD --

21 DETECTIVE SMITH: -- EACH TIME WAS IT A --

22 DR. MURRAY: NO, I HAD TWO SYRINGES, AND
23 THEY WERE -- I WOULD RECAP THEM, IF I NEEDED IT. AND
24 YOU KNOW, I WOULD USE THE MEDICATION, AND THEN I WOULD
25 DRAW SOME SALINE TO HAVE THEM MIX. RIGHT AWAY THEN I

1 WOULD USE IT.

2 DETECTIVE SMITH: WHAT DID YOU DO WITH THOSE
3 SYRINGES WHEN YOU WERE DONE WITH THEM?

4 DR. MURRAY: WELL, I USUALLY HAVE MY BAGS
5 RIGHT THERE. EVERYTHING I USE, I WOULD PUT IT QUICKLY
6 INTO THE BAGS AND, YOU KNOW, JUST PUT IT INTO THE
7 CUPBOARD, BECAUSE HE WANTED ME TO NOT HAVE ANYTHING
8 HANGING AROUND.

9 DETECTIVE SMITH: WHERE'S YOUR BAG WHERE
10 THOSE SYRINGES WOULD BE AT NOW?

11 MR. CHERNOFF: OH, REALLY?

12 DR. MURRAY: I DON'T HAVE THEM.

13 MR. CHERNOFF: I THOUGHT YOU LEFT IT THERE.

14 DR. MURRAY: YEAH, I DID.

15 DETECTIVE SMITH: WHERE? WHERE DID YOU
16 LEAVE IT?

17 DR. MURRAY: IN THAT SAME BEDROOM, IN THE
18 CLOSET, WHERE IT ALWAYS STAYS.

19 DETECTIVE SMITH: OKAY. WHICH CLOSET? IT'S
20 A MESS.

21 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: IT'S 45 CUPBOARDS.

22 DR. MURRAY: YEAH, IF YOU WALK INTO THE
23 DRESSING ROOM AND YOU TURN RIGHT, THE HIGH LEVEL TOP,
24 THE BAGS ARE RIGHT THERE WITH THE ITEMS IN IT AND THE
25 MEDICATION.

1 DETECTIVE MARTINEZ: IS THAT THE CLOSET THAT
2 HAS THE GLASS CABINETS WITH HIS JACKETS?

3 DR. MURRAY: YES. BUT THIS WILL BE TOO
4 SHORT STUBS HIGHER UP THERE. HE SHOWED ME THAT
5 CABINET. HE WANTED ME TO KEEP THE THINGS THERE WITH
6 MY BAGS AND SO.

7 DETECTIVE SMITH: AND THAT'S WHERE YOU LEFT
8 YOUR BAGS THAT NIGHT?

9 DR. MURRAY: YEAH.

10 DETECTIVE SMITH: BLACK ATTACHE BAGS?

11 DR. MURRAY: THREE BAGS. THERE WERE THREE.
12 ONE IS A LITTLE COSTCO BLUE BAG. ONE IS A BLACK SMALL
13 BAG. THE OTHER ONE IS A LITTLE BLUE BAG THAT HAS A
14 ZIPPER AT THE TOP OF IT.

15 MR. PENA: AND YOU LEFT IT THERE BECAUSE YOU
