Re: Request for investigation of medical professionals

Dear Mr. Attorney General:

Thank you for taking the time to read this letter. I represent Michael Lohan, father of actress Lindsay Lohan. Michael believes that his daughter is addicted to prescription drugs, and is deeply concerned for her safety and welfare. He believes that unscrupulous doctors overprescribe medications to her, and negligently and fraudulently provide drugs to her, all in violation of California law. We write to respectfully request an investigation of those medical professionals.

While Lindsay's apparent struggles with drugs and alcohol have been depicted in the entertainment media, the issue of her alleged prescription drug addiction, which Michael believes is the core problem, has received less coverage. The problem is that even in jail, even in rehab, even with random drug testing during probation, she can get and use any prescription drugs she wants, so long as a doctor prescribes them. According to court records, for example, she takes Dilaudid, a potent derivative of morphine, supposedly for "dental pain," as well as amphetamines and opiates. There have been reports that she is able to call up doctors, and obtain whatever she wants, in whatever quantities she wants, whenever she wants. She can ingest these substances in jail, in rehab, and on probation while subject to random drugs tests, as prescription drugs are allowed. It's a giant legal loophole that could cost her her life.

Michael Lohan and I applaud your commitment to investigating and prosecuting medical professionals who negligently or fraudulently prescribe drugs to known addicts, such as in the Anna Nicole Smith trial currently underway here in Los Angeles. As you know, prescription drug abuse is the second most prevalent drug problem in America today, after marijuana. We appreciate that your office takes this problem seriously.

Michael asked me to get involved because the world has watched as his daughter seemed to deteriorate before our eyes, and he was desperate to take action to save and protect her. If, God forbid, Lindsay overdosed, we would expect an investigation of her doctors then. But Michael does not want to wait for Lindsay to die. He wants her to live. He wants an investigation of her doctors now, while she still has a chance at life.

As a result, we respectfully request a meeting, as soon as possible, in which we can present you or the appropriate Department of Justice representative with the information we have, including Lindsay's probation and drug test reports, which evidence the prescription drugs in her system.

Thank you for considering this request, and for your decades of service to the people of California.
