**LEVI G. McCATHERN, II TO REPRESENT CHRIS BROWN
IN SUIT ARISING FROM DICKIES ARENA INCIDENT**

McCathern PLLC and Levi G. McCathern, II have been retained as legal counsel for Chris Brown in a civil lawsuit filed on Monday, July 22, 2024, in Harris County District Court. The lawsuit pertains to an alleged altercation that occurred following Brown's performance during his "11:11" tour on Saturday, July 20, 2024, at Dickies Arena in Fort Worth.

In a statement, Brown's attorney Levi G. McCathern, II raised the question: "Why were these individuals even backstage anywhere near Chris' dressing room? Their sole purpose was to provoke him and his team, and to build a record for a lawsuit.

Most of us are not pop stars, so the only place we have to dress is our home; our personal space. Imagine what reaction **YOU** would have if someone invaded **YOUR** personal space with the singular goal of provoking difficulties? Even in this challenging circumstance, Chris never initiated physical contact with anyone."

The conflict began when plaintiff Charles Bush, a Dallas personal injury attorney, along with his entourage of uninvited guests, approached Chris Brown and began provoking a reaction. McCathern added, "These individuals had a clear agenda when they approached Chris. They were seeking trouble and are directly responsible for the situation that ensued."

Bush subsequently engaged Houston attorney Tony Buzbee, who filed the 50-page lawsuit on behalf of Bush and his group virtually the next day. McCathern concluded, "Chris was unjustly targeted in this incident. These individuals saw him as an opportunity for financial gain and should never have been permitted backstage in the first place. The whole episode was clearly a set up."
